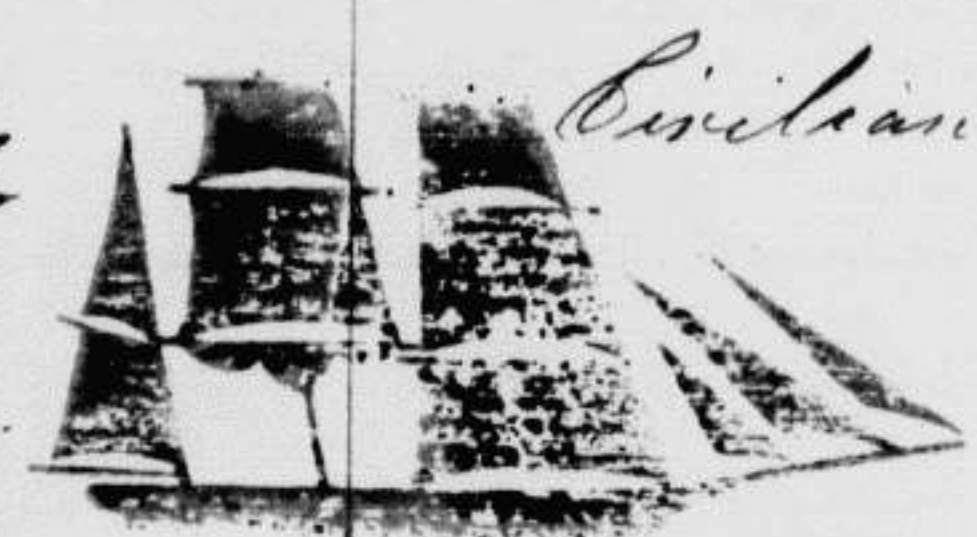
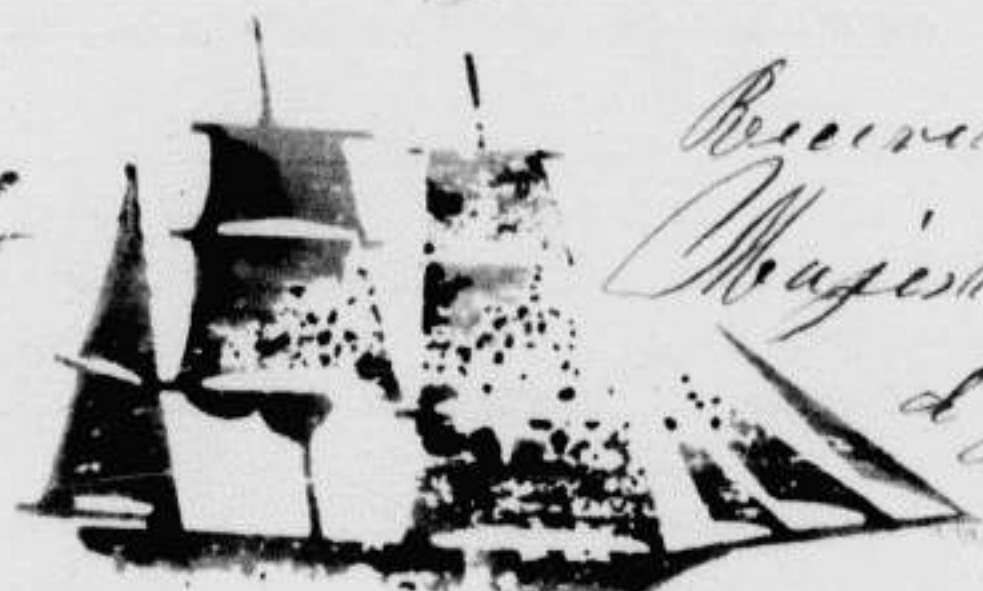


