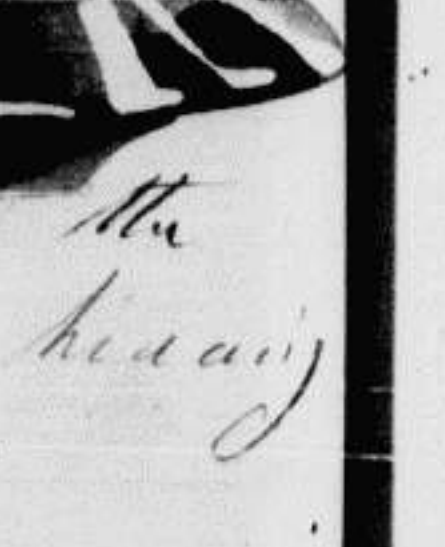
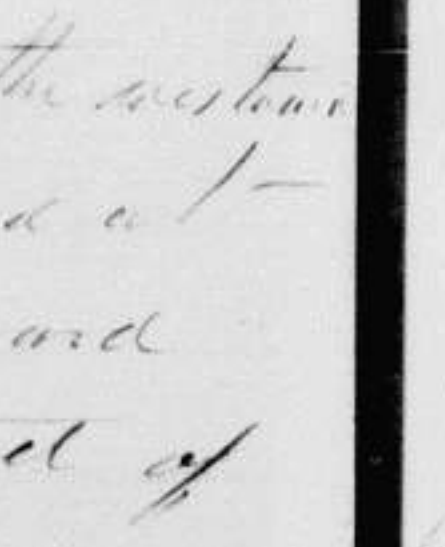
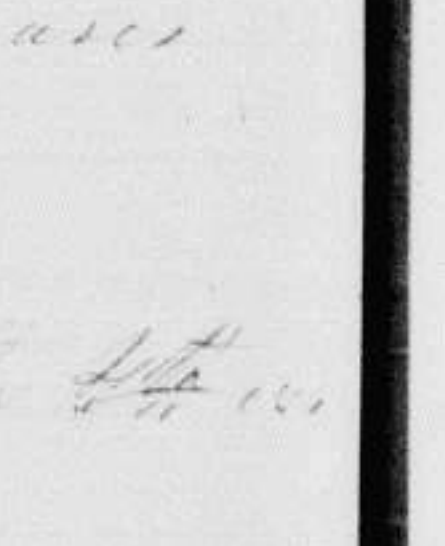
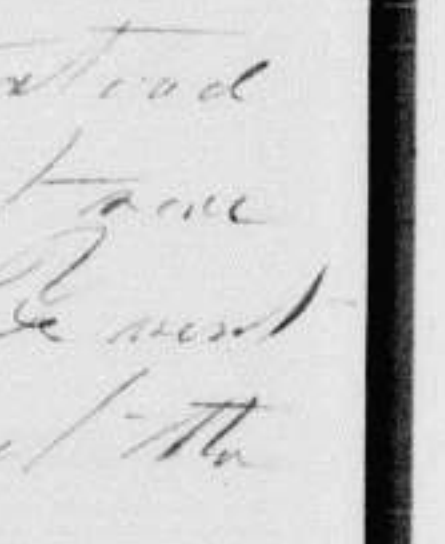
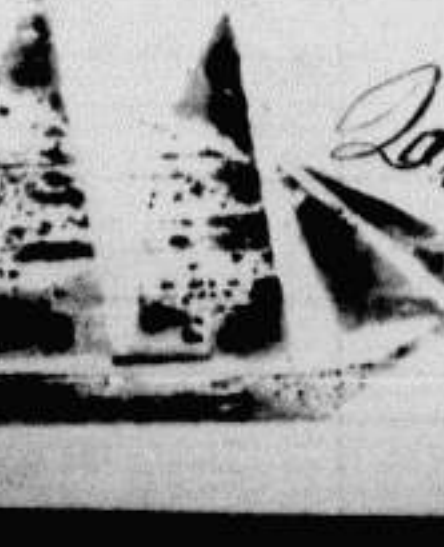
