

Monday July 27th 1857

Met Mrs. H. R. Thurman on 4th Street - mother & 5th sat
for a letter had a beautiful walk on 5th talked over all the
business and I must confess my real respect has not lessened but
but increased. I wish she could think as I do about some affairs but
while there is a channel of communication for that may be hope -
in the evening went to Uncle Chas. Stairs till 10 o'clock to meet
to Han's then met R. B. Tuesday 28th

Foggy kind of a comfortable morning. I feel a little sad that thought
of comfort is our present with me but I trust a gracious Providence will
guide and lead me in the various paths of life - in the evening went to
Hans & Bette there

Rainy this morning the only great pleasant sent to ride with Mrs.
Cook all well as usual in the evening called at Mrs. Hans & Bette
was not there

Foggy & cloudy this morning this evening went to B. L. Room
and stayed at Hans & Bette was not there home at
10 o'clock

Nothing new transpired anything went in in the
usual way in the evening called at Mrs. Cook she was not at
home afternoon went to Hans & Bette was not there

Saturday Aug 1st

Mild & clear clouds foggy a little went over to Padonadan
Haven went with me went to Bette in the evening Remingt
was there then went to Mr. Han's in the evening

Sunday 2^d

A splendid morning and 8th 11th not a cloud in the heavens
went to church this morning heard a sermon from Dr. Stetson
of Portland I did not think of a great affair I must confess
this evening went to Mrs. Macy's she was at home alone
till the services at Grace Church were over left at 10 o'clock took
a walk to Embell Street across the meadow home

Monday 3^d

Clear nothing new transpired in the evening went to Mrs.
Bette was there

Tuesday 4th

Nothing remarkable this day the usual routine of daily life
at Hans & the Parker Hans in the evening

Wednesday 5th

This day nothing has occurred beyond the usual routine
in the evening at old Han's

Thursday 6th

Everything went on as usual to day in the evening went
to Hans home at 11 o'clock

Sunday Aug 16th 1857

Nothing has taken place since 9 miles last month
of note in the routine of daily life there is not much
change to make remarks about the weather and all that
kind of thing will do on board of a ship but here it
does not amount to much. Mrs. Geo. Toffen was killed
a few days before last on board of the Oriz Boat
from freight caused by the steamer running into and
sinking a schooner and striking her at one
with 13 lives lost has not spoken with Mrs. H. R. since
to account on the official page she is in London now
went to day removed by Russell (late met Uncle Ephraim
Jolly when in return went to his work she was here
He was any story about an hour home at 9 o'clock

Monday Aug 17th

Cloudy & day Coopered bed Bright a fair shower
how long this last rainy this evening went to Hans &
Bette did not come

Tuesday 18th

Nothing unusual has taken place

Wednesday 19th

Storm the bed of the Kennebec and Coopered at the
time

Thursday 20th

Very long stormy even bed by night Coopered Mrs.
Cook out to ride

Friday 21st

Went to Mrs. White in the evening

Saturday 22nd

Went to Camp Mackinac or rather on business to Edgarton

Sunday 23rd

Staid in Edgarton till 1 1/2 o'clock took a boat and
went to Camp Grand staid about an hour and then
went to the school and came home in the afternoon
H. Reed had a party of 5 birds and a man
and some others went to Holman's place took a carriage
to Camp Grand and then to Edgarton and carriage
Mrs. Horner was with us

Monday 24th

Clear bright morning nothing new went to Mrs. Cook's
at 9 o'clock staid till 10 o'clock

Tuesday 25th

Nice day went to Mrs. Russell in the evening

Wednesday 26th

Fine day went to Mrs. Cook in the evening
