Remarks on board Saturday August the 17th 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from south west and good weather clearing east the watch employed setting up the fore rigging at sundown took in sail and here again headed north west by the wind latter part of the night - Breasted on shore at nine o'clock A.M. were ship to the southward saw to sail, latter part strong breezes and squally with S. ends latitude 32° 11' N Longitude 41° 04' W



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Remarks on board Sunday August the 18th 1861

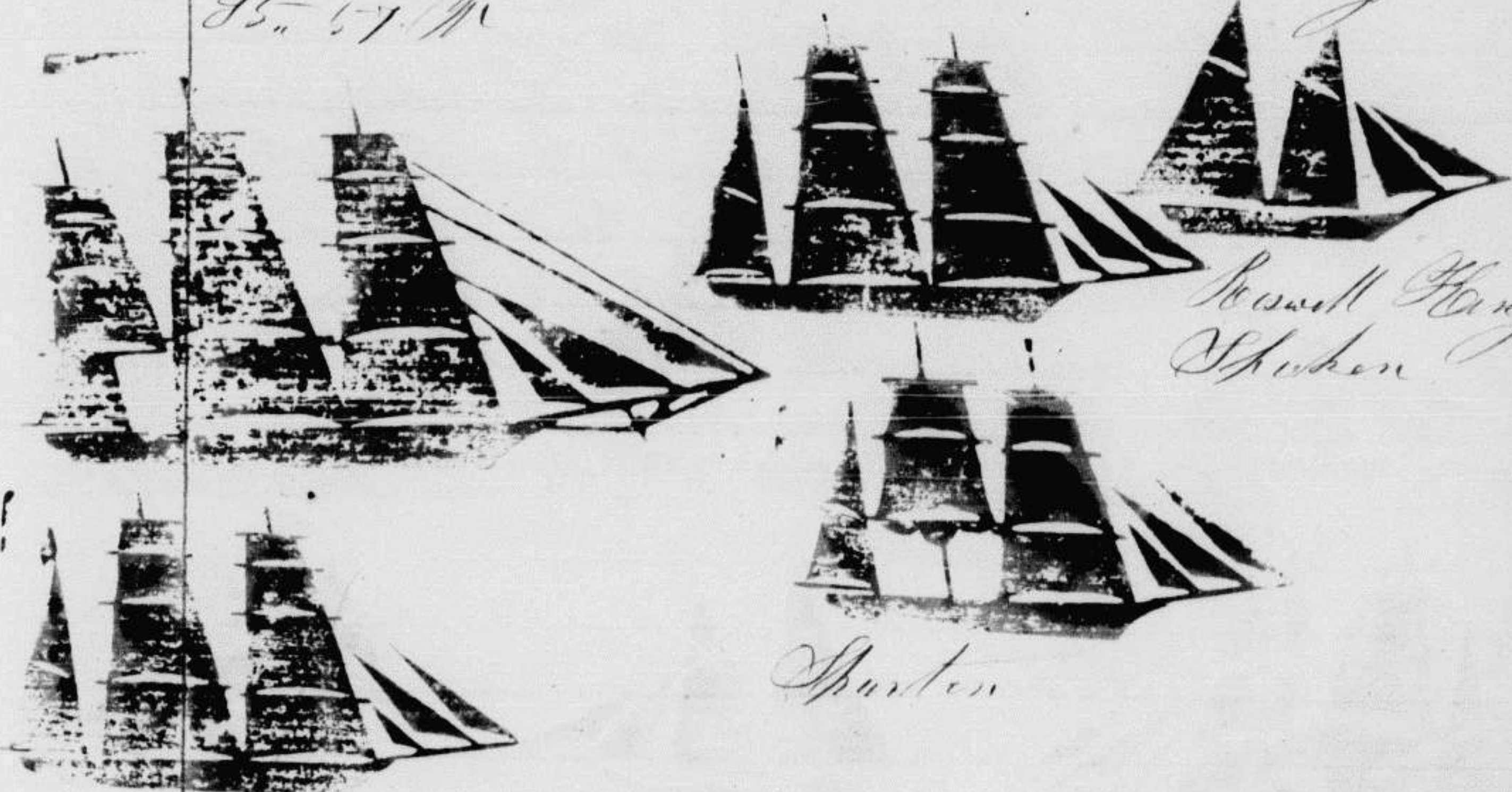
Commenced with strong breezes from the west and squally and angry weather clearing south east at three o'clock P.M. the wind shifted round north east and cleared off had fine weather saw a Bark to the southward at sundown took in sail latter part of the night - the wind hauled round S.E. and hauled on fresh saw a sail ahead standing to the southward latter part squally with S. ends latitude 36° 30' N Longitude 36° 44' W

Remarks on board Monday August the 19th 1861

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and squally with at five o'clock P.M. turned back to the eastward had good breezes thru the night at

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Day Bright - turned the reef out of the topsail and set off north east by east the watch employed making out the water saw to sail, latter part fresh breezes S. ends latitude 36° 22' N Longitude 35° 57' W

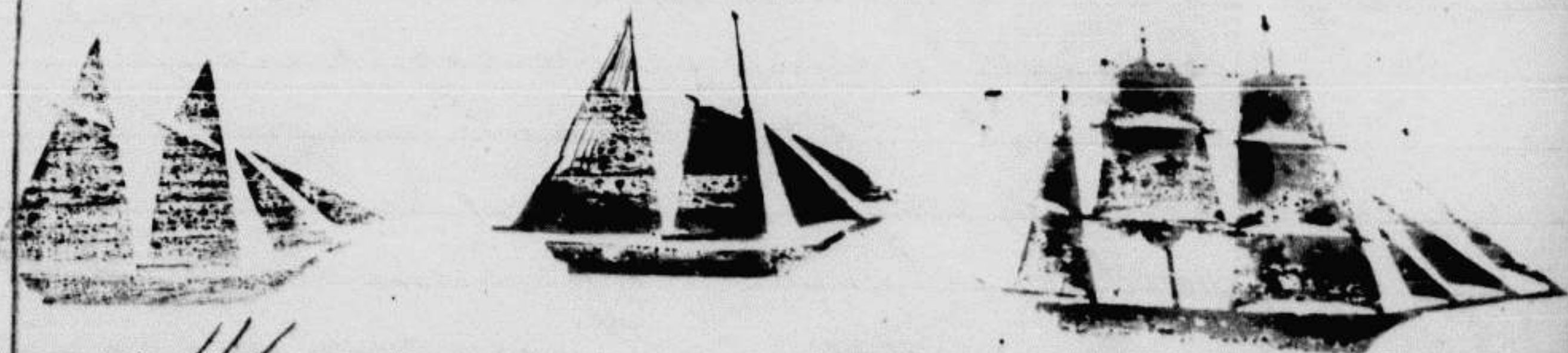

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Remarks on board Tuesday August the 20th 1861

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and fair weather were round and steamed north north west the watch employed setting up the main rigging saw to sail at sundown took in sail spoke the Schooner Russell King clearing north north west - had light breezes thru the night at daylight set all sail and stood on to the northward saw three sails latter part fine breezes S. ends latitude 37° 10' N Longitude 36° 22' W
