Remarks on board Sunday May the 5th 1861

Commenced with a light breeze from the westward and good weather the watch employed in ordinary ships duty at sea. The boat the boat a few minutes for breakfast had it eaten at eleven P.M. got a breeze from the eastward heading south south east at day light set all sail and started ship heading north east by the wind so we left to day latter part fine breeze S ends latitude  $36^{\circ} 03'$  longitude  $89^{\circ} 04'$  W

Remarks on board Monday May the 6th 1861



Commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and good weather got up a breeze to abate from all spiritous liquors unless for sickness and very clean belonging to the Brig State Cory signed to had fine breezes then the night at daylight took in the foresail and saw a sail to the northward of us standing to the eastward latter part fresh breezes heading east by the wind S ends latitude  $37^{\circ} 30'$  longitude  $88^{\circ} 14'$  W

Remarks on board Tuesday May the 7th 1861



Commenced with fresh breezes from the westward and fair weather the watch employed in ordinary ships duty saw fishbacks had moderate breezes then the night at daylight left at east by south had the wind from the westward latter part fresh breezes plenty of fishbacks in sight S ends latitude  $38^{\circ} 30'$  longitude  $86^{\circ} 02'$  W

The boat the boat a few minutes for breakfast had it eaten at eleven P.M. got a breeze from the eastward heading south south east at day light set all sail and started ship heading north east by the wind so we left to day latter part fine breeze S ends latitude  $36^{\circ} 03'$  longitude  $89^{\circ} 04'$  W

Remarks on board Thursday May the 9th 1861

Commenced with a gail from the northward and aged and rainy weather took in the foresail and were bound to the westward stood no mast heads this day. Had a strong gail then the night at daylight had it more moderate at ten P.M. were bound to the eastward and set the foresail and started ship later had strong breezes steering east by south S ends latitude  $38^{\circ} 30'$  longitude  $83^{\circ} 42'$  W

Remarks on board Friday May the 10th 1861

Commenced with strong breezes from the northward and aged weather set the foresail at sundown had it quite moderate had it squally most of the night at daylight commenced backing out saw two sails steering to the westward at half past eleven got them backing and steering east S ends latitude  $38^{\circ} 45'$  longitude  $81^{\circ} 45'$  W
