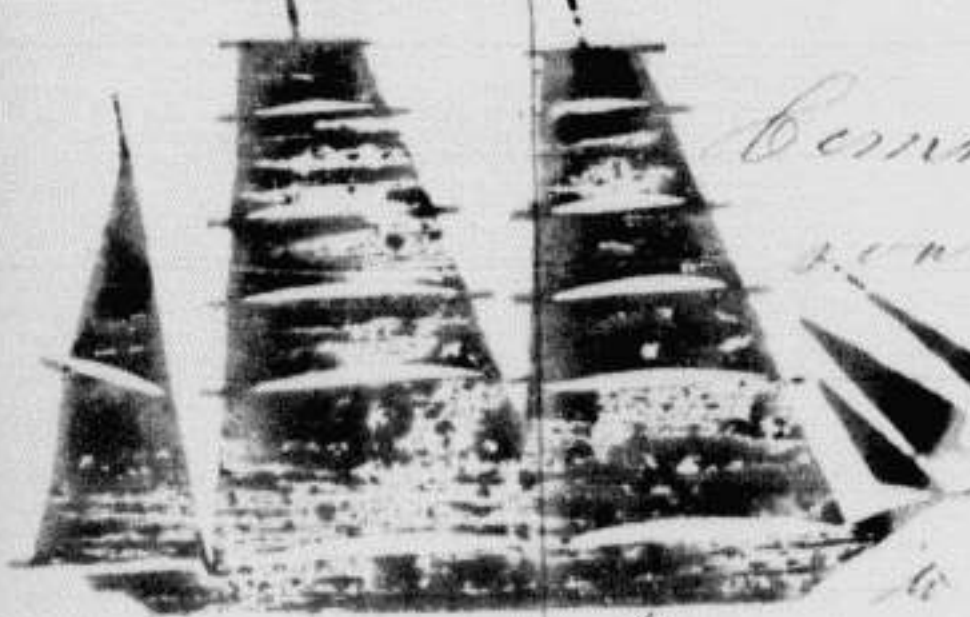


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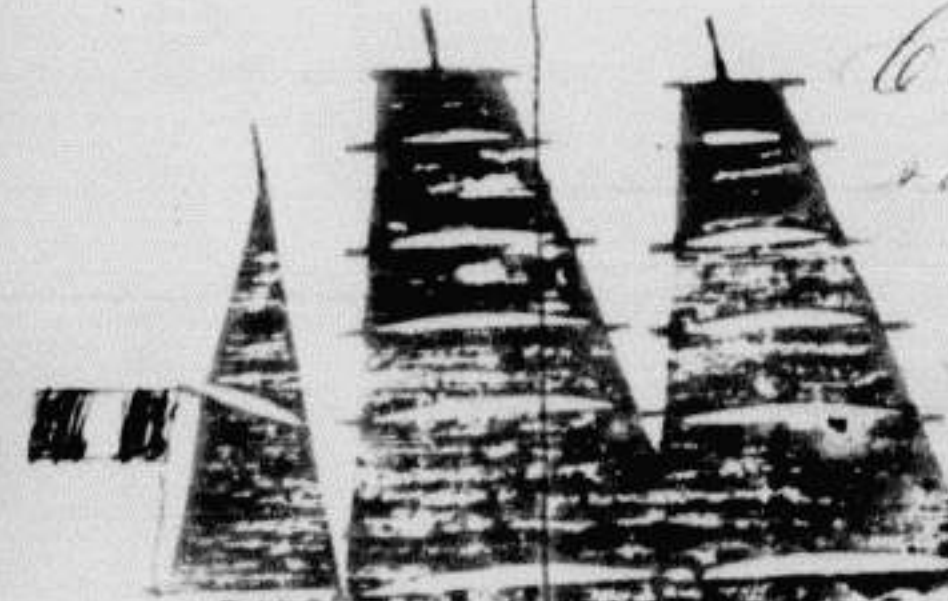
Brig Kate Cory bound South

Remarks on board Saturday November the 16th 1861

Commenced with squally and rainy weather at two o'clock lighted up a little made sail and stood on to the southward and westward at sundown had light breezes had it squally most of the night at day light set the jib and mainsail back out forehead. Latter part light breezes two sails in sight. So ends. Lat 61° 15' N Long 21° 09' W.

