Tuesday March 2nd 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the N.E. working to the Eastward Middle & latter part strong breeze from the N.E. ship on both tacks saw fin backs to ends this day Satt by abs 46 or 1
Sang by Chronometer 17242 ME

Wednesday March 3rd 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze & calm working towards the land & to the Eastward Middle part thick fog latter part wind from the S. & calm by 11. Much employed in washing ship saw fin backs to ends this day Satt by abs 48 34 S
Sang by Chronometer 17248 E

Thursday March 4th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze from the E.S. & directly rain and sail in light Middle part light air. Latter part light air & foggy which employed in getting out water & provision to ends this day Satt by abs 44 34 S
Sang by Chronometer 17251 E

Friday March 5th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with light air from the E.S. heading to the S. & the weather dark & foggy Middle & latter part calm weather & middle fog to ends this day No abs

Saturday March 6th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with calm weather & middle fog Middle & latter part middle the same during this 24 hours I gorge, St. Wornell had Stead by a portique antone looking he had put into the riggon and played for breaking the order & rules of the ship to ends this day No abs

Sunday March 7th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze from the S.W. & foggy calm S.E. Middle part fresh breeze & foggy took in the light sails & Table reefed the top sails latter part wind & weather the same to ends this day No abs

Monday 18th 58

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze & middle fog ship under Table reef top sails by the wind heading S.E. Middle & latter part fine breeze & fine weather made all sail saw plenty of poppys which employed in hauling a chain top sail to ends this day Satt by abs 43 or 1
Sang by Chronometer 17259 E

Tuesday March 9th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze & squally took in the light sails wind from the S.E. steering S.W. by E. Wind Middle part the same latter part made the land the island of New Zealand again after many days in the fog had a bay barings 1st or miles to the Westward of Cook's bay saw plenty of poppys & caught one sun fish to ends this day No abs

Wednesday March 10th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with moderate breeze & fine weather cruising along shore Middle & latter part the same which employed in repairing the chain top sail to ends this day No abs

Thursday March 11th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with light air & foggy wind from the S.E. land 1st 3 miles Middle & latter part light air rainy to ends this day Satt by abs 40 or 1
Sang by Chronometer 17246 E

Friday March 12th 1858

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze & fine weather Middle part the same latter part strong breeze from the S.W. ~~running~~ running down a long the land to the South this day sent the fore top sail down & repaired it & sent it a loft again to ends this day Satt by abs 38 or 1
Sang by Chronometer 17252 E
