Remarks on board Sunday Lane the 17th 1861

Commenced with strong breeze from south west and veered with the watch employed in ordinary ship's duties at one P.M. took in the Mainmast saw a Water starting to the eastward and a number of merchant vessels at five P.M. took in the jib steering strong at sundown took in the Foremast and foretopmast going to heaving north west by east latter part of the night -

Remarks on board Saturday Lane the 18th 1861

Commenced with strong breeze from the eastward and veered and sunny weather at one P.M. made the mast heads with light of some sun-hummocks at sea P.M. a English schooner spoke as from Barbados bound to Bristol at sundown left to the wind heaving south east and it drizily threw the brigst - at day light - closed off main sail and stood to the southward saw hummocks and pinbacks latter part had it calm so was latter part of the night 8 1/2 58 W.

Remarks on board Sunday Lane the 19th 1861

Commenced with good weather but calm saw breeches some twelve miles off but could not make out what they was the watch employed in ordinary ship's duties saw a sail to the northward of us at sundown took in sail continued calm at ten o'clock got a fresh breeze from west south west heaving to the northward and westward at night - which P.M. backed took to the eastward saw 10 sails steering to the eastward latter part strong breeze so was latter part of the night 8 1/2 4 W.
