airs from the SSW Middle part Wind & Weather
the same latter part Wind from ESE & light sun fog
saw one Whale saw fin backs & killed 3 sail in
sight land in sight Dist 20 miles so ends this
day

Sang by Chronometer 135160

Sunday June 5 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With moderate
Breeze from the ESE Working to the Northward &
Eastward along the land 3 sail in sight Middle part
light airs & Calmer sun fog latter part Calm Weather
& Clear land in sight saw fin backs 3 sail in sight
so ends this day
Satt by obs 42 30 N
Sang by Chronometer 135234 E

Monday June 6 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With light airs
from the E Calmer Middle part fog latter part Ship on both
sides Working to the South so ends this day

Tuesday June 7 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With fine breeze
& sun till fog Wind from ESE Middle & latter part
thick fog & rainy Wind from all parts of the compass
so ends this day No obs

Wednesday June 8 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With a moderate
breeze from the SSW Middle & latter part strong
Breeze from WSW saw 2 Whales handy in the
land leeward for them could not strike them
Came on board Capt the ship of her loss a gain
E N E so ends this day Satt by obs 42 49 N
Sang by obs 35 09 E

Thursday June 10 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With light breeze
from the E standing in for the straight of course
Middle part light breeze & hazy latter part strong
breeze took in the light sails & double reefed the
top sails hauled the main course & taking in the
Jib split it on bent it & sent it in the Wind
continued to in Great to a moderate Gale took
the fore top sail land on both sides so ends
this day No obs

Friday July 1 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With a fresh
Breeze from the ESE & a heavy sea the Weather
thick & rainy bent a new Jib set the fore
top sail & gain ship on leeward tack's Southmost
point of the SE side of the straight Dist 60
miles the Weather rather moderate & the
Barometer rising Middle part severe moderate
but thick Weather latter part Wind hauled to
the ESE this day as thought the straight
in to the school sea so ends this day

Satt by obs 48 42 N

Sang by Chronometer 14244 E

Saturday July 2 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With fine breeze
& fine Weather by the Wind to the SE Middle &
latter part fine breeze & fine Weather Working to
the East saw one fin back saw nothing more employ
ed in fitting a main top sail for a fine top sail
sun light fog squalls so ends this day

Satt by obs 45 13 N

Sang by Chronometer 14321 E

Sunday July 3 1859
Remarks on Board commenced With strong
Breeze from the E light fog fog squalls & hard
luck Middle part light breeze & hazy latter part light
airs & Calmer Cape de Niaga in sight having 26 E
Dist 20 miles saw nothing more so ends this day
Satt by obs 48 42 N
