Comment with fresh breezes from east north east and rugged weather saw a Brig steering to the southward and eastward at six o'clock P.M. took in the mainsail had fine breeze thru the night latter part fine breeze steering south west No ends Lat 19.38.5 S Long 30.14 W



Remarks on board Monday December the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1861

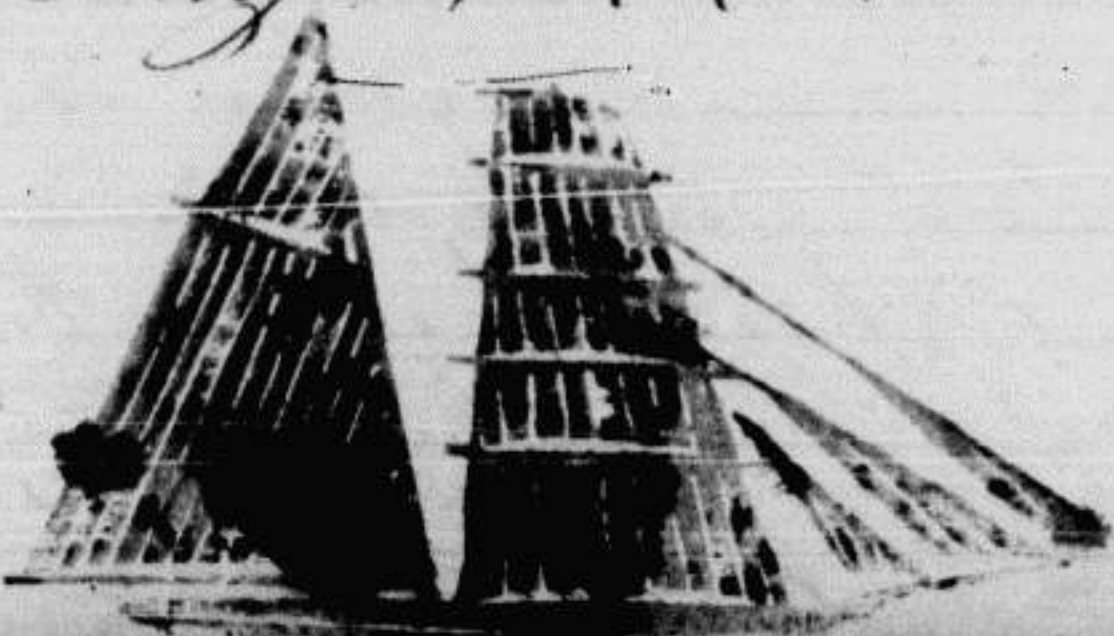
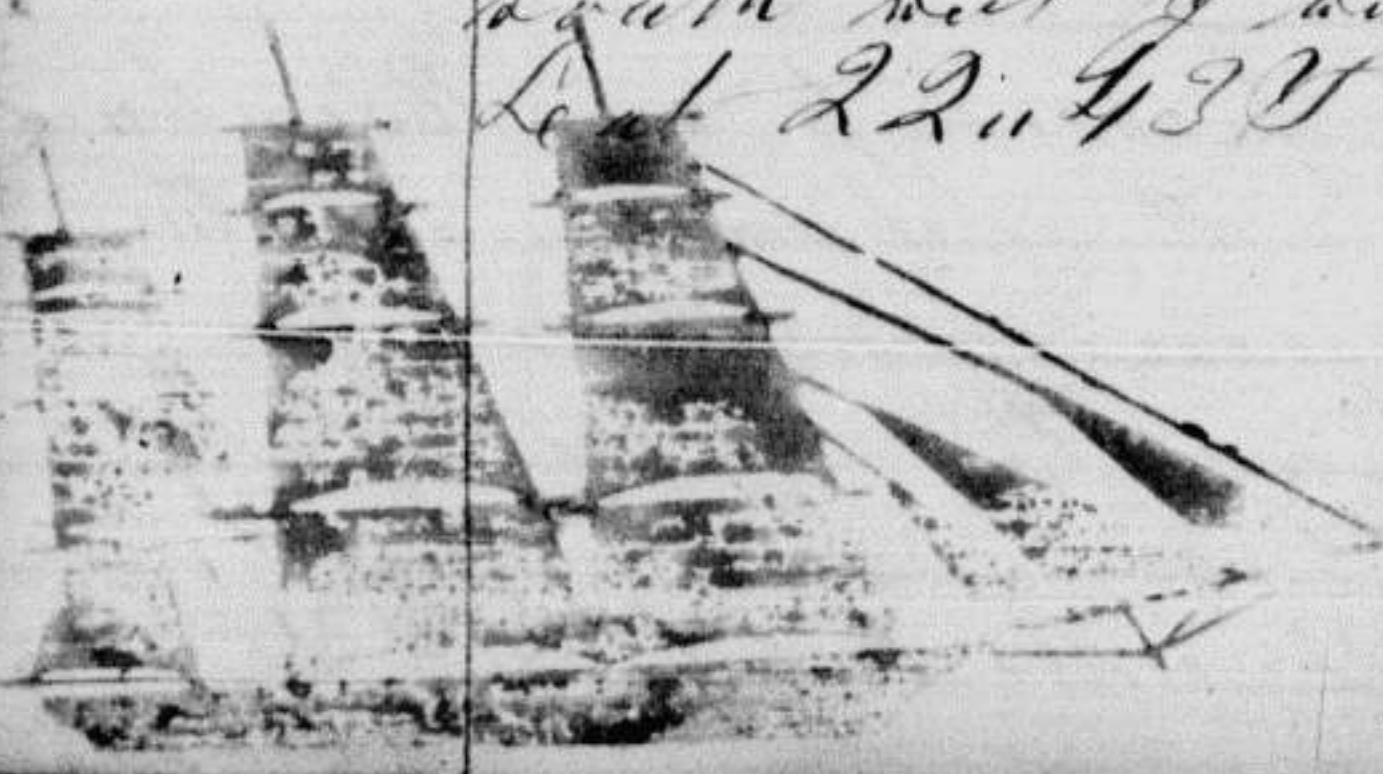
Comment with fine breeze from north east and fair weather nothing going on had fine breeze thru the night latter part light breeze steering south west No ends Lat 22.00.00 S Long 31.21 W

