Remarks on board Sunday November the 10th 1861

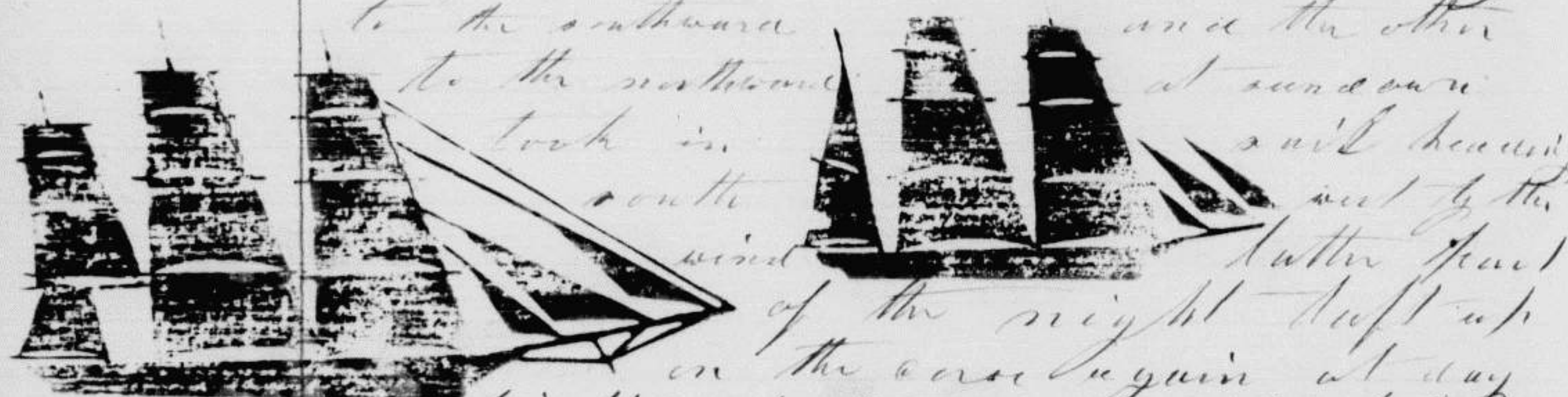
Commenced with light breezes from the eastward and fair with the land a boat and Cape St went on board of the *Bargue* *Thompson* she was 15 days from London bound to the eastward at sundown had it calm at seven P.M. got a breeze from the eastward at daylight set

Remarks on board Monday November the 11th 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from south-east and fair with a few two sails one standing to the southward and the other



to the northward at sundown took in the south wind set by the latter part of the night kept up in the eve again at day light set the mainsail both part fine breezes clearing south by west So ends Lat 20.40 Long 19.40

Remarks on board Tuesday November the 12th 1861

Commenced with fine breezes from the eastward and fair with a few pillars the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty at sundown took in the mainsail had it equally mast of the night at daylight all way calm nothing in sight latter part calm So ends latitude 20.40 Long 19.35 W

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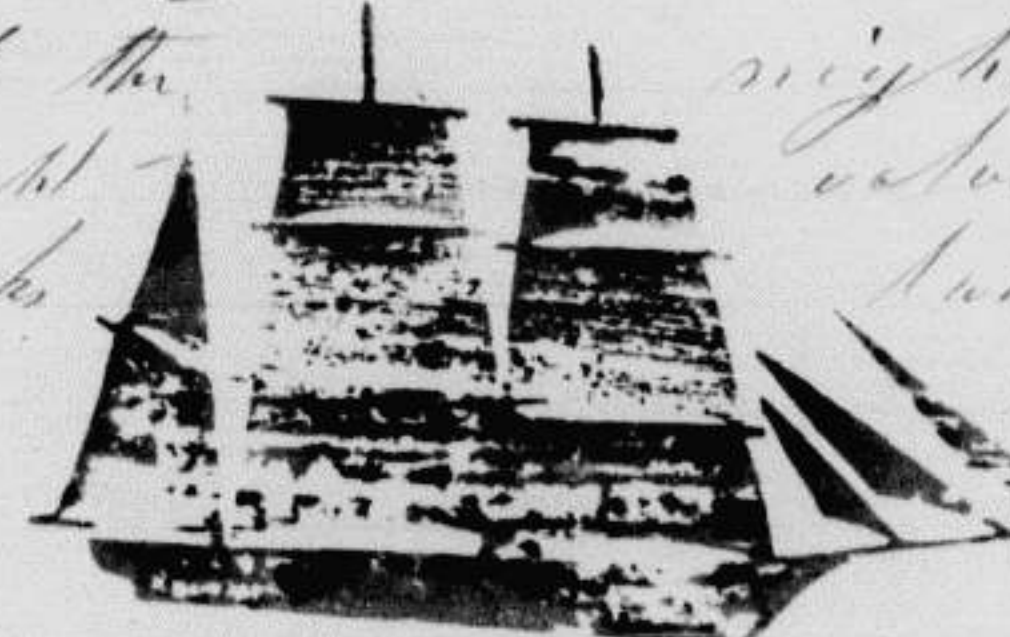
Remarks on board Wednesday November the 13th 1861

Commenced with calm weather saw a sail to the eastward of us at sundown still calm which heading all way latter part of the night got a light breeze from the eastward at nine o'clock At 10 o'clock the boats for Blackfish but could not get put so came on board again latter part calm So ends no latitude



Remarks on board Thursday November the 14th 1861

Commenced with calm weather saw a sail to the eastward at sundown still calm latter part of the night had it equally at night at 10 o'clock At 11 o'clock saw pinkish latter part light breeze too sails in sight So ends Lat 20.40 Long 19.40



Remarks on board Friday November the 15th 1861

Commenced with light breezes from south and fair with a watch employed making out for water and provisions at sundown hauled up fresh shad by set by the wind had strong breeze then the night latter part ranging and squally saw a hulk to the eastward So ends this day
