Remarks on board Wednesday October the 9th 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from the westward and good within the watch employed in ordinary ships duty and to sail on standing to the northward and the other to the southward at sundown in sail had fresh breezes then the night at daylight made sail and commenced sailing south by east half east so ends Letterhead 25th 1861

Remarks on board Thursday October the 10th 1861

Commenced with fresh breezes from south west and fair within the watch employed over hauling the boat tackle blocks saw a Bark steering to the southward at sundown took in sail at night sailed the bark about the fore yard and by then the night at daylight made sail and left off south by east saw the island of Palma off the the bark had some 45 miles off broke out for water and provisions latter part fine breezes so ends Letterhead 25th 1861

Remarks on board Friday October the 11th 1861

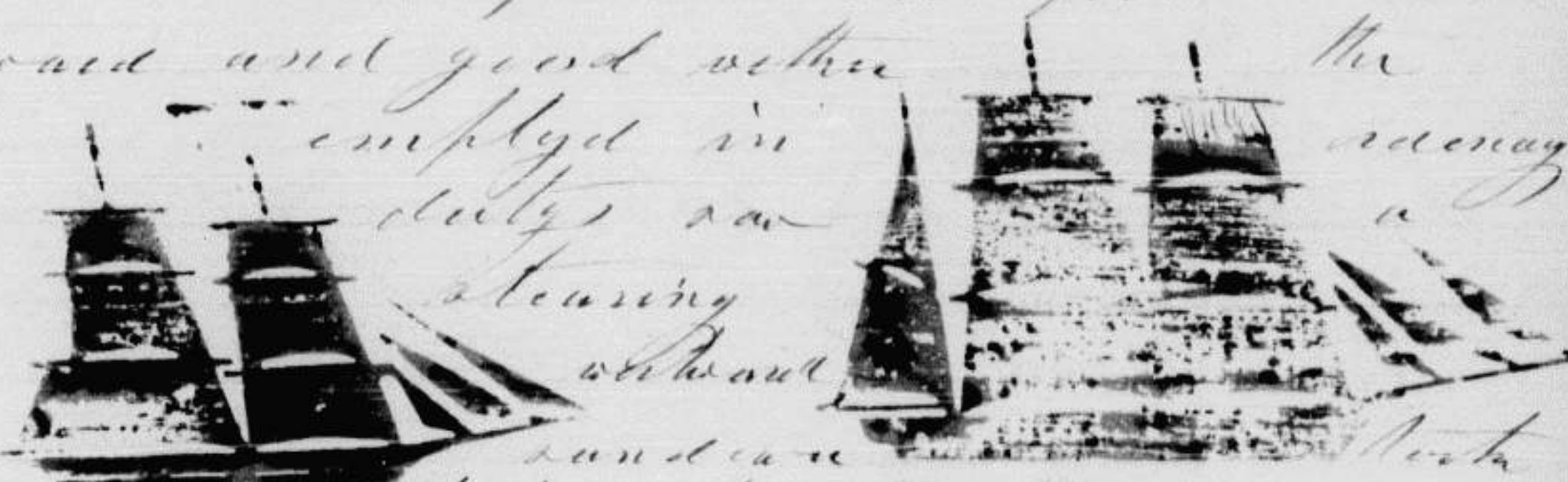
Commenced with fine breezes from the north and good within the watch employed in ordinary ships duty at sundown took in sail and left to the wind to the westward saw the land return some fifteen miles off had light breezes then the night at daylight made sail and left off south east saw a sail steering to the westward latter part fine breezes so ends off Palma Letterhead 25th 1861

Brig White Cory off Canary Islands

Remarks on board Saturday October the 12th 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from the northward and good within the watch employed in ordinary ships duty saw a Brig steering to the westward at sundown took in sail and left to the westward latter part of the night died away calm and squally so the remains of these being four miles so ends off Palma

Remarks on board Sunday October the 13th 1861

Commenced with good within but calm nothing going on with remarking at sundown still calm at three o'clock then got a light breeze from north east steered south east at daylight then left to the wind to the north and westward latter part light breezes so ends off Palma

Remarks on board Monday October the 14th 1861

Commenced with light breezes from north east and good within heading to the northward and westward under short sail at twelve o'clock the wind came to the southward and eastward at daylight made sail and steered south east sent the fore royal yard aloft latter part light breezes so ends off Palma

Remarks on board Tuesday October the 15th 1861

Commenced with light breezes from north east and good within the watch employed in ordinary ships duty at sundown took in sail had fresh breezes steering south east
