Remarks on board Thursday June the 20th 1861

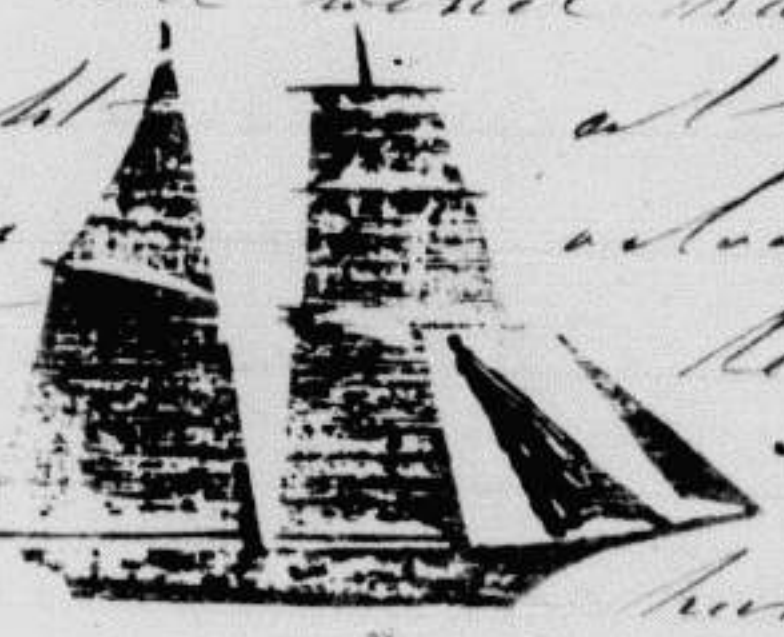


Remarks on board Friday June the 21st 1861.

Commenced with fresh breezes from north west and good weather the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty saw three Barges and plenty of fishbacks took a ship to the southward and westward at sundown took in sail heading west south west had light breeze then the night at daylight made sail and stood on to the westward saw three pilers and three shearing to the eastward latter part fresh breeze heading west by the wind So ended latter 38.30 N Longitude 40.50 W

Remarks on board Saturday June the 22nd 1861.



Commenced with strong breezes from west south west and fogged within saw a number of humpbacks and one seal starting to the eastward at four o'clock P M took the topsail and took in the jib at sundown took in the middle staysail heading north by the wind had strong breeze then the night at daylight set the jib at four o'clock P M raised breeches of the foremast and hove stern off for them but it turned out to be humpbacks left to the wind again latter part strong breezes So ended latter 40.00 N Longitude 41.50 W

Remarks on board Sunday June the 23rd 1861

Commenced with strong breezes from west south west and fogged within saw humpbacks at six o'clock P M the Brig S B Smith of New York she was starting to the eastward at sundown were round to the southward and took in sail hove the fore topsail had strong breeze then the night and equally within at day again a number of fishbacks latter part strong breezes and fogged within So ended one ship to the northward and westward latter 40.20 N Longitude 42.00 W
