

Brig Kate Gay Crasning

Remarks on board Wednesday January the 15th 1862

Commenced with strong breezes from the northward
and raged wither backed on and commenced
cutting at six o'clock P.M. the whaler in
all but one head it being too raged to take
that in at nine o'clock P.M. started the
works further part of the night. Made on to a gail at
seven o'clock took in the foremast wither
blowing a gail and very much blowing wither west
by - North. Some East 25 to 30 S. Lecky Sea 11 M

Remains as before Thursday January the 16th 1862

beginning with a good breeze north west and
raged within the men employed taking care
of the whales at seven o'clock P.M. could have
it being so ragged to bid with safety cut away a
tainted fine barrel whaler, head fine along side
and round to the eastward rather part of the
night - had it more moderate at seven o'clock
P.M. started the whalers again rather part fine
breeze to ends boiling East 25-36 N. Leeway 35-40

Remarks on board Friday January the 17th 1862.

Comment with fine leaves from north east and
fair within stove down three o'clock of oil at seven
o'clock P M got three boiling one pound to the
part round latter part of the night comment
to rain had the wind from the southward latter
part thick and rainy within 5 or 6 ends heading
east by the wind P M Seal

Remarks on board Saturday Evening the 15th 1862

Comment with light breezes from the southwest
and very little clear down the remainder of the
oil at sundown took in the forenoon
led it thick and runy half of the
night clear off but daylight made

Big Kate very promising (10)

Trail and stood to the north west. At ten
slept at the Buck Canyon of Pinnaclean
slope as and gamed with us. After put fire
beaver. Good. Leaf 25-22 1/2 Long 35-40

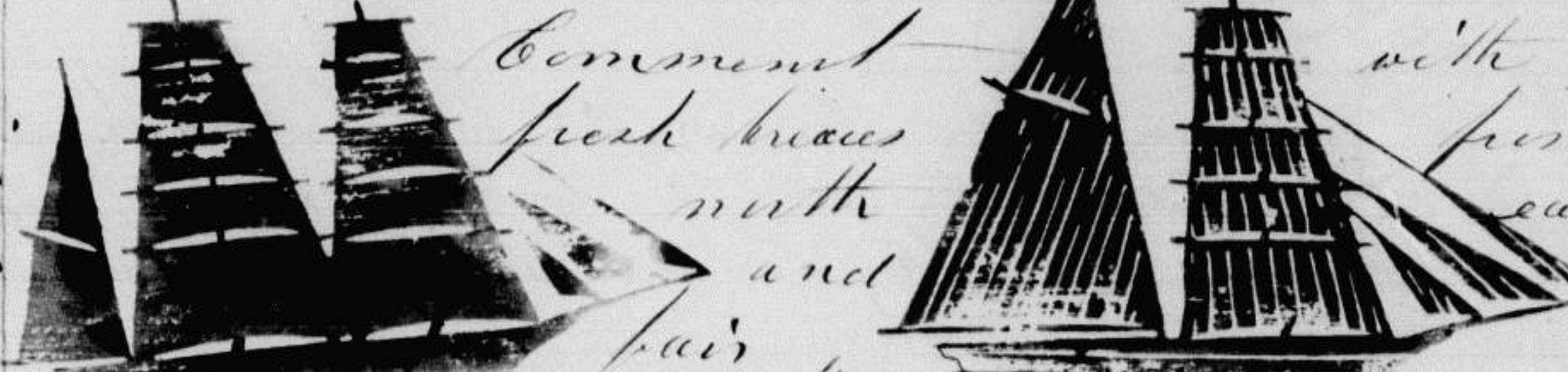
Remarks on board Sunday January the 19th 1862

Borns seen with light beacons from the north side
 and good weather at sundown parties camping
 with the Cavilians took in sail heading north
 west by north had moderate beacons through
 the night at seven o'clock the
 one ship to the eastward latter
 part fine weather one sail in
 sight the end
 Long 34 46 W Cavilians
 Lat 24 54 N

Remarks on board Monday January the 20th 1862

Commenced with fine breeze from east north east
and good other heading east south east had it
moderate then the night at day light
made sail and stood on to the S.W. way
saw a big off the sea bears steering to the
northward latter part fresh breeze nothing
in sight. Ends Lat 25 23. Longitude 44 46.

Remarks on board Tuesday January the 21st 1862

 heading still about east at ten o'clock
 we kept to the northward and westward & may
 light made sail ungl. stood on and to ship