Remarks on board Tuesday December the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1861

Comment with light breezes from north east and fair weather the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty had fine breeze thru the night at daylight heaved for water and provisions latter part fine breeze steering south west nothing in sight No ends Lat 21.43.3 S Long 32.45 W

Remarks on board Wednesday December the 4<sup>th</sup> 1861

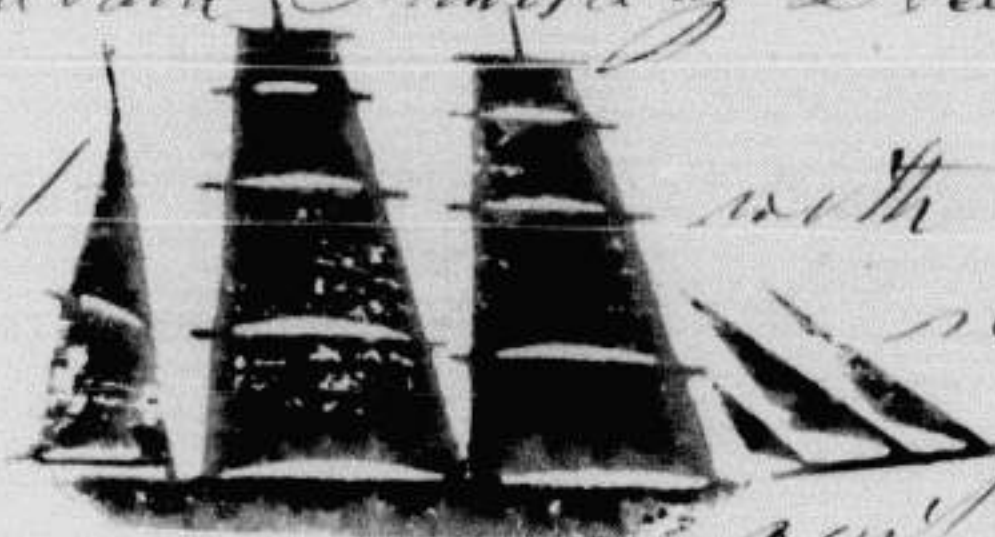
Comment with fine breeze from north east and fair weather the watch employed in ordinary ship's duty had fine breezes thru the night latter part strong breeze steering south west by west to south in sight No ends Lat 22.43.5 S Long 34.22 W

Remarks on board Thursday December the 5<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with strong breezes from north east and rugged weather at sundown took in the sails and hove to the wind to the westward at boats crew watch had it rang thru the night at nine o'clock P.M. the Enk Malvern of Schutt spoke as bound to Buenos Ayres latter part thick and rangy weather No ends



Remarks on board Friday December the 6<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with moderate breezes from the northward and thick and rangy weather heading out south west by the wind had it thick and rangy thru the night at daylight lighted up some of the foremast and foretopmast latter part fresh breeze and thick weather heading south south west plenty of birds in sight No ends Lat



Remarks on board Saturday December the 7<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with fresh breezes from south east and thick and rugged weather at two o'clock P.M. comment raining banded the foremast at sundown took in the foremast still raining latter part of the night lighted up some at daylight made sail and steered south west saw grasshopper latter part light breezes nothing in sight No ends no lat

Remarks on board Sunday December the 8<sup>th</sup> 1861

Comment with light breezes from the eastward and thick steady weather at sundown took in sail heading