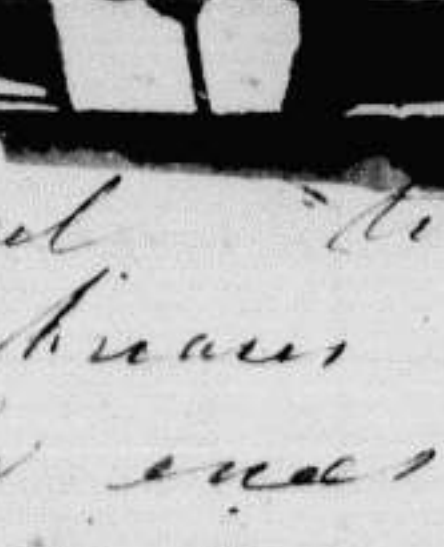
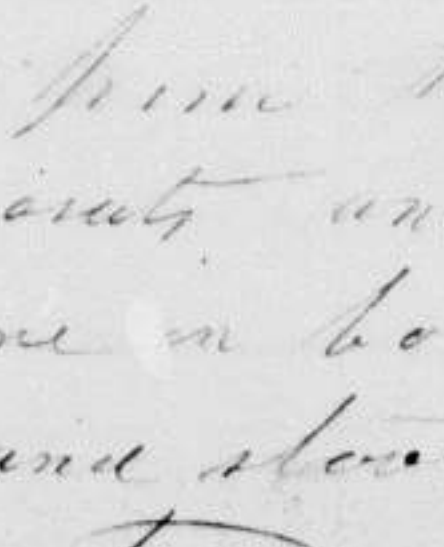
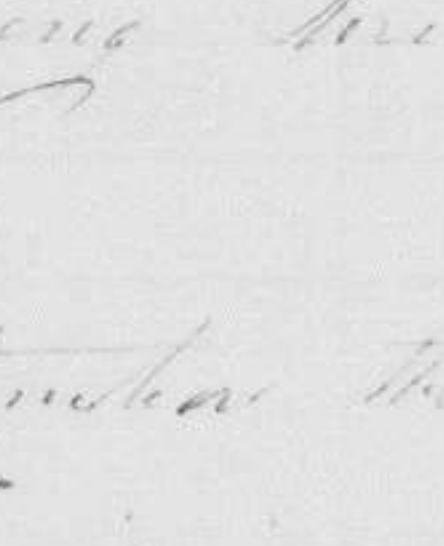
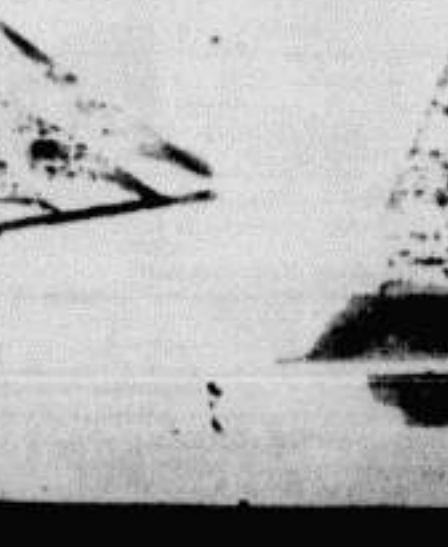
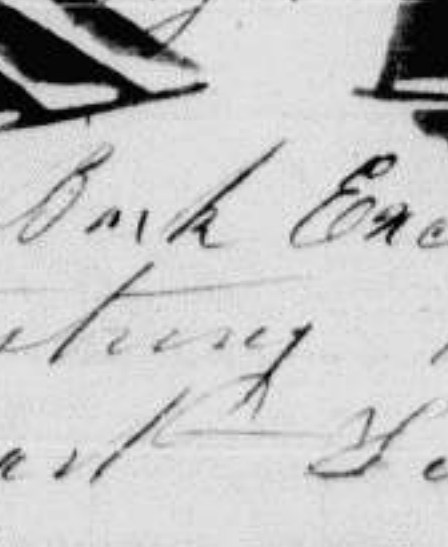
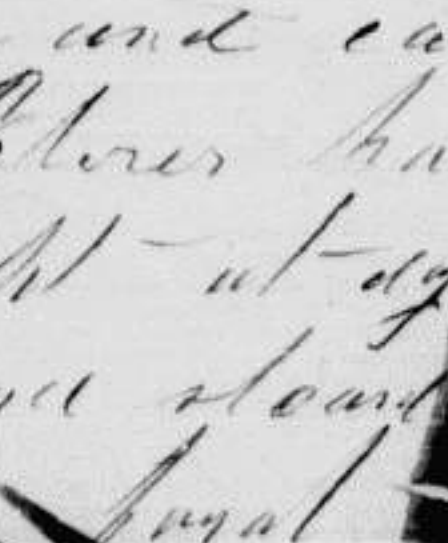
