Saturday March 3rd 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a fresh breeze from S.E. weather hazy & cool. Steering first & by the wind middle & latter part wind light from N.W. steering 17 1/2.

Sunday March 4th 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a strong breeze from N.W. weather cool & hazy engaged in light work about the ship steering 17 1/2. Middle & latter part wind light steering full 1/2 and in sight bearing N.W. distant 25 miles.

Monday March 5th 1860

Remarks this day commenced with a moderate breeze from N.E. weather cool & hazy land in sight distant 15 miles bearing N.W. middle part strong breeze with rain latter part raised & lowered for them and the Harbord boat started out owing to the whale's sperm the boat we did not get full steering of the wind also saw whales again and the Harbord boat struck and the men parted to ends to day.

Tuesday March 6th 1860

Remarks this day commenced with light breeze from S.E. weather cool & hazy raised right whales and lowered for them but was unsuccessful middle & latter part wind very light from S.E. steering various courses.

Wednesday March 7th 1860

Remarks this day commenced with a moderate breeze from S.E. weather cool & hazy steering various courses from South to S.E. middle part wind light from the N.E. latter part calms & steering full 1/2.

Thursday March 8th 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with calms & weather cool & hazy engaged in light work about the ship mended the fore topsail on the yard & other light work about the ship middle part light breeze latter part thick fog steering N.W. by N.

Remarks on board commenced with calms & thick fog ship under short sail middle part light breeze from Westward latter part strong breeze from S.E. land in sight bearing N.W. distant 10 miles steering N.W. by N.

Saturday March 10th 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a moderate breeze from N.W. weather cool & hazy middle & latter part wind light from N.W. land in sight bearing N.W. distant 8 miles steering North & N.W. also saw a steamer in shore of us latter part steered S.E.
