 Remarks on board Wednesday August the 8th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the southward and fair weather turned at the starboard boat and hauled it saw a Brig steering to the eastward middle of the day had it squally and rainy took in the topgallant and topmast staysail latitude $35^{\circ} 10' N$ longitude $67^{\circ} 16' W$ this afternoon hove out and held some cork with water to him the Brig saw a ship steering to the eastward at five o'clock lighted up a little weather looked better spread west than the day had strong breezes thru the night kept the foretopmast and took in the middle staysail stand out

 Remarks on board Thursday August the 9th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from the southward and squally and rainy weather took in the mainsail and set the topsail at twelve o'clock lighted up some latitude $34^{\circ} 43' N$ longitude $66^{\circ} 10' W$ this afternoon had it more moderate turned the reef out of the topsail and set the middle staysail the watch employed rattling down the fore rigging at five o'clock had a squall and the wind backed round to south east and died away to a light breeze steering west by north at eight o'clock breeze up fresh from southward had fresh breezes thru the night steered west by north thru the night. So ends these twenty four hours

 Remarks on board Friday August the 10th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from south east and fair weather set the fore topgallant the watch employed washing off the vessel inside saw a Brig steering to the eastward latitude $34^{\circ} 40' N$ longitude $62^{\circ} 36' W$ this afternoon had clear the main rigging saw Brig steering to the northward and weather saw no other sail of the line breeze had fresh breezes thru the day steering west by north at three o'clock four hours So ends

 Remarks on board Saturday August the 11th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from south south west and fair weather turned at the larboard boat and painted it the watch employed rattling down the fore rigging latitude $35^{\circ} 14' N$ longitude $66^{\circ} 03' W$ had strong breezes thru the day steering west by north had fresh breezes thru the night saw two ships steering to the eastward So ends

 Remarks on board Sunday August the 12th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the southward and good weather set the mainsail latitude $35^{\circ} 42' N$ longitude $62^{\circ} 09' W$ at four P.M. sent down the fore topsail and sent up a new one ahead west by north thru the day had fresh breezes thru the night steered west north west with all sail out So ends these twenty four hours
