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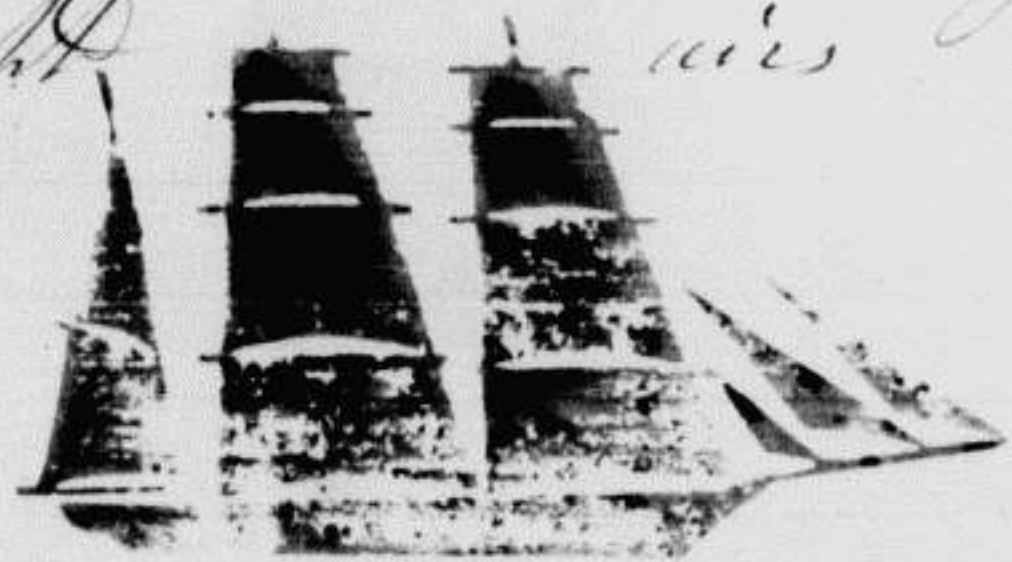
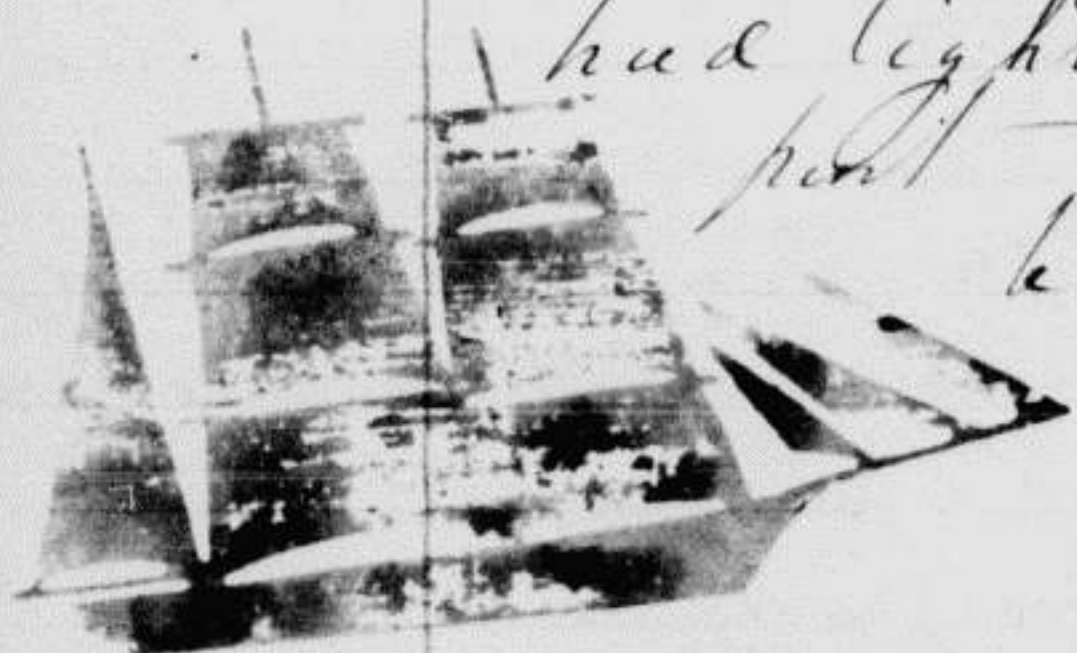

Commenced with light breezes from the northward and fair within a few miles raised shales again to get the boats and the said boat got fast again got the whale turned up and took him along side about nine o'clock P.M. took in sail and light breezes till the night set in daylight coming outing at eleven o'clock A.M. got one whale in latter part light breezes & so ends

Remarks on board Saturday February the 1st 1862

Commenced with light breezes from the northward and good within sighted the works at five o'clock P.M. got the other whale in just cleared away the heaves at seven o'clock got the whale and to parts had light breezes then the night latter part light breezes & so ends

