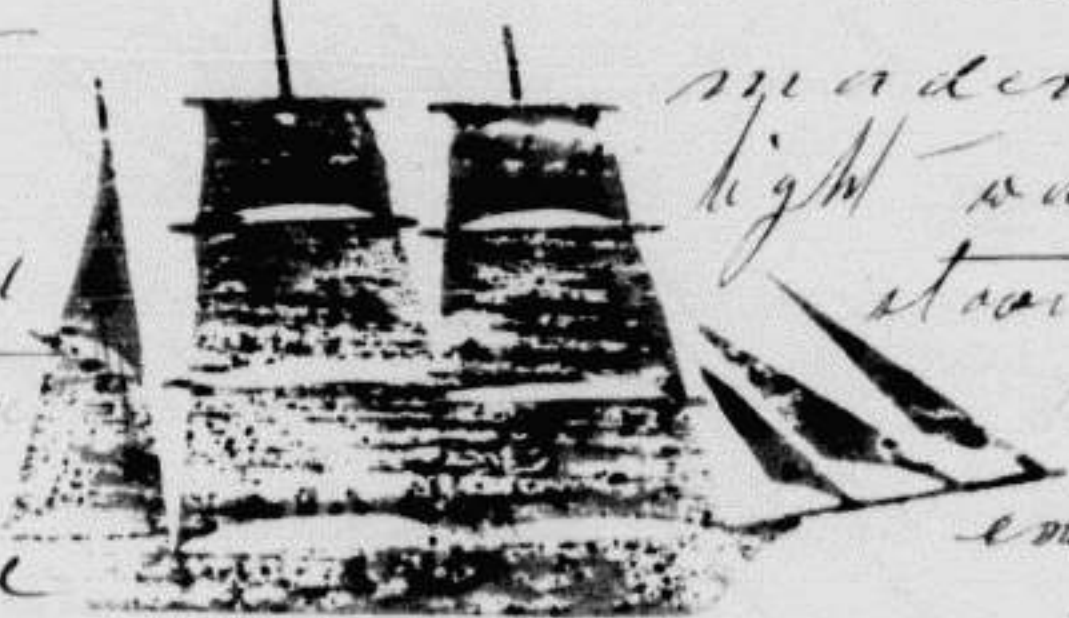


Brig Kate Cory Cruising
 Colours P the wind shifted round suddenly
 to west and blew strong at sundown had it
 more moderate being too heading north north west
 had it strong through the night at daylight
 ahead of the forecast and top sail at
 eight o'clock the command steering down latter
 part light breeze to end at 25-210

Remarks on board Thursday January the 12th 1862

Commenced with light breeze from the
 southward and fair weather at sundown
 got most of the ice below and needed of
 sails had it moderate then
 the night at day light breeze from the
 eastward finished steering off saw a
 sail to the northward. Latter part of
 fine breeze to end at 25-07
 Long 34.58 W



Remarks on board Friday January the 10th 1862

Commenced with fine breeze from the southward and
 good weather the watch employed in ordinary duty
 at sundown took in sail heading east by the wind
 at nine o'clock the sail shifted to the southward
 at daylight made sail and stood on
 saw two fish (latter part) fine breeze backed
 ship to the northward to end at 25-39.5
 Long 34.51 W



Remarks on board Saturday January the 11th 1862

Commenced with fine breeze from south east and good
 weather the watch employed in ordinary duty
 at sundown took in sail and hauled aback heading to
 the southward had it moderate then the night
 at daylight made sail and set off west south
 west latter part light breeze nothing in
 sight to end at 25-13.5
 Long 35.01 W

 Remarks on Board Sunday January the 12th 1862

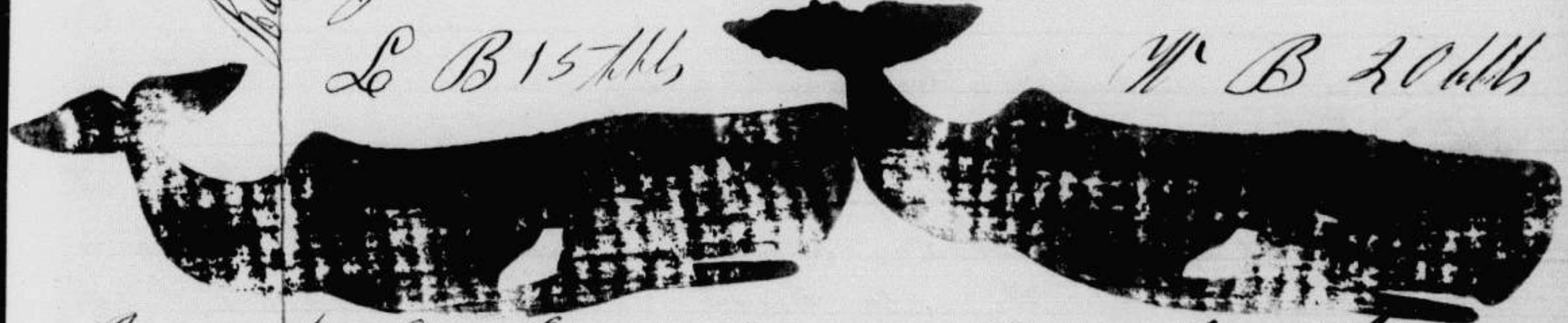
Commenced with light breeze from the eastward
 and good other sail round and stood north north west
 at half past six o'clock the sail saw a breeze ahead some
 faster miles off at sundown took in sail and
 left to the wind heading north east by north
 had fresh breeze through the night at daylight
 the wind to the southward latter part fresh breeze
 to end at 26-00

Remarks on Board Monday January the 13th 1862

Commenced with fresh breeze from the eastward
 and fair weather heading south by east by the
 wind had it strong at sundown the sail round to
 the northward and long black show the night
 at nine o'clock the sail raised from W by N
 around the ship bearing hard and then
 within board the boats and the Leeward and
 Fair boats got fast to the Part thick and
 bang within took the Leeward boats while
 along side to end at 26-00

Remarks on Board Tuesday January the 14th 1862

Commenced with fresh breeze from the
 northward and thick and rainy weather
 at one o'clock the watch took the
 other shore to the ship got the whole flapped
 and needed of concluded not to set
 making for better weather at sundown still
 raining hard had it strong through the night
 and blowing strong at daylight ahead
 of some to raised to sail latter part had
 it more moderate to end at 25-19.5
