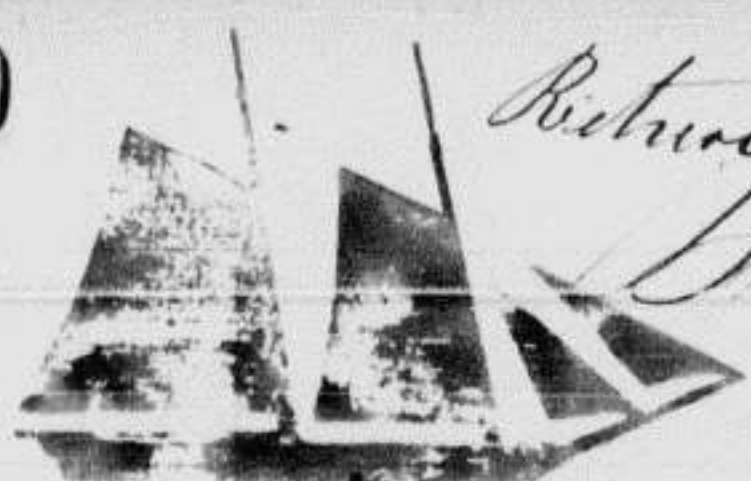
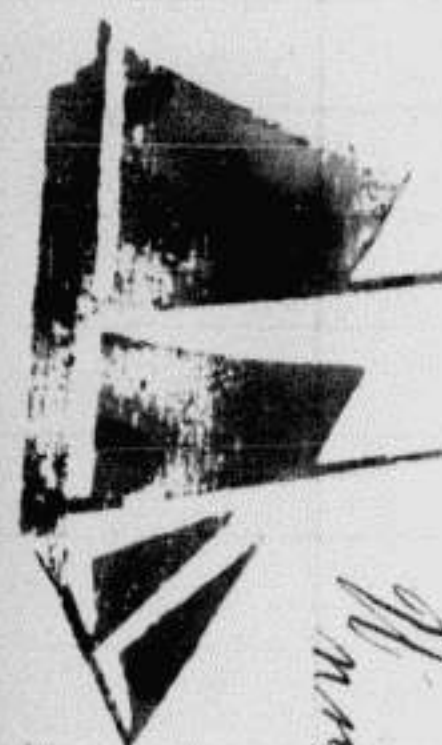

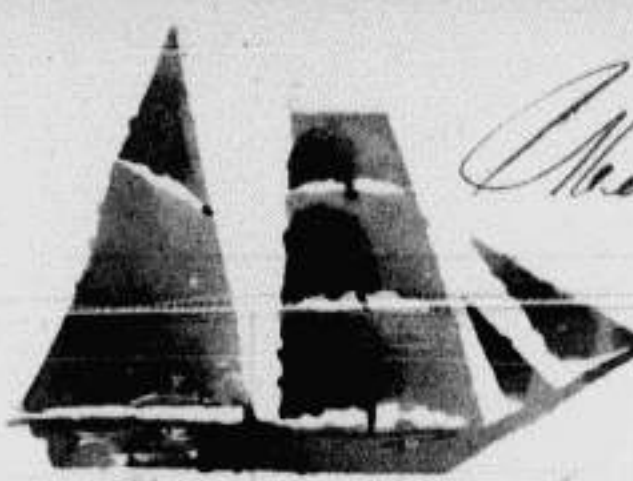
Remarks on board Saturday August the 4th 1860



Comment with light breeze from the westward and good with made sail and stood on to the northward and outward the watch employed working in the sailing ballam 8th 46th M. Longitude 52.25th W. this afternoon had fine breeze saw a Schooner to the windward saw blackfish going quick to windward at sundown took in sail heading north by east by the wind at eleven o'clock were round to the southward and outward had light breeze thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Sunday August the 5th 1860

Comment with light breeze from the westward and good with made sail and looked to the northward ballam 8th 30th M. Longitude 53.02th W. had light breeze thru the day at sundown took in the mainsail heading north north east with light air from north west at twelve o'clock breeze up fresh from the westward and squally with heading north west by north by the wind latter part of these days by four hours strong breeze and haze with So ends

Remarks on board Monday August the 6th 1860

Comment with strong breeze from the westward and good and squally with took in the mainsail stay in sail saw a Brig steering to the eastward before the wind the watch employed making out for home and water 10th ballam 53.43th M. Longitude 53.42th W. at two o'clock reefed the foresail and took in the jib steering on shagor saw a sail steering to the southward and outward heading north west by north thru the day had strong breeze and squally with thru the night So ends

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 7th 1860

Comment with strong breeze from west south west and thick and foggy with at eight o'clock had a heavy equal squall up everything after the squall but once had it more moderate made sail again and set the jib the watch employed making out for water ballam 8th 50th M. Longitude 54.52th W. at two o'clock turned the vessel out of the strait and set the foresail with took a better heading north west all this day by the wind at seven o'clock set half watch and started for home had it squally the fore part of the night latter part had it more moderate set the foresail and set the mainsail heading west by north So ends