Remarks on board Sunday November the 17th 1861


Commenced with light breezes from south south east and fair weather at seven o'clock. P.M. set all sail and anchor. The wind from the eastward steering south by west had fair weather through the night. Latter part fine breezes saw a fresh bark to the eastward. So ends. Latitude 51° 35' N Long 21° 04' W.

Remarks on board Monday November the 18th 1861


Commenced with fine breezes from south south east and fair weather heading south west by the wind saw black fish had strong breezes through the night. Latter part strong breezes heading west south west by the wind. One sail in sight. So ends. Lat 41° 44' N Long 21° 25' W.

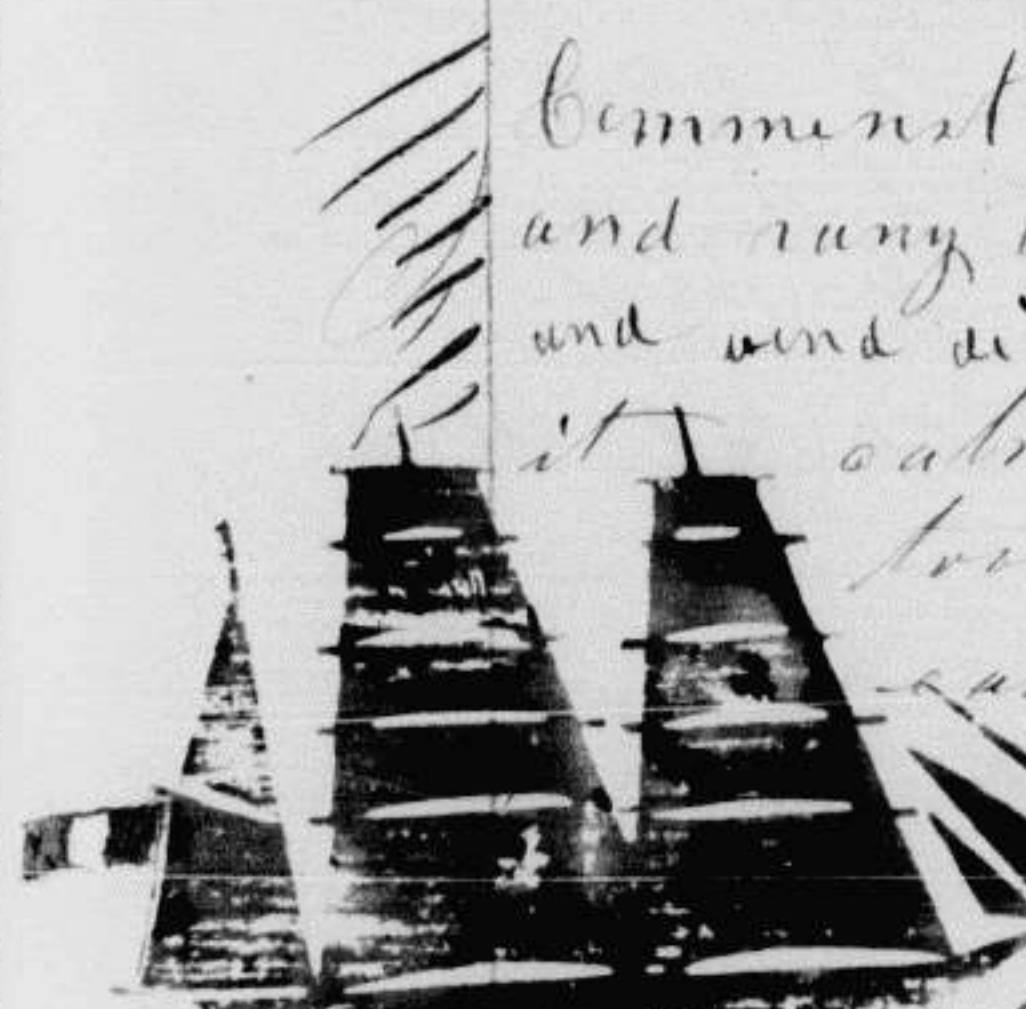
Remarks on board Tuesday November the 19th 1861


