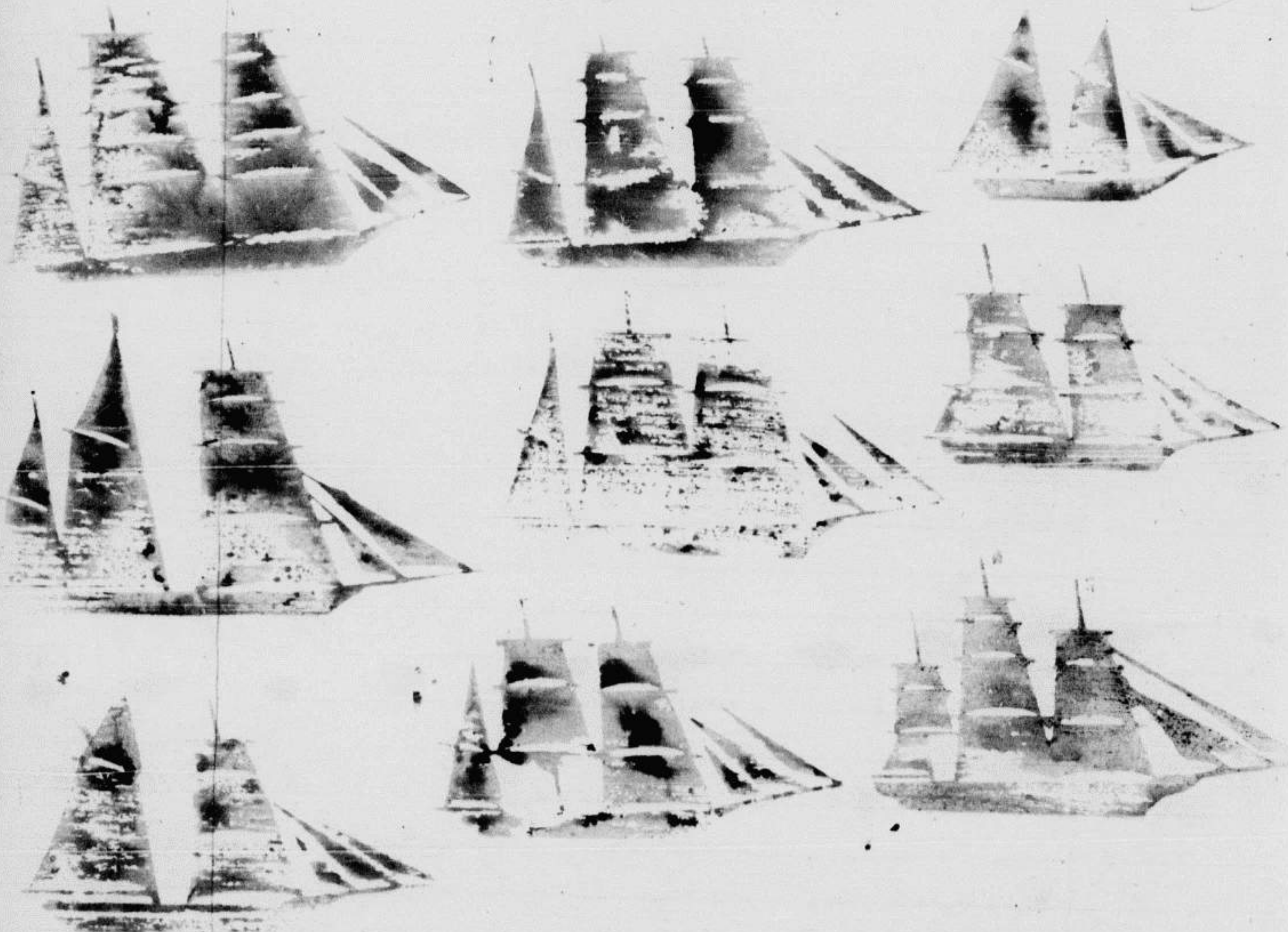

employed painting ship at three

employed painting the keelways at sundown
part of the gale came on board with
good weather then the night at
dawn with the remainder of the

watch on shore latter part good with

Commenced with good weather and ship
came in had good weather then the night
at daylight commenced raining up the night
around good latter part
good with So on at Barbadoes

dawn got some potatoes on board