Remarks on board Sunday February the 2nd 1862

Commenced with light air from south east and thick within a few miles then clearing away heading to the eastward had fair within three miles the night latter part squally & so ends

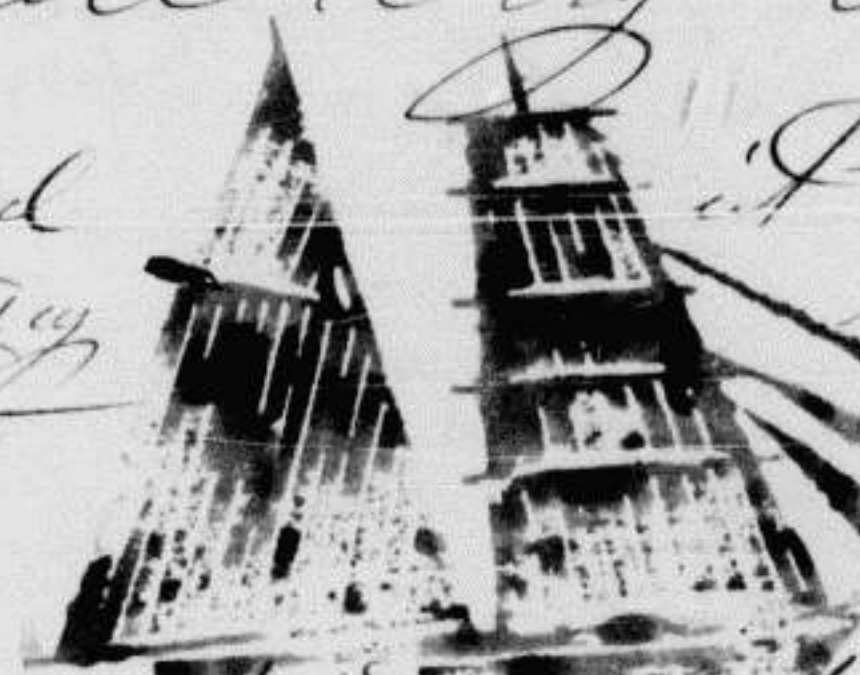
Remarks on board Monday February the 3rd 1862

Commenced with fresh breezes from the eastward and squally within a few miles in the forenoon at seven o'clock P.M. boated down it raining to hard to sail with safety and a sail to the

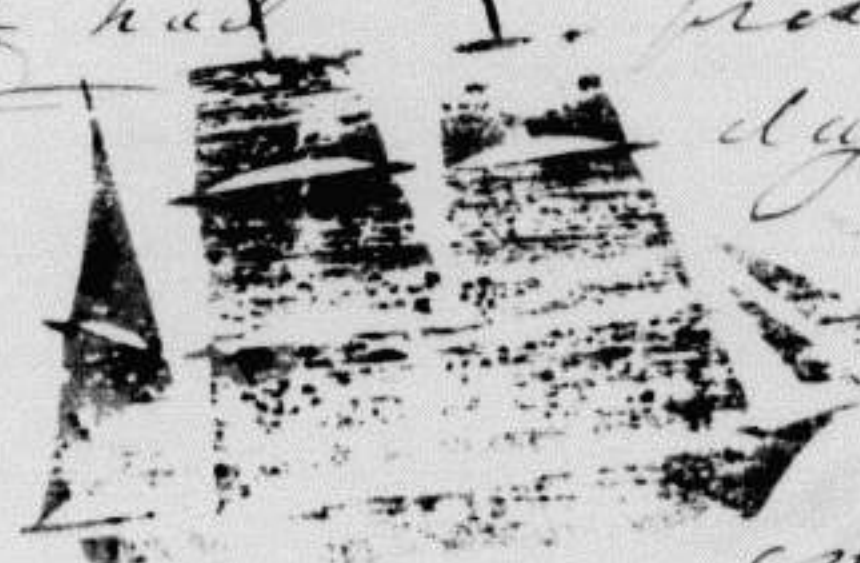
Windward had the night at day off started the Muggin and staying down light breezes got three boiling & so ends

Commenced with light breezes from north east and squally within a few miles heading to the eastward had fine breezes from the night at day light coming clearing down again saw a sail to the windward at twelve o'clock A.M. got one whale in & so ends Lat 25-24 S

Remarks on board Wednesday February the 5th 1862

Commenced with fresh breezes from north east and fair within a few miles the watch employed working off the ship at sundown saw a ship to the windward had 1. fresh breezes then the night at day light one ship to the northward and westward saw to parts latter part strong breezes & so ends

Commenced with strong breezes from north east and squally within a few miles the watch employed working off the ship at sundown saw a ship to the windward had 1. fresh breezes then the night at day light one ship to the northward and westward saw to parts latter part strong breezes & so ends
