

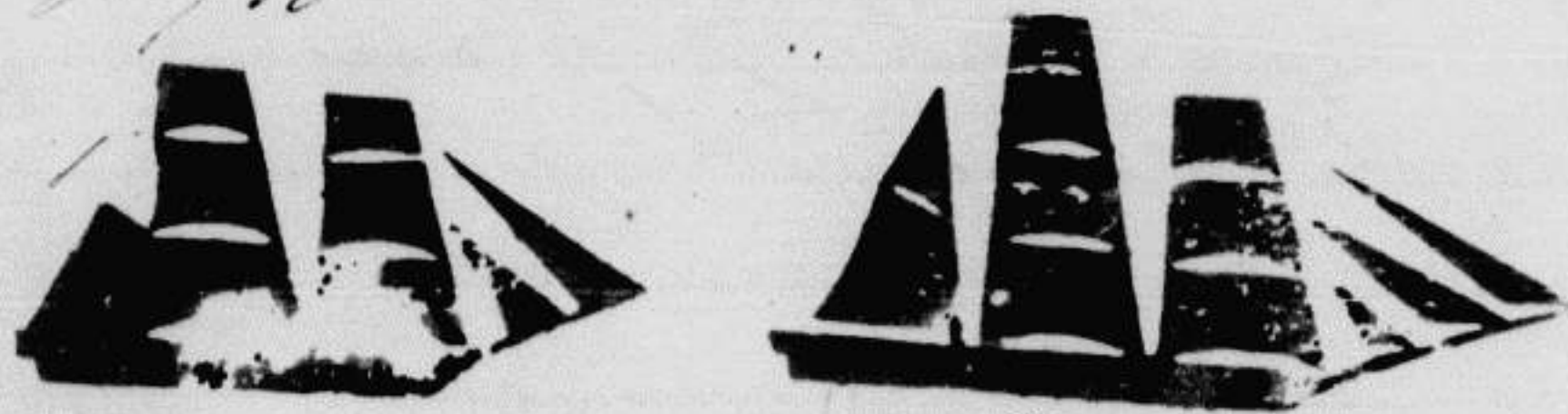
Brig Kate Cory off Seersia

Remarks on board Wednesday May the 16th 1861

Commenced with strong breeze from the southward and rugged weather and thick and rainy at three P.M. took in the topmast and foresail made in strong and rather thick fog at sundown still raining heavily south east latter part of the night & cleared off and moderated at daylight made sail and stood in shore saw a number of porpoises latter part light breeze So ends Cruising off Seersia

Remarks on board Friday May the 18th 1861

Commenced with light breeze from the westward and good weather raised Blackfish and heard the boats for them the vessel Boat struck one but drove again saw two sails at sundown took in sail had light air then the night at daylight made sail broke out for water and pork took in the Mast boat and commenced repairing her saw three sails to the westward of us latter part had it calm So ends Cruising off Seersia



Remarks on board Saturday May the 19th 1861

Commenced with good weather but calm the watch employed repairing the boat at four o'clock P.M. got three and but her on the cranes again at sundown took in sail saw the sails

Had light air then the night at daylight made sail and stood in shore saw two Whaler and then Merchant man latter part fresh breeze tacked ship So ends Cruising off Seersia



Remarks on board Sunday May the 20th 1861

Commenced with fresh breeze from south west and fair weather saw Blackfish and porpoises at sundown took in sail had light air then the remainder of the twenty four hours to sails in sight So ends Cruising off Seersia

Remarks on board Monday May the 21st 1861

Commenced with good weather but calm saw porpoises at sundown saw spears some four miles off could not make out what they was had it calm the four part of the night latter part light breeze from the eastward at daylight made sail and stood on to the southward sent down the foretopmast and repaired it and sent it aloft again saw one sail latter part light breeze So ends Cruising off Seersia