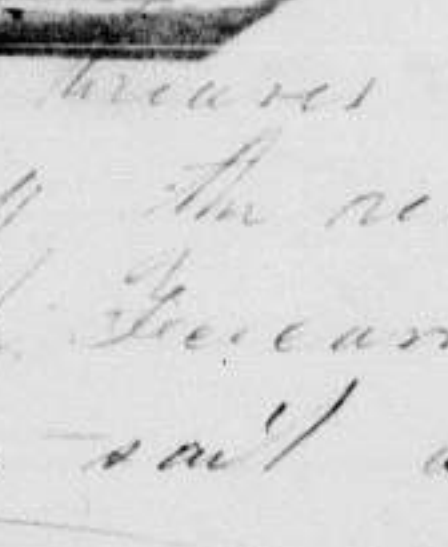
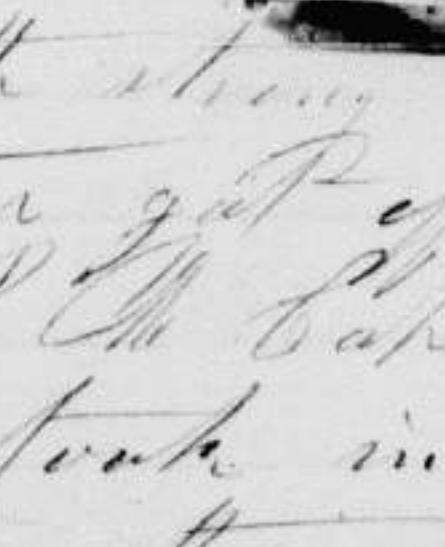
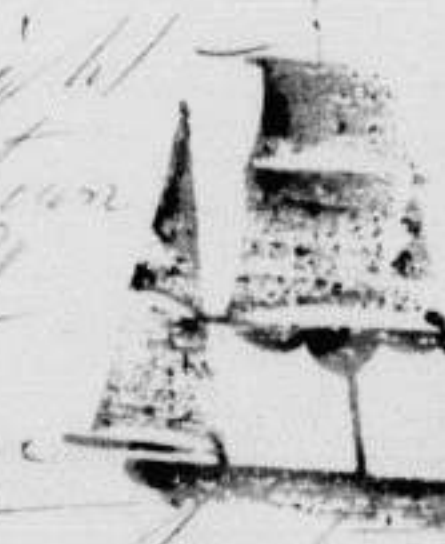
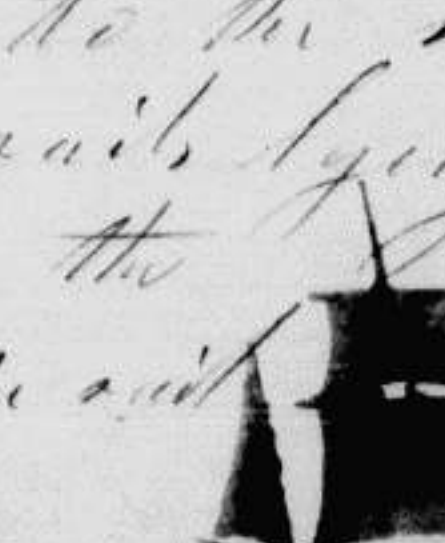
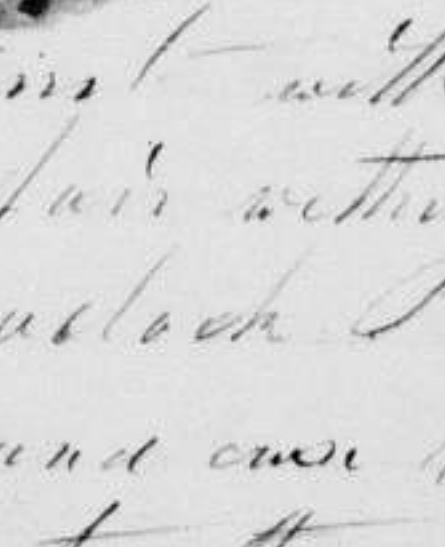