Brig Kate Craig Cruising

within 20 20 M longitude 42.02 W



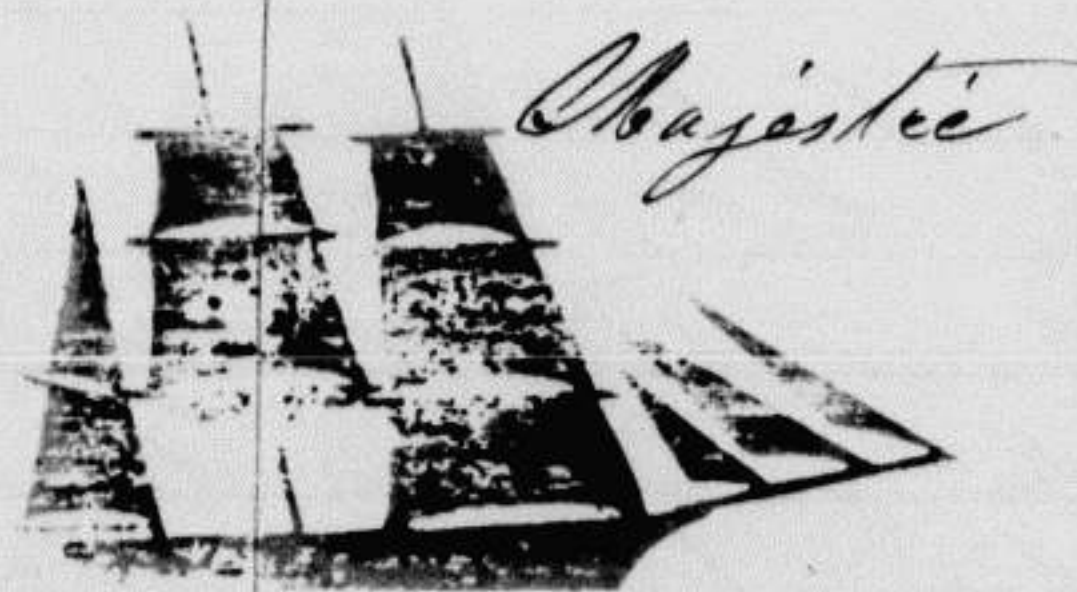
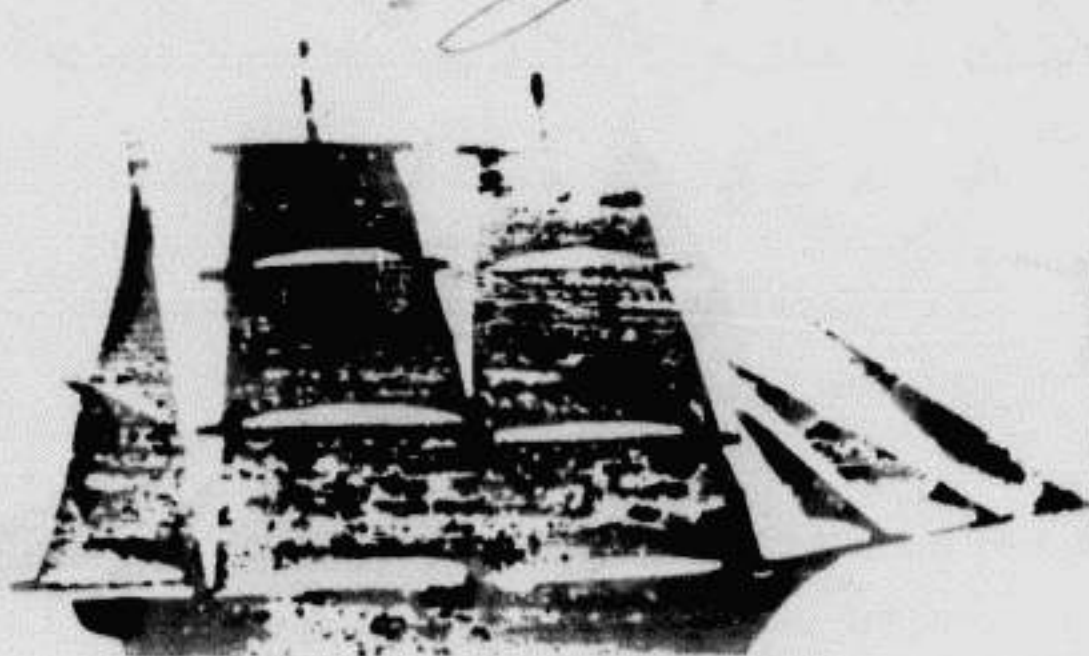
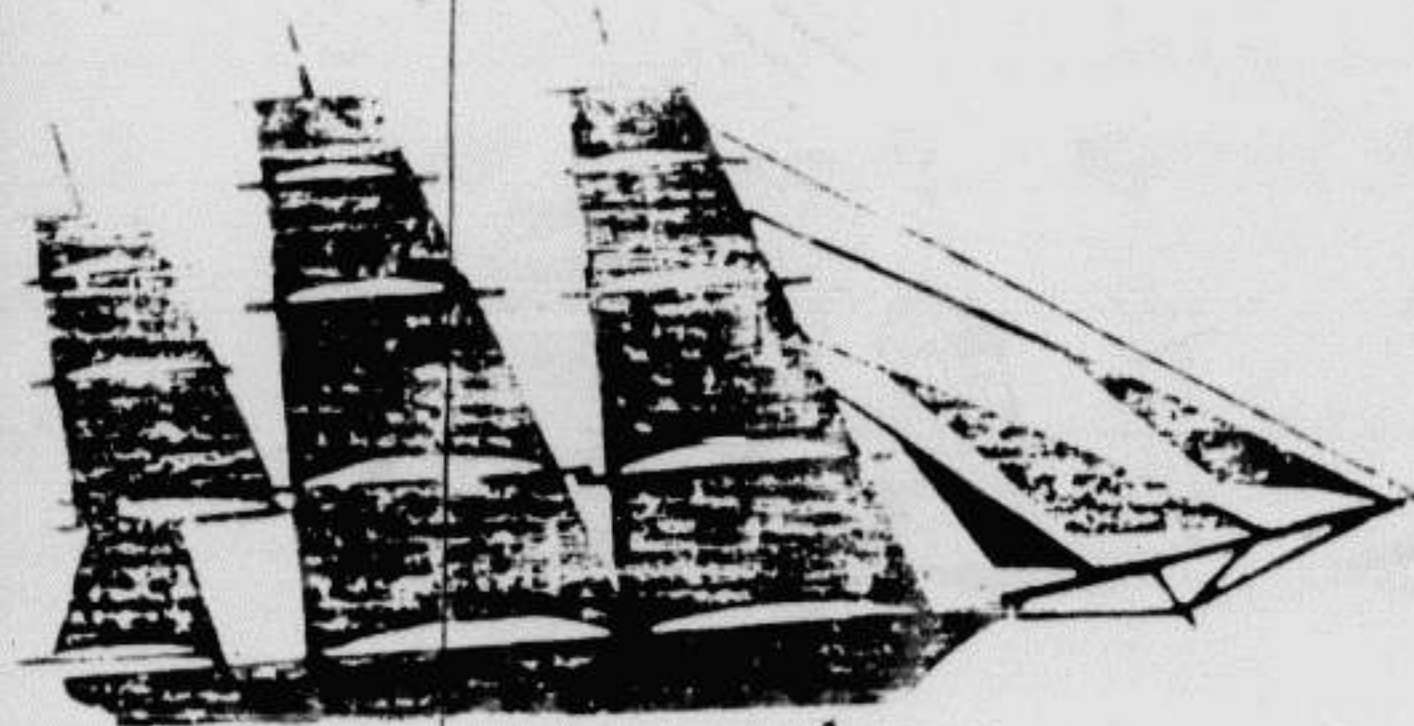

Remarks on board Wednesday July the 17th 1861.

Commodore with light beams from the
northward and good weather the watch
employed in cruising ships decks at
five o'clock P.M. spoke the Brig
Majestic of New Bedford used gamed
with her but sundown took in sail
and light beams then the night at
daylight set all sail and stood on
to the eastward saw blackfish hatter but
five beams gaming with the Majestic So
came within 20 20 M longitude 41.04

Remarks on board Thursday July the 18th 1861

Commodore with fine beams from the
westward and good weather gaming with
the Majestic and Civilian at sundown
took in sail stood south then the
night at daylight made sail and left
up south still out the watch employed
in cruising ships decks saw grampsons
to the first fresh beams in sail in night
So came within 20.15 M longitude 40.45 W

Remarks on board Friday July the 19th 1861

Commodore with fresh beams from north
west and good weather nothing going on
with remarking left to the westward
the westward saw a Brig steering north
east under all sail at sundown took
ship and took in sail heading north
west sail had light beams then
the night at day light
made sail had

the wind from north east heading to the
eastward saw grampsons hatter but light
beams took ship to the westward So
came within 20.00 M longitude 40.48

the northward and fine weather the
watch employed in cruising ships decks
saw grampsons at six o'clock P.M.
