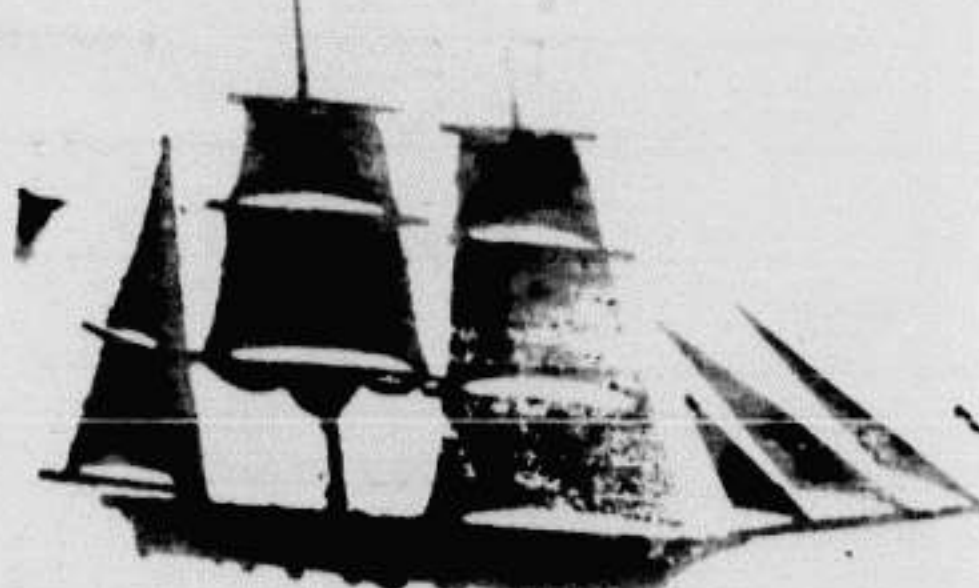
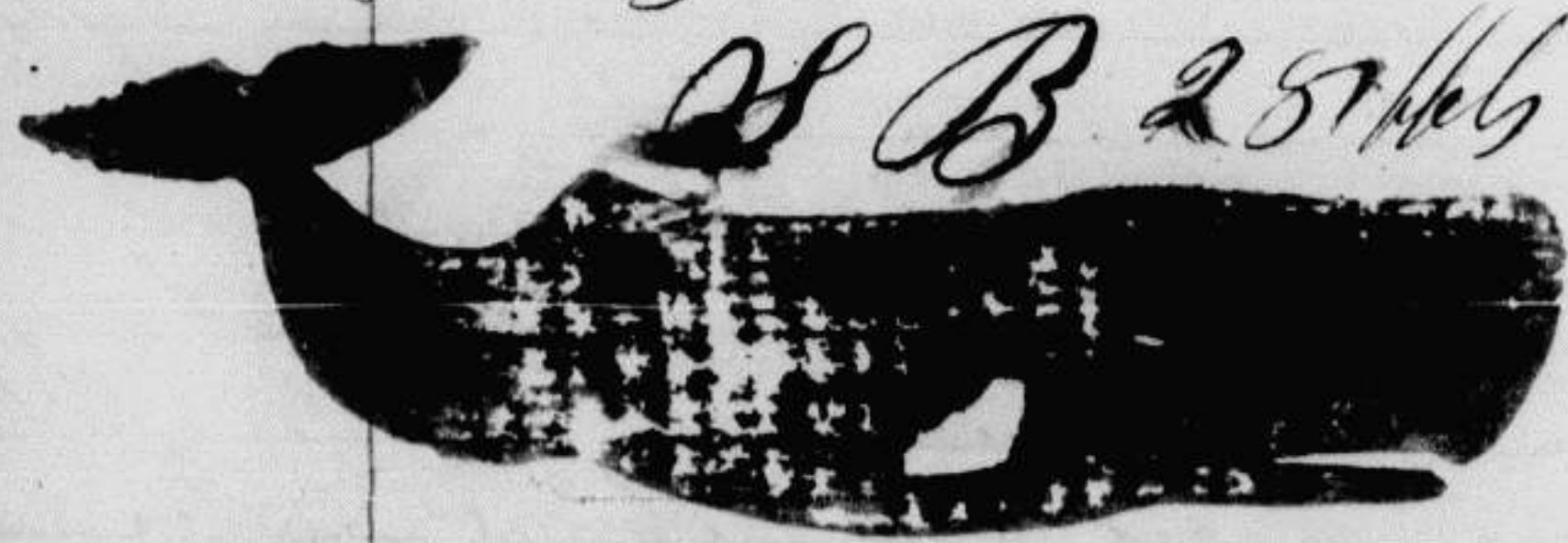
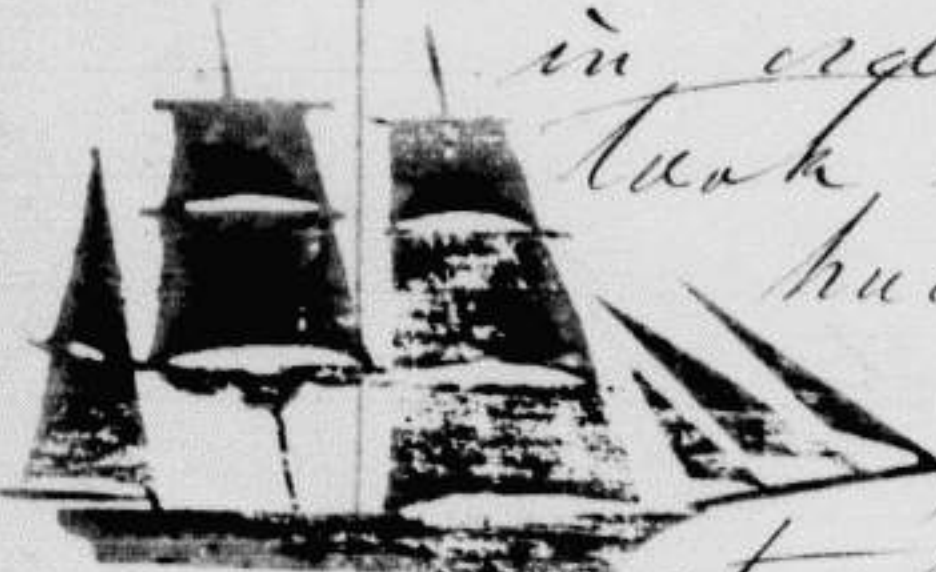
Remarks on board Wednesday January the 22nd 1862

