P.M. got the whale boiled out at sundown the wind died away and commenced raining latter part of the night cleared off at daylight broke out again stroke down the net got three - about twelve sealskin latter part fresh breeze So ends Lat 25° 24' S Long 34° 30' W

Remarks on board Sunday December the 22nd 1861

Commenced with fresh breeze from the northward and fair weather got the stern boat set for a sea boat at sundown took in the foresail and topsail had the wind from south west heading east north east had it vary much of the night latter part cleared off some heading to the westward So ends Lat 25° 20' S Long 34° 35' W

Remarks on board Monday December the 23rd 1861

Commenced with moderate breeze from south east and fair weather heading north west by the wind had it squally and rainy threw the night at daylight set the foresail and topsail at five o'clock at 6 o'clock commenced raining latter part fresh breeze wind vary with breeze south west So ends in Latitude

Remarks on board Tuesday December the 24th 1861

Commenced with fresh breeze from south east and aged and rainy weather took in the foresail and topsail at sundown blowing a gail going two heading south blowed strong threw the night at five o'clock the wind shifted to the northward latter part blowing a gail stood no mast heads So ends in Latitude

Remarks on board Wednesday December the 25th 1861

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Brig Kate Cory Cruising

Commenced with a gail of wind from the eastward and then and aged with no one to point head at sundown still blowing strong heading north by gail latter part of the night had it more moderate at daylight set the foresail latter part strong breeze nothing in sight heading to the northward So ends Lat 25° 36' S Long 35° 30' W

Remarks on board Thursday December the 26th 1861

Commenced with strong breeze from the eastward and aged with at five o'clock P.M. spoke the Bark Canadian of Providence at sundown one ship to the southward and another had strong breeze threw the night at daylight set the foresail at nine o'clock at 10 o'clock spoke to the southward latter part strong breeze So ends Lat 25° 59' S Long 35° 45' W



Remarks on board Friday December the 27th 1861

Commenced with fresh breeze from the eastward and aged with at four o'clock P.M. spoke the Canadian and gained with her at sundown parties company took in sail heading north by the wind of had strong breeze threw the night at daylight set the foresail at five o'clock spoke the Canadian of the bark latter part strong breeze So ends Latitude 25° 15' S Long 35° 39' W
