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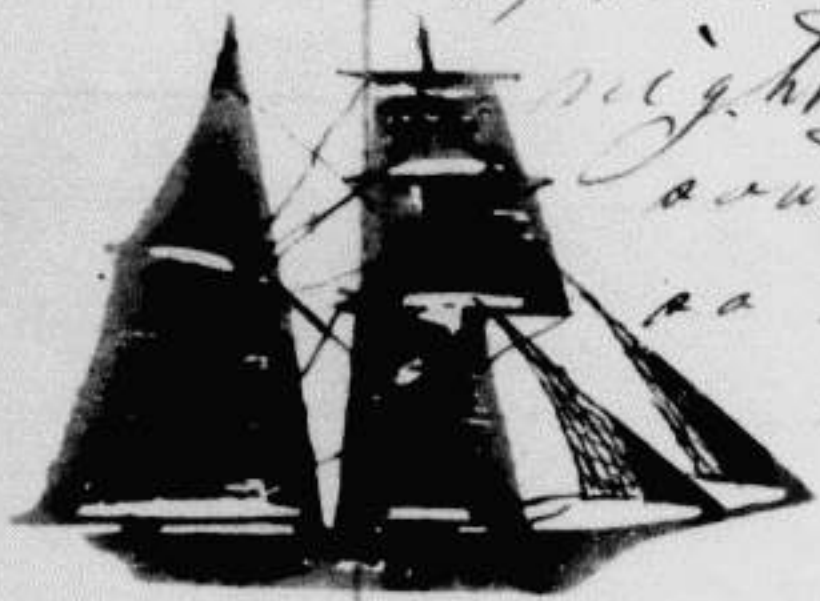

Remarks on board Tuesday April the 5th 1862

Commenced with fresh breezes from north east and raised within at four o'clock P.M. took in the light sail, blow in strong later part of the night had it more moderate set all sail again later part fine breezes from the southward steering north north west one sail in sight So ended latitude 26° 00' longitude 70° 30'

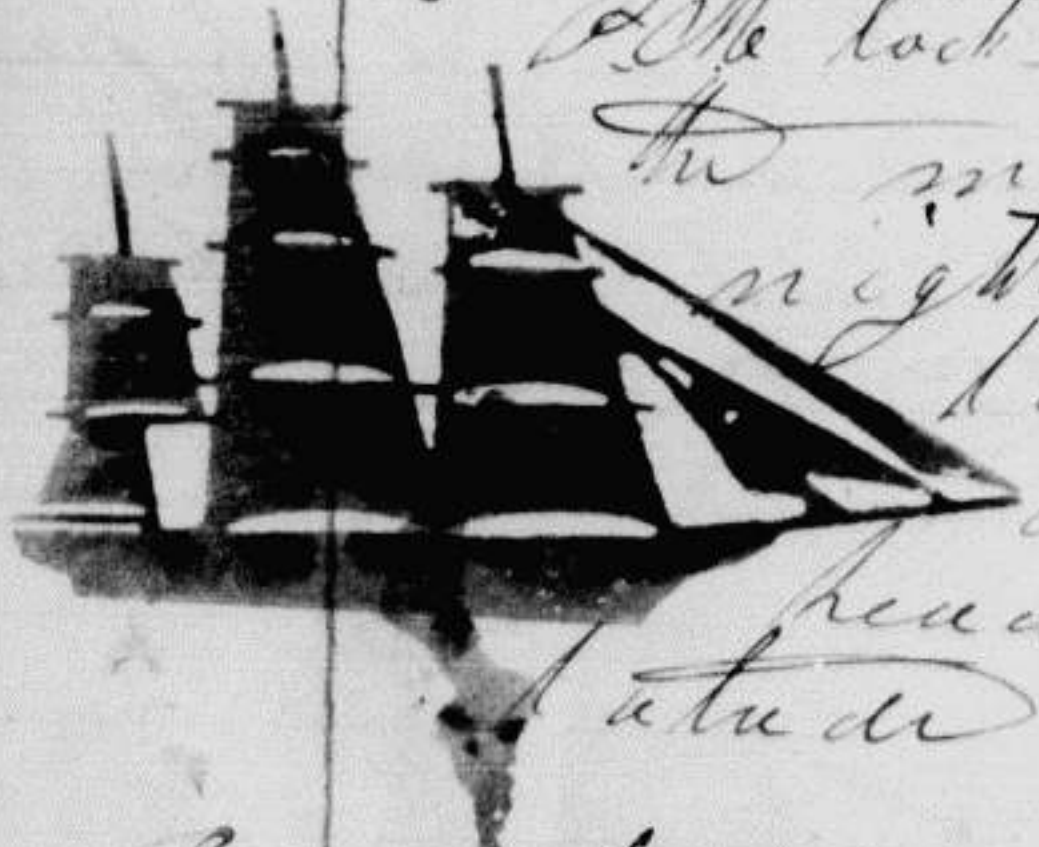
Remarks on board Wednesday April the 6th 1862

