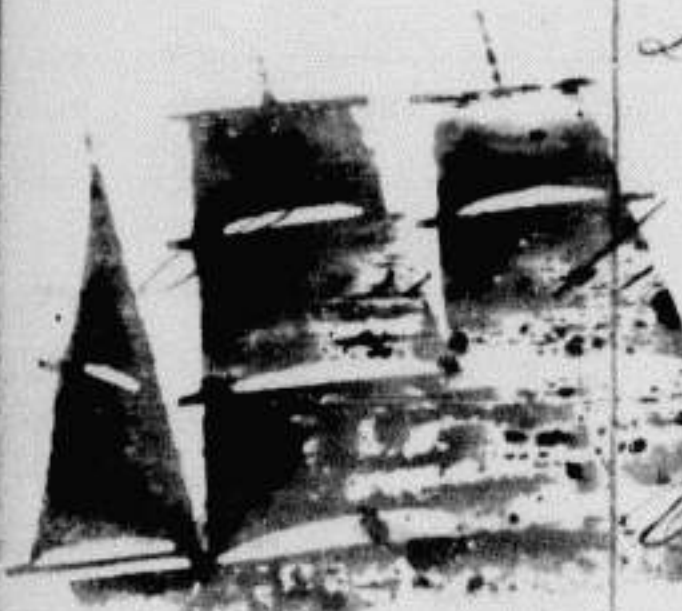


## Brig. Kate Cory Cruising

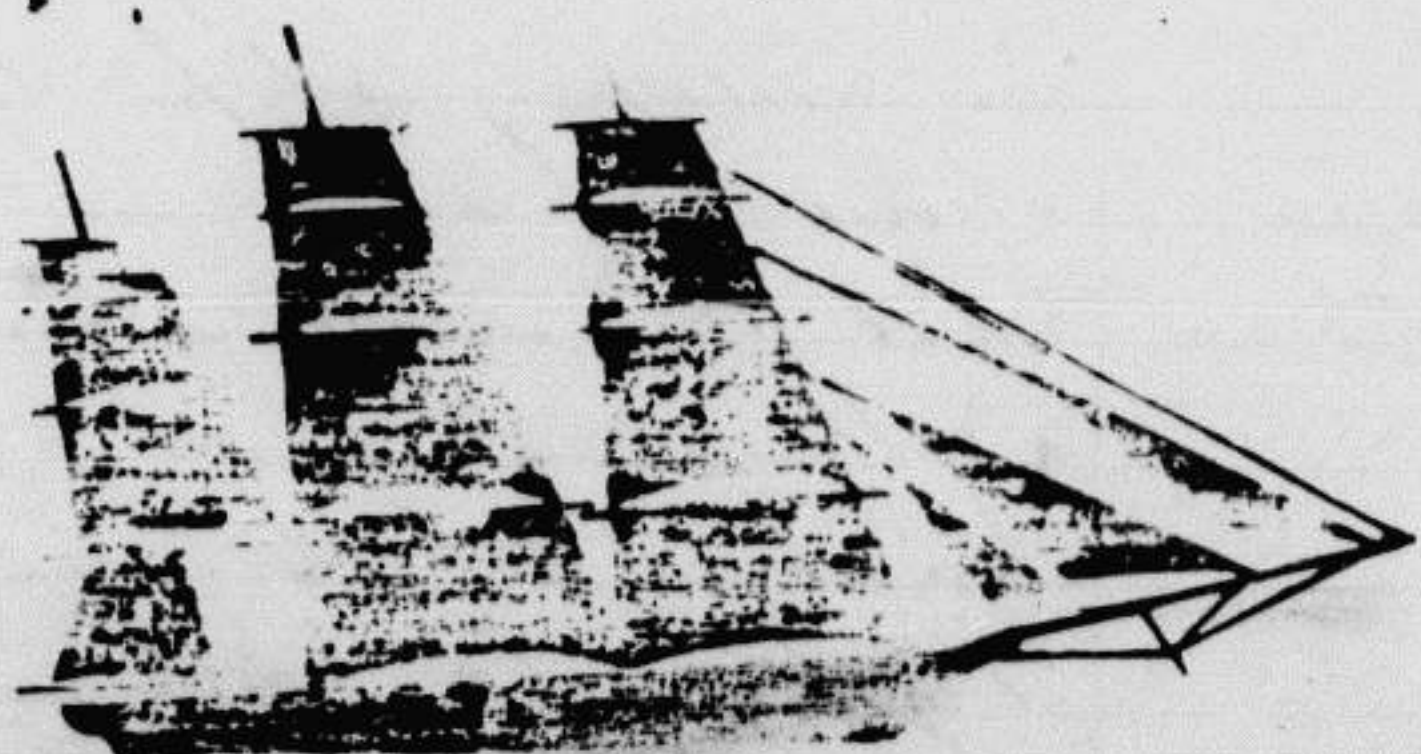
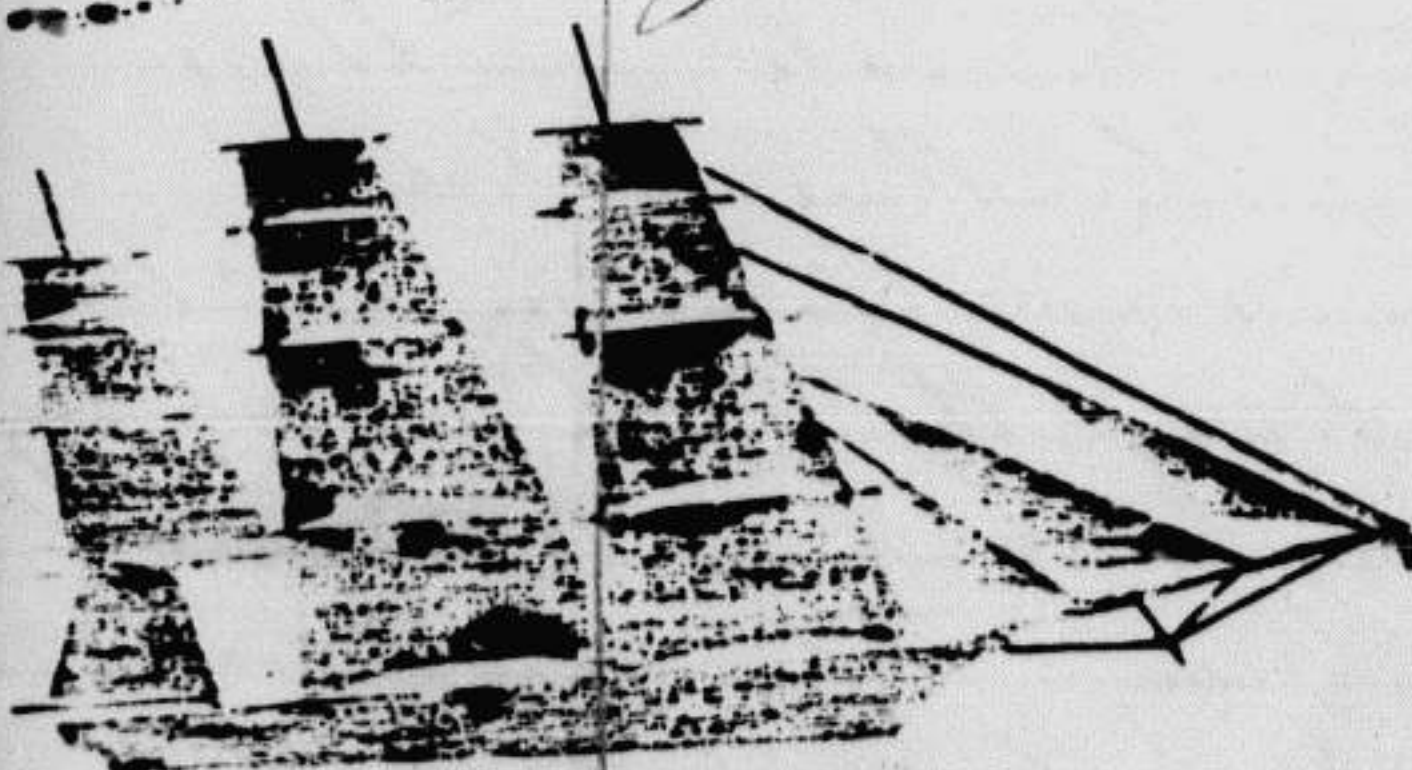
Remarks on board Wednesday September the 18<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with light breezes from the southeast and fair with heaving to the eastward the watch employed in ordinary ship duty at sundown took in sail. Cap. B. came on board from the Ben Tucker heading south and had fine breezes there. The night at daylight made sail and stood on at nine o'clock. At 10 raised a heave off the water beam. Ten miles off tacked ship. For it but saw nothing more off it. Further but fine breezes. So under sail 26.40 Long 26.54

