Remarks on board Sunday August the 4th 1861

L. B. Commet with fresh breezes from west
north west and fair weather turned up
the Main Mast and painted her at
six o'clock P.M. hove the 10 guinea
boats for Blackfish and got to one
to each boat took them along side
and hauled them in in block and
put in sail heading north north
west by the wind. Made it overboard
threw the night at daylight
sailed away at five o'clock P.M.
at five o'clock P.M. spoke the

Spanton of Providence seen

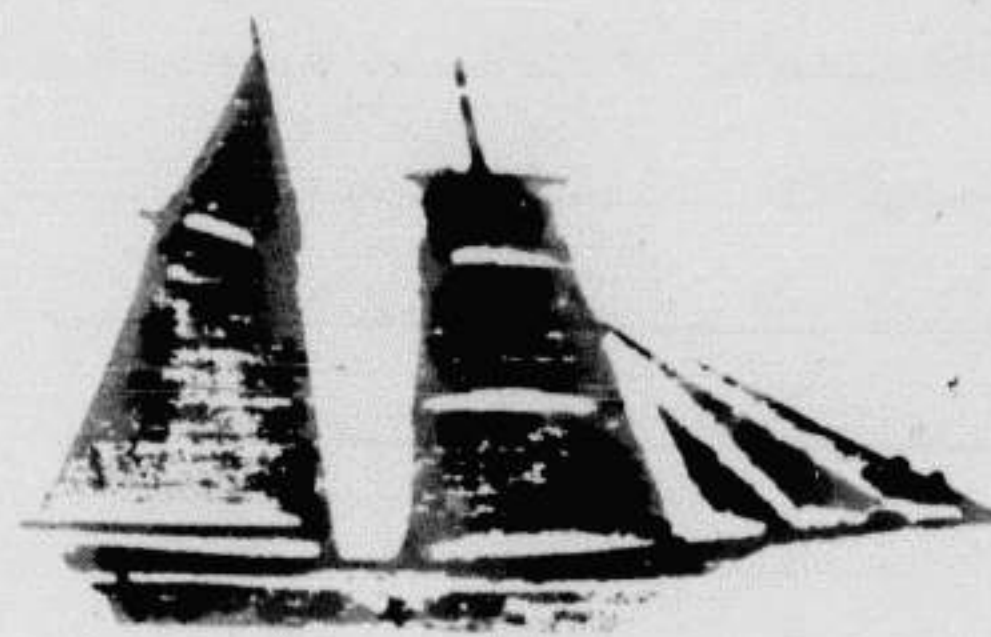
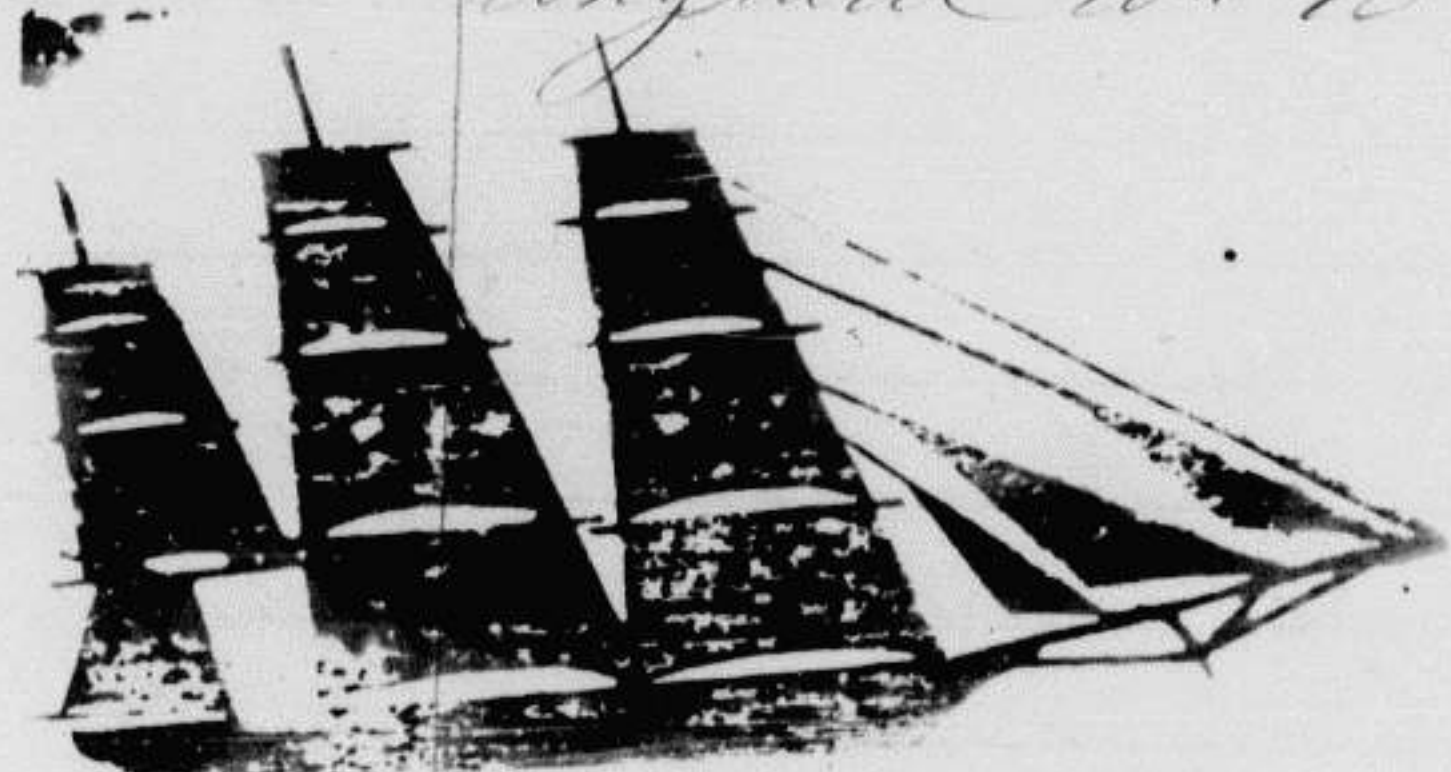
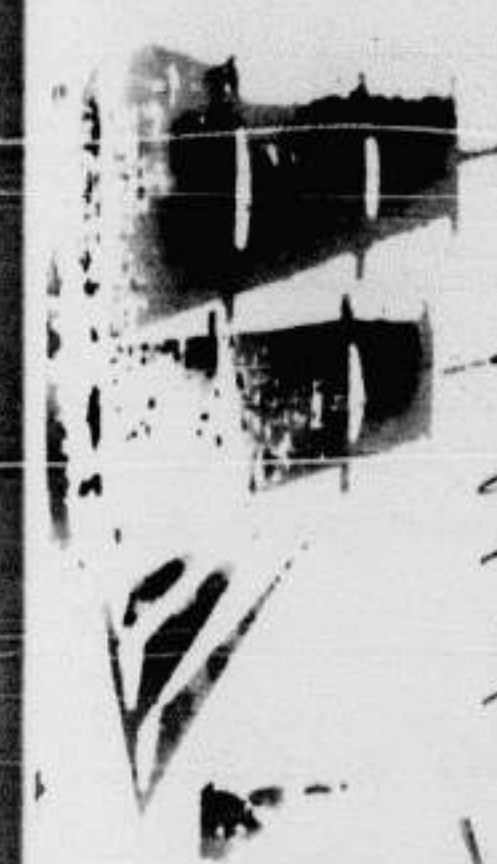
Remarks on board Monday August the 5th 1861

Commet with fine breezes from south
south west and good weather passing out
the spout saw three brigst steering to the
eastward at nine o'clock. Captain Delaney
came on board by launch then the night
at daylight made sail and left off

