 Spring-like said some folks to day took a draft of Mr. Ballard for the amt
 Maria is to have school cloudy and stormy during the afternoon and evening
 went to Uncle Ephraim's in the evening and while they went to a party at Mrs.
 Marree's then went into Alfred Kimpton's store and staid till 10 o'clock
 came home then read the Journal and went to bed 11 o'clock raining at
 this time rain during the night wind S. E.

Friday - 10th

Rainy wind S. East - cool
 stormy cloudy and rainy during the forenoon nothing has taken place
 it has been raining all day in the evening went to the concert given
 by Halberg, was very well pleased saw Mr. H. did not speak to him
 went into the club room after the concert was done and staid till 11 o'clock
 11 o'clock was quite wet at this time staid at 11 o'clock

Saturday - 11th

Splendid morning beautiful and Spring-like wind S. West and it is balmy
 and delightful Maria, Nelson and E. Linnell were in day a late but night
 pleasant during the day and very pleasant this evening went to the
 club room and staid till 10 o'clock came home at that hour moon
 shining brightly not a cloud in the sky staid 11 o'clock -
 left 12 o'clock and staid at club room when we came away

Monday April 12th 1857

Wind S. East, quite clear this morning, very mild the air very beautiful
 rose 7 o'clock at 10 o'clock stormy an April day it is went to church listened
 to a very good discourse from Mr. Hiss went to staid in the afternoon
 Nelson and R. B. were there was put on the canvas for the first time
 to amount to anything. Went to bed in the evening at 10 o'clock and
 camp a party at 10 o'clock before 11 o'clock rain during the evening

Tuesday 13th

Wind S. West - cloudy
 cool wind received a letter from my sister Maria to day nothing has taken
 place this forenoon nothing of note wind S. East at 1 o'clock felt we are trying to
 do all we have to do and I hope we shall do it well. Went to Uncle Ephraim's
 to night left at 9 o'clock came down on Purchase Street that Mrs.
 I think with Mrs. Baker will not say all right. Staid at the club
 room I shall not go again probably at present so "good bye" also
 club room and S. East at this time 10 o'clock cloudy and cool
 retired at 10 o'clock met Maria & B. at club room read in
 Tuesday 14th 1857 (many graphs) till 4 o'clock

Wind S. East and cold and cloudy continued so
 all the forenoon and probably will all the afternoon broken to day
 to L. and put it in the hot office rainy during the afternoon
 in the evening it does not rain wind West blows hard
 called on Mrs. R. but did not stop but a little while made
 arrangements to go to Sister Levi's B. in evening came home before
 9 o'clock and found my watch all right then went up town
 for a little while brought a Cucumber and came home at 8 o'clock
 came up to my room read the Journal and at
 this hour 10 o'clock writing in this Book Friend Bitter is
 at a party in Purchase to night I shall go to bed
 soon it is starlight at this time wind West cool