Commenced with strong breezes from the south and raged with S.W. fine at two o'clock the wind died away. Latter part a fresh breeze to the eastward saw a sailing bark to the westward heading to the eastward had light

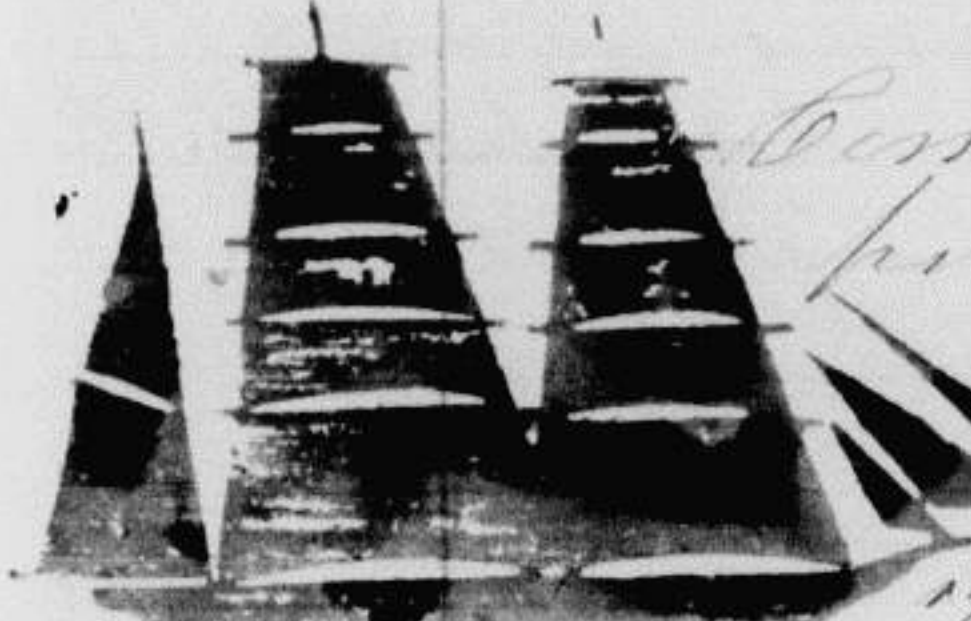
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Brig Kate Cory bound South

Breaves through the night at ten o'clock. At 11 had a heavy squall from the eastward were ship and steered south by west latter part rainy. So ends no latitude.

Remarks on board Wednesday November the 20th 1861


Commenced with strong breezes from the eastward and rainy and raged with at two o'clock P.M. cleared off and wind died away saw two sails to the eastward had it calm most of the night at daylight took a fresh breeze from the eastward steering south south east. Latter part fine breezes. So ends. Lat 41° 00' N Long 21° 10' W.

Remarks on board Thursday November the 21st 1861


Commenced with fresh breezes from east south east and fair weather. I made the topgallant sail. Latter part of the night set all sail had fine breezes from south east. Latter part fresh breezes heading south south west by the wind. So ends. Lat 31° 44' N.

Remarks on board Friday November the 22nd 1861


Commenced with fresh breezes from south east and fair weather the watch employed in ordinary ship's duties had fine breezes through the night at daylight made out for water and as new fresh breezes past fine breezes steering south west by the wind. So ends. Latitude 00° 49' N Long 22° 07' W.
