

16 warm weather yet this season it is cold enough to day for a great coat

I now mine this morning in the north room it is really cold today in the evening went to Mr Co. stand till 10 o'clock came home and went to bed Monday 18th 1857
Cool and a little cloudy - nothing unusual occurred to day in the evening at home at 9 o'clock

Tuesday 19th
Cloudy wind & East cool look as it does in the winter when we are going to have snow rain in the evening stand at home return 10 o'clock -

Wednesday 20th
Raining wind & East clouds cold and uncomfortable rain all day - wind & East at 6 o'clock Bell at Hanes & the end

Thursday 21st
Storm continues wind & East in the evening at Hanes

Friday 22nd
Clear fine - wind not pleasant in the evening at Hanes

Saturday 23rd
Cool wind & West - gave a bill to Mr Howard of bed side but I sometimes think I sell too cheaply I think "spare bed will drop a little but I think handsome as will bring 60 or 70 anytime I think by next Dec it will bring 80-90 - any by March 85 - sent to Hanes in evening at 11 o'clock

Sunday 24th
Rose at 7 o'clock beautiful morning did not go to church this morning very fine day every thing went right and I returned at 11 o'clock

Monday 25th
Fair and beautiful in the evening sent to Hanes - Beattie & Joshua Hetch came in at 9 o'clock

Tuesday 26th
Cool beautiful wind and calm Mrs Cho. to ride had a very pleasant ride and time return for the note at 5 o'clock sent 2 o'clock Bell - in the evening sent to Hanes

Wednesday 27th
Foggy wind & West the Guards were out and made a very fine appearance in the evening sent to Hanes Beattie & Joshua Hetch were there

Thursday 28th
Wind & East Rainy cloudy much and sunny all day sent to Hanes & Joshua Hetch in the evening returned at 11 o'clock

Friday 29th
Foggy wind southerly sent out to ride Hanes and myself foggy somewhat returned at 8 o'clock sent to Hanes in the evening

Saturday 30th
Clear wind westerly not a very warm air in the evening sent to Beattie counting Room came home at 10 o'clock read in the news of 8 Peapody till 11 o'clock returned

Sunday 31st
Went to meeting heard Mr Church sent to Mrs White in the evening

Monday June 1st 1857

Rainy and cloudy quite a tempest last night wind southerly clear in the evening no it was rainy went to Mrs R. on W Street stand till 10 o'clock

Tuesday 2nd
Rainy and foggy in the morning cleared at 12 m in the afternoon the Circus exhibited in the evening I went up to the ground came home at 9 o'clock

Wednesday 3rd
Clear this morning in the afternoon I went to ride with Capt. Gifford the Savings Bank discounted a note for us which was very agreeable to us went to Mrs Wilcox's this evening met Mrs Parsons returned at 11 o'clock and related quite clear and moonlight

Thursday 4th
Clear wind westerly and very fine not a cloud to be seen in the evening sent to R. Beattie counting Room and then sent to Mr Hanes returned 11 o'clock

Friday 5th
Clear & cloudy in the evening sent to Alfred Kempton loan home 10 o'clock a most glorious night not a cloud still a silver sea the birth of man and it seemed almost like a celestial city