Commenced with fine breezes from the southward and good within kept a new foresail and fore topmast staysail had fresh breezes from the north east called the men down from aloft so ended steering north north east latitude 28° 28' longitude 71° 57'



Remarks on board Thursday April the 10th 1862

Commenced with strong breezes from southward and raised within took in the fore topmast and mainmast staysails at sundown hauled down the hatches at eight o'clock. We took in the fore topmast staysail in the night blowing strong shortened sail later part the wind hauled round north west and blew on strong heading north by east So ended latitude 31° 22' longitude 72° 14'



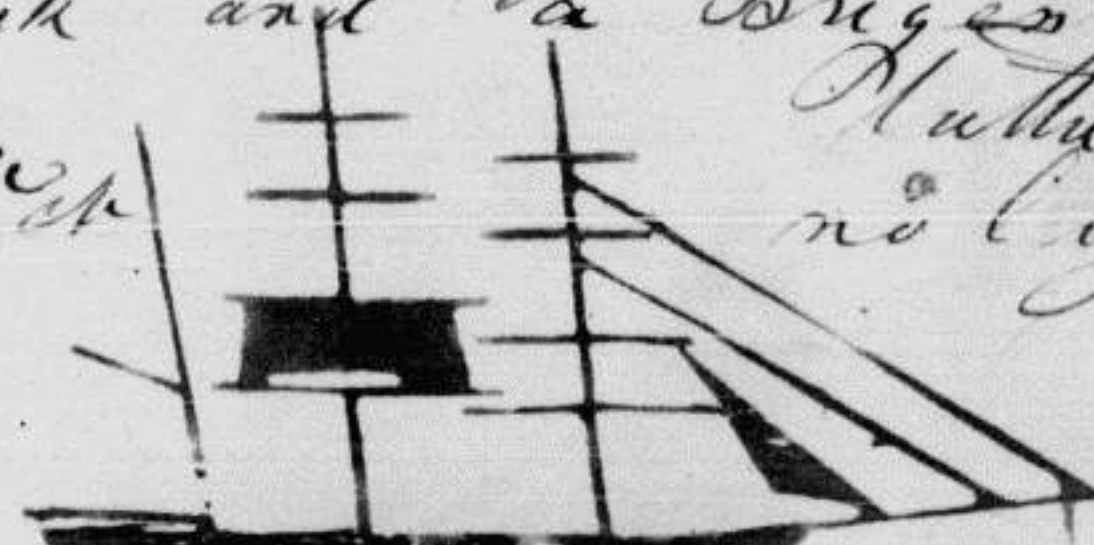
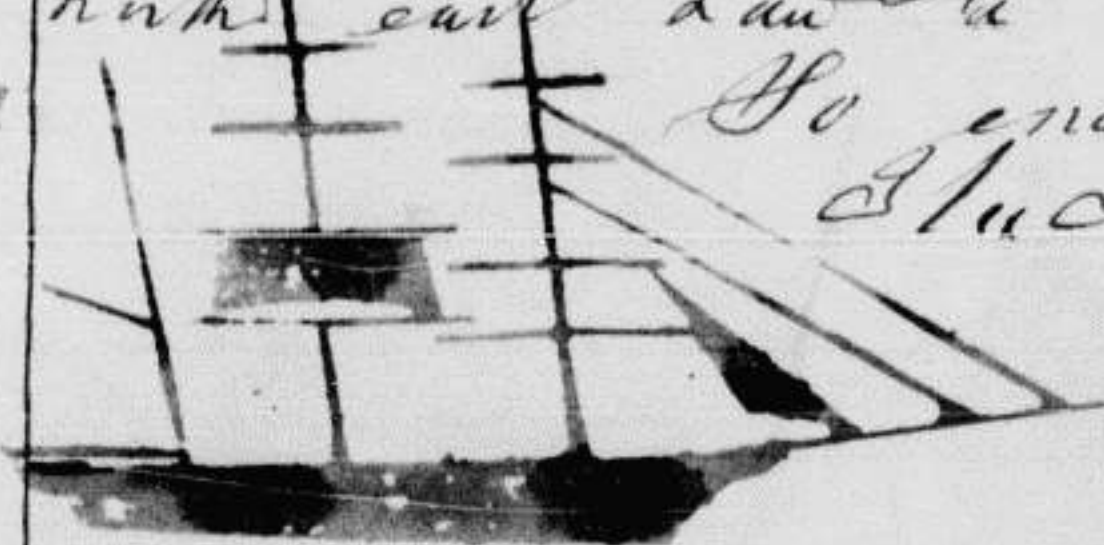
Remarks on board Friday April the 11th 1862