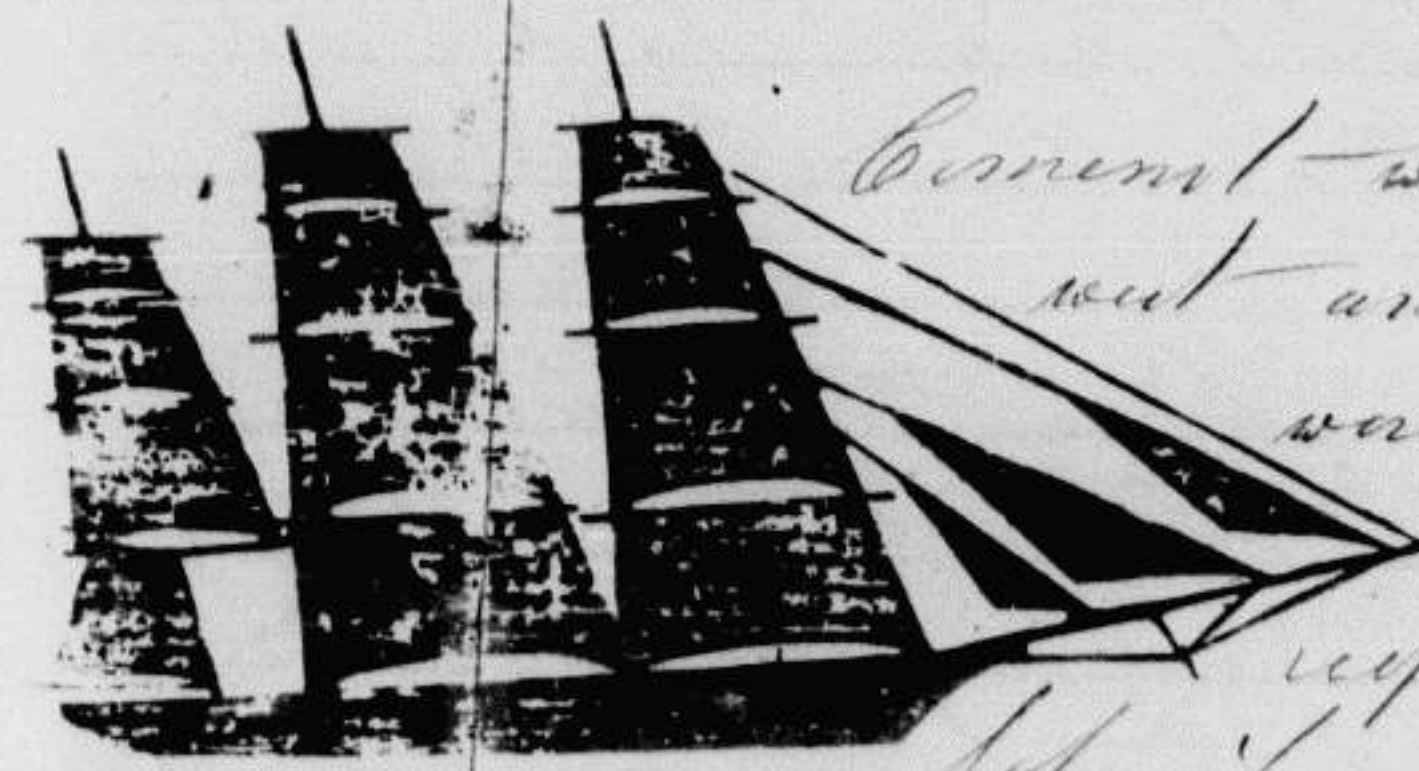
South South east hove out for water and

Longitude 40.45 W.



Remarks on board Tuesday August the 6th 1861

Commet with strong breezes from west
north west and sized with the watch
employed hauling out the Blackfish at three
o'clock P.M. four o'clock and steered north east
at five o'clock P.M. got three sailing at
sundown took in sail and kept the
wind to the northward had strong breezes
threw the night at daylight left off east
north east later part strong breezes north
in sight. Sailed at 11.38 P.M.
Longitude 40.04 W.

Remarks on board Wednesday August the 7th 1861



Commet with strong breezes from north
west and a heavy south rising
were itchy and turned the
reef out of the four
