

Ship Kensington in the ochotsh for night

Monday July 4 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with calm weather
lying off Cape de mira for a breeze to sea
if we can't make our first luck middle & latter part
much the same luck no better as yet employed in
hauling a hidden top sail saw pillars so ends
this day

Sat by obs 46 43 N
Sang by Chronometer 144 45 E

Tuesday July 5 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light air
& calms Cape de mira still in sight middle part
Wind from the SE at day light carried away
the fly jib boom sent it in & fitted a new one
& sent it out a gain like the other in place of in
hauling a hidden top sail the latter part
strong breeze & fog so ends this day no obs

Wednesday July 6 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with strong
breeze from the SE weather thick & rainy
took in the light sails & could not reef the
top sails took in the main sail & jib
middle & latter part thick fog Wind from the
SE so ends this day Sat by obs 47 48 N

Sang by Chronometer 146 38 E

Thursday July 7 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with strong breeze
from the SE & thick fog lying with the
main yard a back middle part the same latter part
fine breeze & fine weather Wind from the SE
saw several fin backs nothing more so ends this day

Sat by obs 47 48 N

Sang by Chronometer 147 25 E

Friday July 8 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze from
the SE & fine weather middle & latter part fine weather
saw fin back & hump backs heard 2 for them got none
so ends this day

Sat by obs 46 43 N

Sang by Chronometer 149 45 E

Saturday July 9 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light
air & calms with light fog & light air from
the E Campney's island in sight having seen
& dist 30 miles middle part fog latter part the
same 6 spells round island in sight saw
fin backs & hump backs nothing more but hard
luck so ends this day no obs

Sunday July 10 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light
air & foggy Wind from the SE middle part
Wind from the SE & thick fog latter part
the same steering to the Westward so ends this
day no obs

Monday July 11 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light breeze
from the SE & heavy fog saw fin backs
Ducks & Calp & Whales heard middle part thick
fog & all hands saw latter part thick the same
Clear by spells 10 or 15 minutes at a time saw
2 Whales soon lost sight of them in the
fog heard 2 boats but of no use so ends this day
no obs

Tuesday July 12 1859
Saw another foggy
two fin backs in this subject
which I have seen some
before

Remarks on Board commenced with a fine
breeze from the SE & much fog saw fin backs
middle & latter part light breeze & fine weather land
in sight saw 2 Whales going quick to the SE & heard
& chased them could not strike saw hump backs
so ends this day

Sang by Chronometer 149 11 E

Wednesday July 13 1859

Remarks on Board commenced with light air
& calms from the SE steering to the SE middle part
the same latter part strong breeze from the SE &
much fog so ends this day Sat by obs 46 43 N
