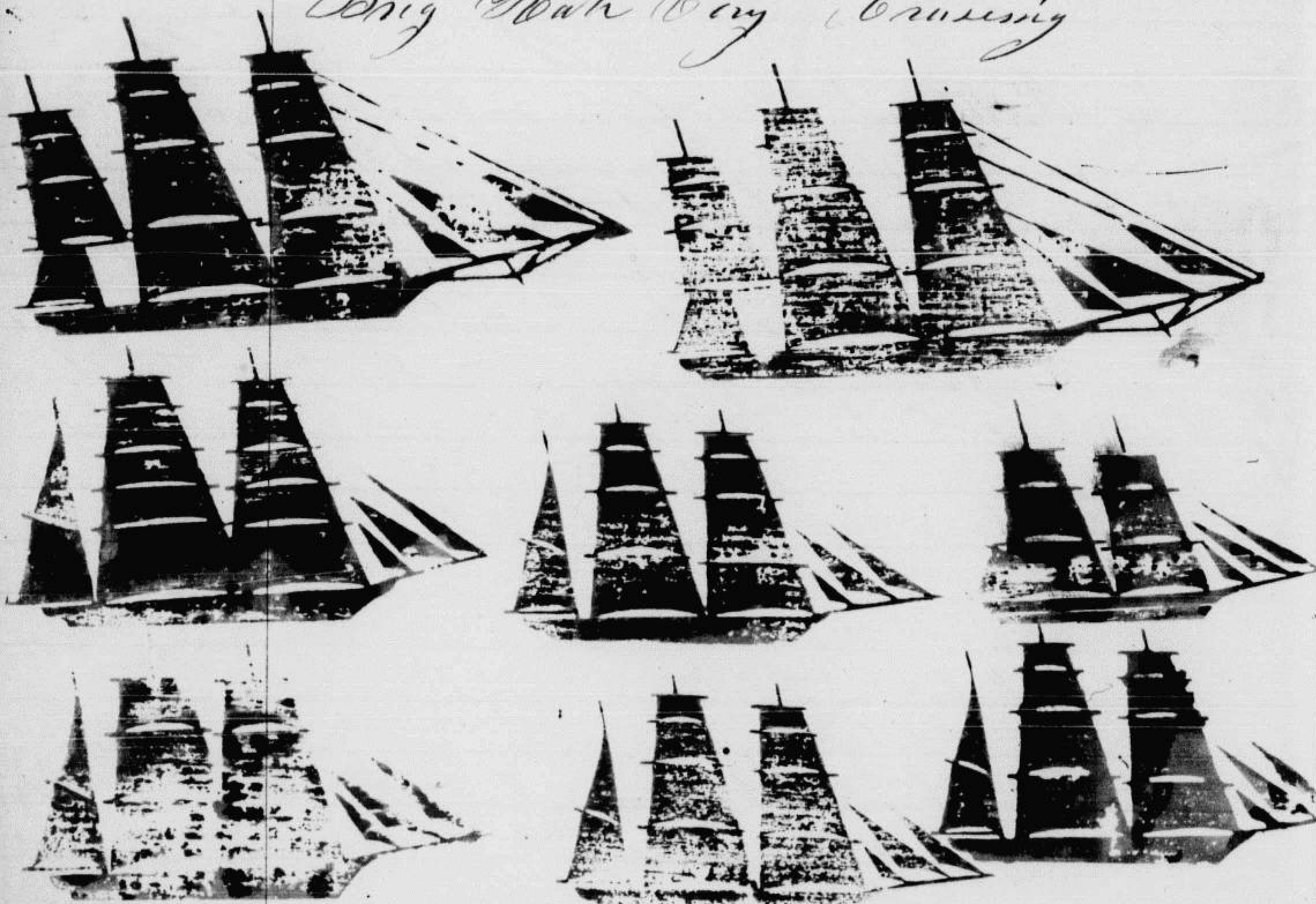


Brig Kate Cory Cruising

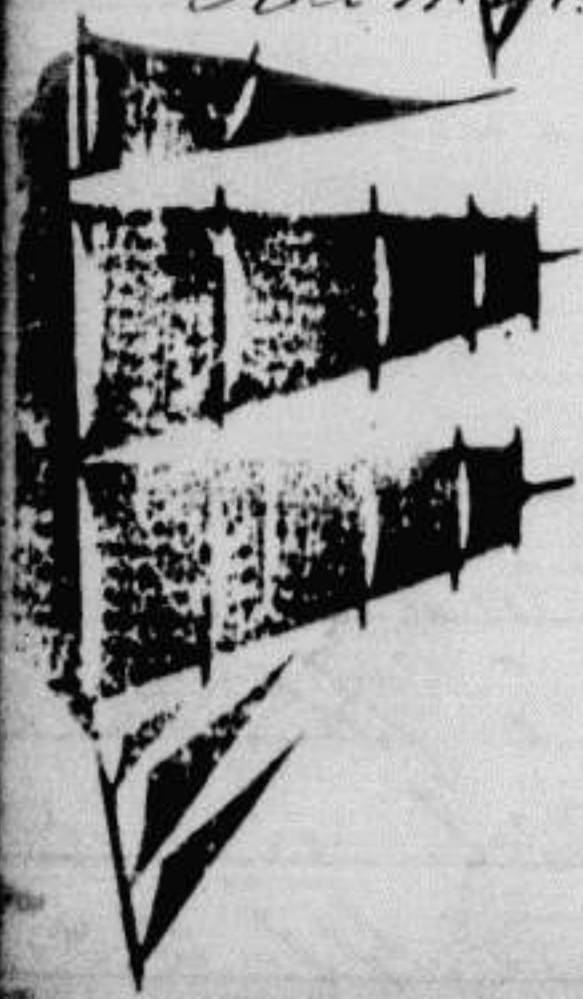


Remarks on board Wednesday July the 31st 1861



Commenced with good weather but within the watch employed in various ship's duty at sundown took in sail still remained out in latter part of the night got a light breeze from the northward at day light set all sail and stood on to the eastward saw grasshopper in latter part of the breeze from south in sight So was Lat. 37. 14 N Longitude 40. 35 W

Remarks on board Thursday August the 1st 1861



Commenced with fine breezes from the northward and good weather the watch employed in various ship's duty at sundown took in sail spoke a Danish Barge from Brazil passed to the eastward threw the night at daylight made sail and looked ship

To the northward and westward saw grasshopper in latter part the wind backed round to the eastward and died away nothing in sight So was Lat. 37. 33 N Longitude 40. 47 W

Remarks on board Friday August the 2nd 1861

Commenced with light air from the eastward and good weather the watch employed overhauling blocks at sundown took in had it calm latter part of the night got a light breeze from the southward heading to the westward at daylight set all sail and stood on saw grasshopper out of the harbor and saw nothing in sight So was Lat. 37. 34 N Longitude 40. 55 W

Remarks on board Saturday August the 3rd 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from north and good weather saw round and steered north east by east the watch employed in various ship's duty saw Blackbird and Grasshopper at half past five o'clock P.M. raised a large Breach off the harbor beam left up for it but saw nothing more at sundown took in sail heading south south east by the wind had fine breezes threw the night at daylight set all sail and looked ship to the northward and westward saw a shallop Barge to the westward saw to the east, latter part fresh breeze So was Lat. 37. 40 N Longitude 41. 00 W