Commenced with fine breeze from north north east and watch employed in ordinary ship duty at sundown took to the eastward with light breeze from the night at daylight made sail again and out for water the first light breeze saw the Bark Christian to the windward so ends
Lat 25° 11' S Long 34° 44' W



Remarks on board Thursday January the 23rd 1862

Commenced with light breeze from north east and good weather the watch employed in ordinary ship duty at sundown took in sail heading to the eastward had it calm until 10 of the night at 11 light raised 1/2 m. 1/2 m. six miles to the windward got to breakfast and leave away the boat and kept until eleven o'clock when the boat got stuck in getting out and the forward boat struck soon after the port boat line parted and the starboard boat got stove all to pieces by a whales raring threw her the forward boat picked up the boat crew and the rear boat struck the whale picked up the crew and cars and shooting gun and re-fresh so ends saw the bark Christian chasing whale



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Remarks on board Friday January the 24th 1862

Commenced with light air from the seaward and good weather headed on to the whale range for the Brig at half past three o'clock got the whale along side got dinner and commenced sailing at seven o'clock at the whale cut in at eight o'clock at the water had it calm at ten o'clock commenced boiling latter part of the night got on light breeze at day light made sail and steamed to the westward latter part light breeze so ends boiling no Lat

Remarks on board Saturday January the 25th 1862

Commenced with light light breeze from the eastward and good weather the watch employed taking care of the oil saw a sail to the seaward at sundown took in sail headed the fore & span't within looked squally heading north north east by the wind had 1/2 m. good weather 1/2 m. the night at nine o'clock got the fore & span't within light breeze so ends
Lat 25° 00' S Long 34° 35' W

Remarks on board Sunday January the 26th 1862

Commenced with light breeze from north east and thick weather saw the Bark Christian and a Merchant Bark at three o'clock commenced sailing at sundown took in sail headed the fore & span't within looked squally heading north north east by the wind had 1/2 m. good weather 1/2 m. the night at nine o'clock got the fore & span't within light breeze so ends
Lat 25° 00' S Long 34° 35' W