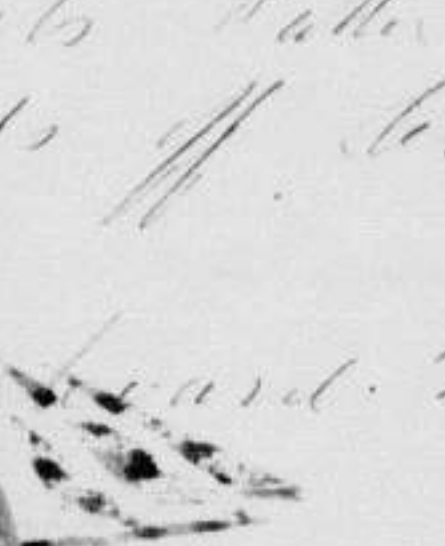
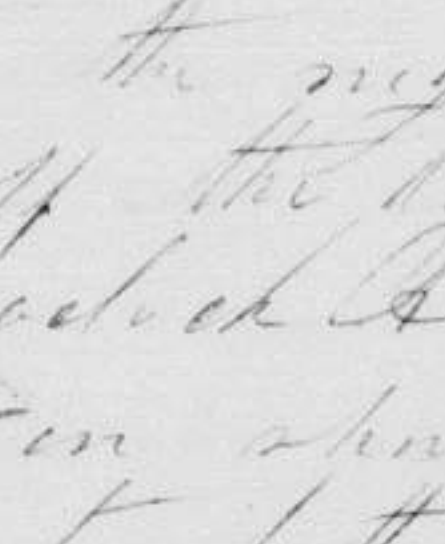
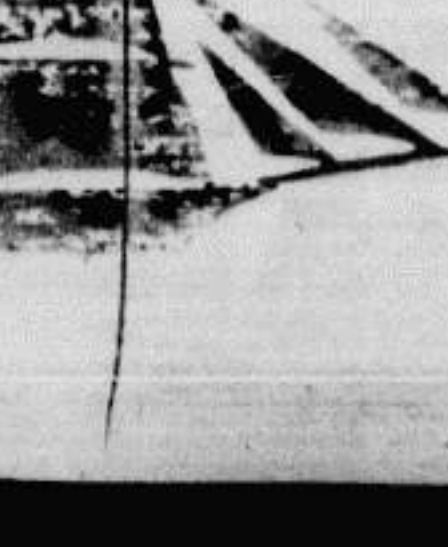
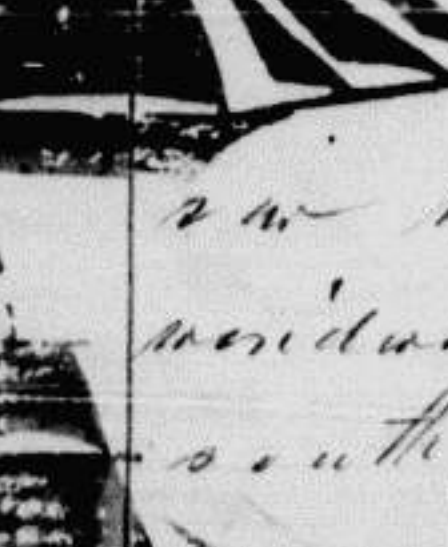
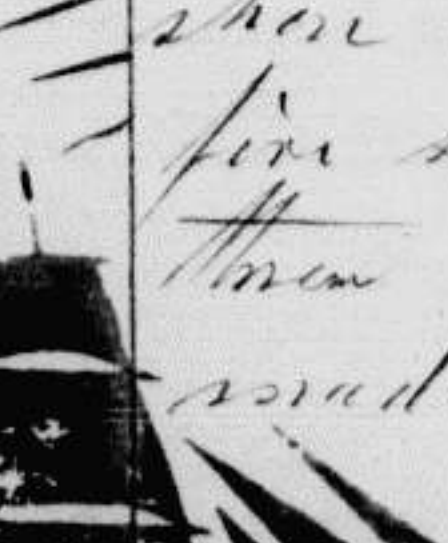
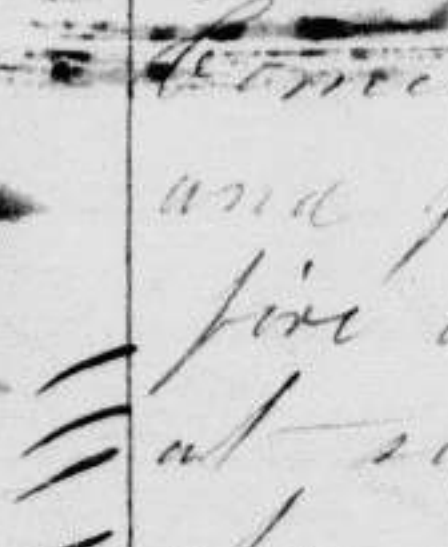
