Wednesday Nov. 11, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with a strong breeze from the S.W. & clear weather ship by the wind to the S. Middle part strong breeze & heavy rain squalls took in the main top gallant sail & to the reef the top sails Wind from the S.W. latter part the same & ends this day No obs

Thursday Nov. 12, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Weather early and rainy ship under table reef topsails one sail in sight Middle & latter part moderate but hole top sails were employed in fitting rigging so ends this day
Satt by obs 22, 24 N
Long by chronometer 26, 22 W

Friday Nov. 13, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the S.W. & clear weather ship by the wind to the S.E. Middle part fine breeze and clear weather latter part moderate breeze from W.S.W. & pleasant weather course S.W. by S ship under full sail Weather layed in latter part fitting rigging sail in sight so ends this day
Satt by obs 21, 15 N
Long by chronometer 25, 08 W

Saturday Nov. 14, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze & pleasant weather Wind from the S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle part light air and calms (course S.W.) latter part the same all hands employed in fitting rigging & getting out water saw pink boat so ends this day
Satt by obs 20, 13 N
Long by chronometer 24, 54 W

Sunday Nov. 15, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with fine breeze from the S.W. & clear weather course S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle & latter part the same set the top mast shrouds so ends this day
Satt by obs 19, 20 N
Long by chronometer 24, 14 W

Monday Nov. 16, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with fine breeze & fine weather Wind from the S.E. course S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle part strong breeze & sent the main Royal & yard a left at 11, A.M. made the island of Saint. Maria a head Run down to it & have too far the right at 10 light Capt of Running Down the land at 10 P.M. Captain Went on shore for recruits got some got a small quantity came on board & Capt of aver. landed again ship captured & the amezia & ship married at this island so ends this day

Tuesday Nov. 17, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with light air from the S.E. course S.W. Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. latter part the same, gained with the Omega of Edgartown one more ship in sight so ends this day
Satt by obs 18, 22 N
Long by chronometer 23, 34 W

Wednesday Nov. 18, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the S.E. course S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle & latter part the same one sail in sight Weather employed in ship duty so ends this day
Satt by obs 12, 33 N
Long by chronometer 23, 40 W

Thursday Nov. 19, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the S.E. & speaking weather course S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle & latter part more moderate Wind from the S.E. & sail in sight & heading to the S. then to the S.W. & employed in aver. hauling and fitting rigging so ends this day
Satt by obs 10, 06 N
Long by chronometer 23, 47 W

Friday Nov. 20, 1854

Remarks on Board commenced with moderate breeze from the S.W. fine weather course S.W. by the wind to the S.E. Middle & latter part strong breeze Weather employed in fitting rigging so ends this day
Satt by obs 9, 12 N
Long by chronometer 23, 22 W
