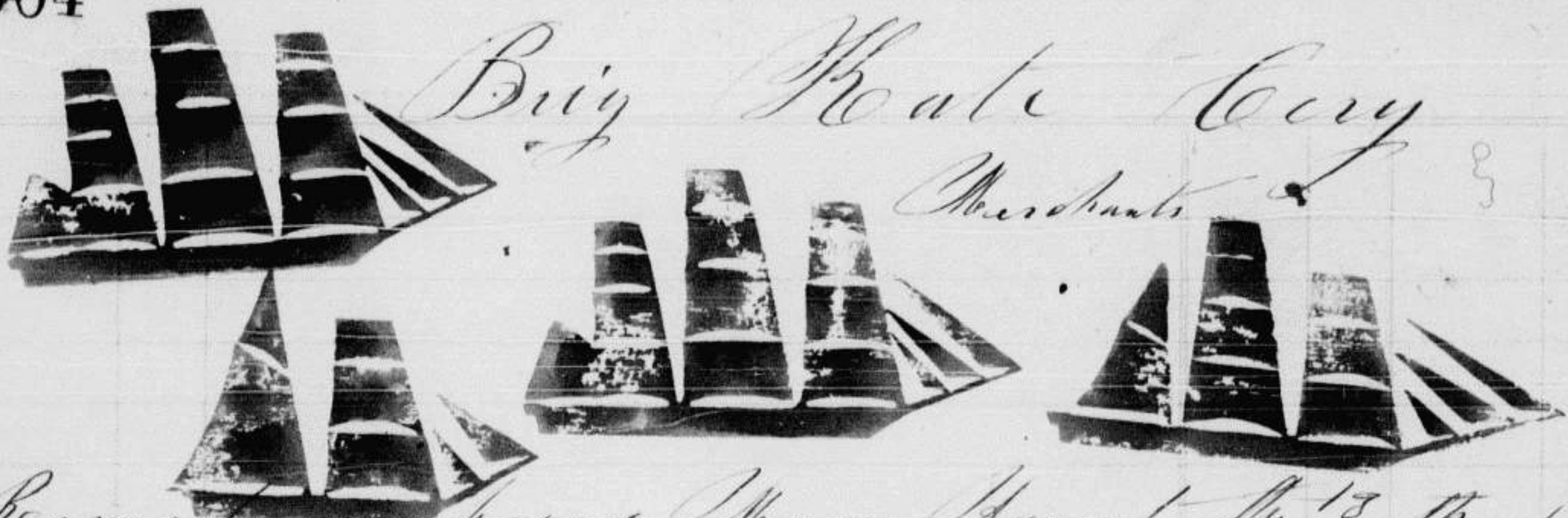


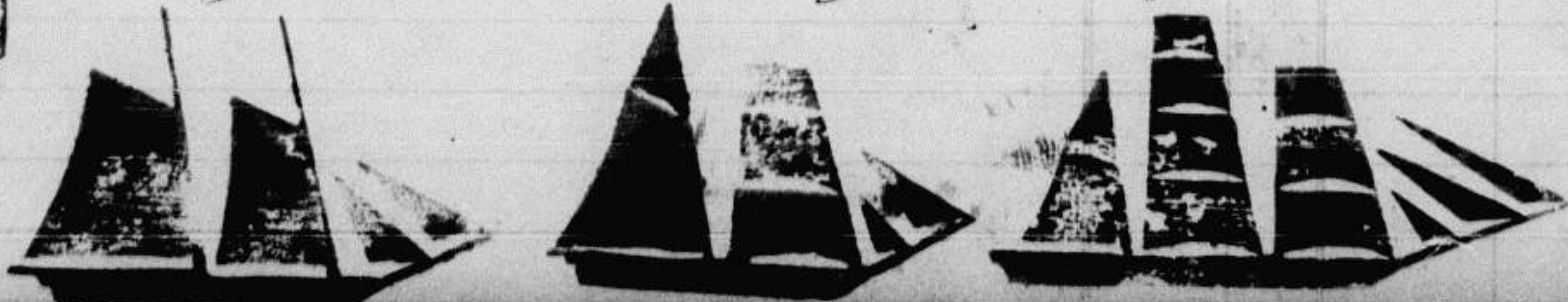


Remarks on board Monday August the 13th 1860

Commenced with fresh breezes from the southward and good weather but not for water at seven o'clock took in the mainmast and left off north west the watch employed painting the brig some eleven sails steering different the courses latter 26a 26 M long 26a 26 M at one o'clock left off north north west took in the mainmast and hauled down the staysails saw forebushes had fresh breezes this afternoon latter part of the night had light breezes steering north north west S ends

Remarks on board Tuesday August the 14th 1860

Commenced with light breezes from the southward and good weather the watch employed having down the fore and aft stays saw a schooner steering to the southward and eastward under all sail latter 29a 04 M long 29a 11 M at one o'clock left off north three light breezes through the day at ten o'clock the wind backed round to north north east and blew strong took in the light sail and reef the topsail set the staysail had it reefed from the night heading north west by the wind S ends



Remarks on board Wednesday August the 15th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from north north east and clear and good weather saw a number of sails steering to the westward latter 23a 26 M long 23a 14 M had strong breezes through the day heading north west by north by the wind under short sail at sundown had it more moderate saw sails passing off the line were seen standing to the northward by the wind at eight o'clock took ship to the southward and eastward had strong breezes through the night S ends

Remarks on board Thursday August the 16th 1860

Commenced with strong breezes from north east and clear weather at the job and took ship to the southward the watch employed in securing ships sails saw a number of sails steering different courses at eleven o'clock raised Land Canada it took ship and stood to the southward and eastward latter 29a 11 M long 29a 11 M at three o'clock set the mainmast and triced the reef out of the topsail set the staysails had it more moderate at four o'clock set all sail took ship and sailed during the night latter part light breezes S ends