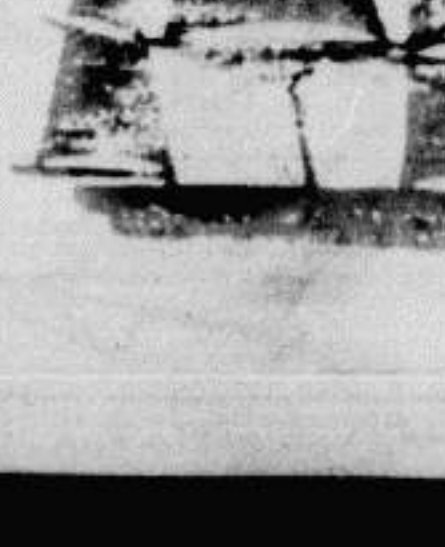
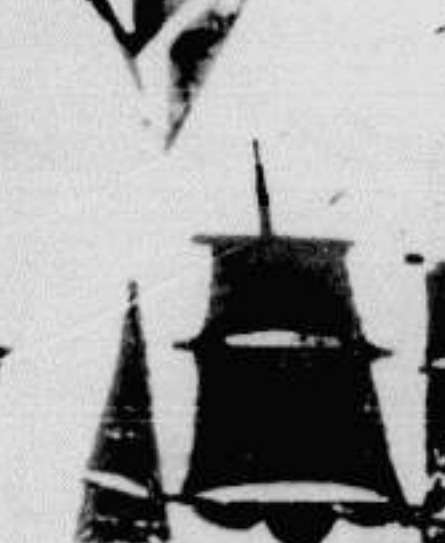
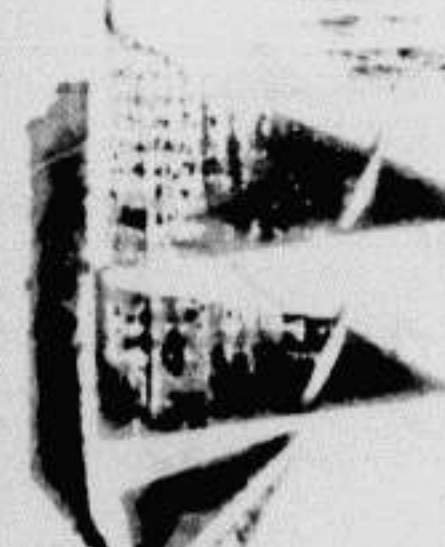
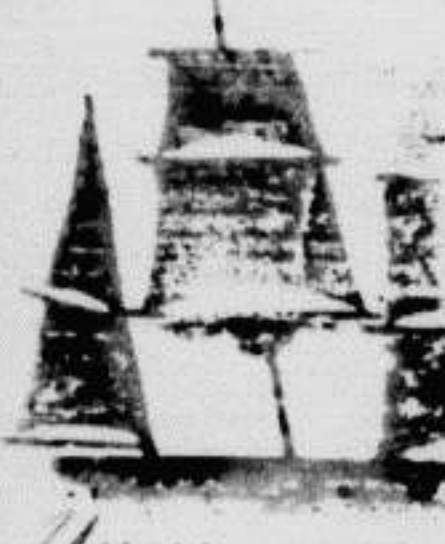
Remarks in house Tuesday September the 5th 1861