Commenced with fresh gale from north west and raised and squared within took in the foresail and fore topmast staysail at sundown

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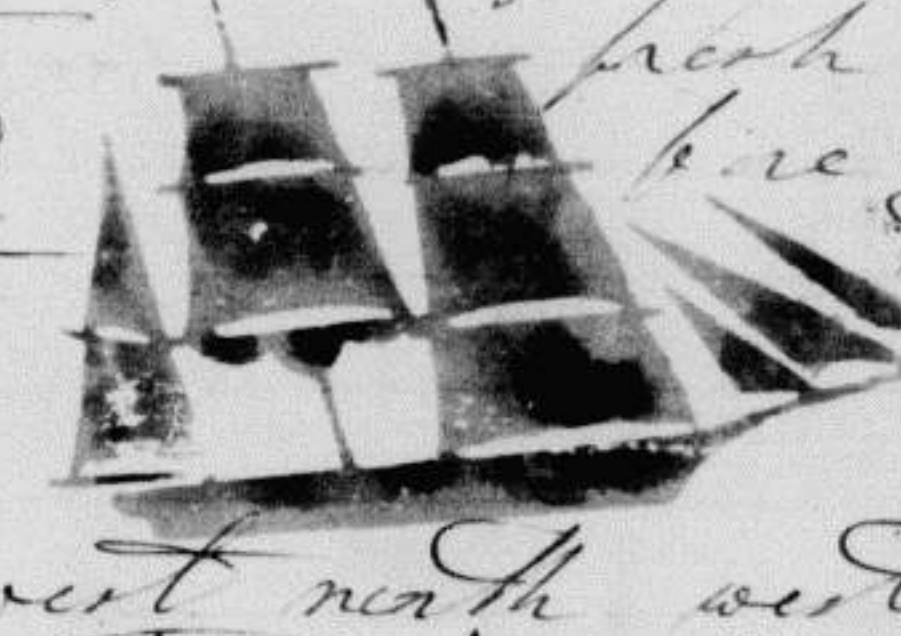

Redd the main topmast blowing a strong gale and a bad sea going middle and latter part strong gale, laying the heading north east and to back and to Bigger than latitude no length



Remarks on board Saturday April the 12th 1862

Commenced with fresh gale from the northward and raised within at three o'clock were ship to the southward and set the foresail and a short reefed fore topmast staysail blowing strong at seven P.M. took in the fore topmast staysail had fresh gale from the north east later part fresh gale set the fore topmast staysail so ended heading west north west latitude 34° 35' longitude 72° 28'



Remarks on board Sunday April the 13th 1862

Commenced with fresh gale from the northward and raised within at sundown had thick weather and blowing strong later part of the night had it more moderate at daylight turned a reef got of the fore topmast staysail at ten o'clock. We set the gill and mainmast later part more moderate set all sail so to gale So ended steering north west by south to the wind latitude 32° 11' longitude 73° 35'