Remarks on board Thursday September the 19<sup>th</sup> 1861

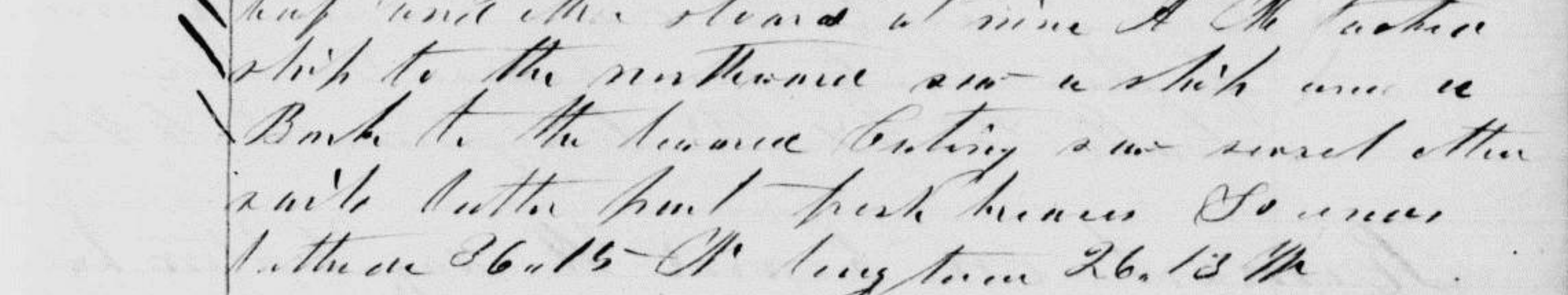
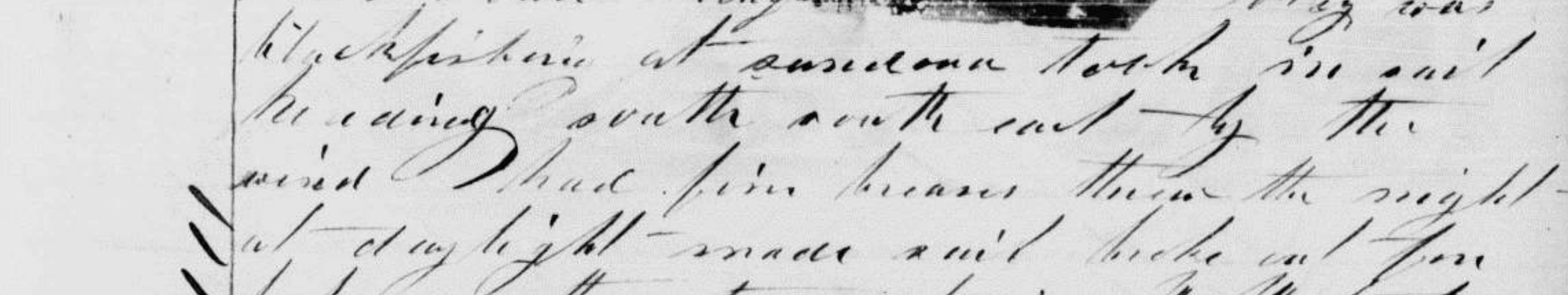
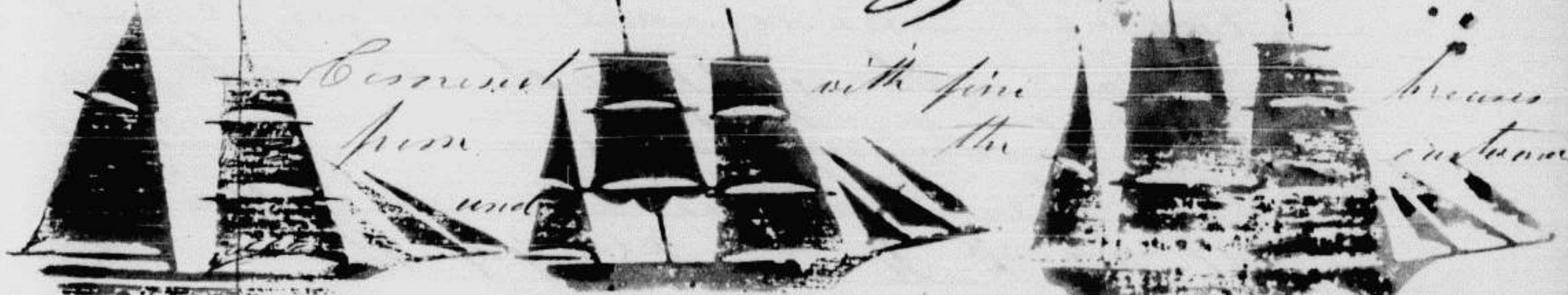
Comment with fine breezes from south west and good with tacked ship to the southeast and eastward the watch employed in ordinary ship duty on a sail and a sheet of Grandmain at sundown took in sail heading south east by south half south had it calm there the night at eight o'clock. At 10 got a light breeze from the westward under sail saw lots of grampus. Further but good with three sails in sight. So under sail 26.17 Long 26.30

Remarks on board Friday September the 20<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with fine breezes from the southeast and good with the watch employed in ordinary ship duty at five o'clock. At 10 the windward boats close they were kept in at sundown took in sail heading south east by the wind. Had fine breezes there the night at daylight made sail. At five had and other stores at nine. At 10 tacked ship to the northward saw a ship and a bark to the seaward. Continuing saw several other and further but fresh breezes. So under sail 26.15 Long 26.13

Remarks on board Saturday September the 21<sup>st</sup> 1861

Comment with fresh breezes from south east fair with the watch employed in ordinary ship duty at their ash. At 10 tacked ship to the southeast and eastward at sundown took in sail had fine breezes there the night. At 10 tacked ship to the northward saw a ship and a bark to the seaward. Continuing saw several other and further but fresh breezes. So under sail 26.15 Long 26.13
