Sunday March 11<sup>th</sup> 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with light breeze from N.E. weather cool & hazy. Steering S.E. & S. by S. middle part of day engaged in light work about the ship. Latter part strong breeze from S.W. & weather cloudy & heavy. Sea on raised. Right whales but owing to blizz rough we did not lower, under double reef to sprits.

Long by Chronometer 175° 33' E

Monday March 12<sup>th</sup> 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a strong breeze from S.W. & weather unpleasant & cool. Steering full & by middle part more moderate with heavy swell wind from N.W. weather cool & lower. Latter part saw Right Whales and lowered for him but did not get fast and lowered again for him and the Starboard Boat got fast & killed him got to

Lat by Observation 45° 20' N  
Long by Chronometer 175° 45' E

Tuesday March 13<sup>th</sup> 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a moderate breeze & calm weather cool & lower. Middle part the same saw Right Whales & lowered for them & the Starboard Boat got fast & killed him got him alongside about 6 A.M. Latter part strong breeze from S.W. & heavy sea on commenced to cut & finished

No Observations to day

Wednesday March 14<sup>th</sup> 1860

Remarks on board this day commenced with a strong breeze or a moderate gale from S.W. weather cool & hazy engaged in clearing away food & boiling. Middle part moderate gale from N.E. & M. cooled again. Latter part wind more moderate commenced to boil again weather

Remarks on board commenced with breeze from the S. & course S.W. middle part breeze from the N.W. strong breeze took in the light sails latter part strong double reef top sail under double reef this day

Sunday Apr 1<sup>st</sup> 1860

Remarks on board commenced with fresh breeze from the N.W. & this by rain. Middle part wind varied to S.W. & strong steering N.W. by N. latter part wind from the S.W. & fine weather so ends this day

Sat by obs 33° 50' N  
Long by Chronometer 175° 50' E

Monday Apr 2<sup>nd</sup> 1860

Remarks on board commenced with a fine breeze from S.E. at 11.30 A.M. saw the land bearing N.E. 9. 1/2 W. 30 miles run hardly in with a side sail sloping for potatoes if the permits middle of latter part light air lying off the land latter part went on shore 2 boats got a few potatoes so ends this day

Sat by obs 38° 30' N  
Long by Chronometer 178° 52' E

Tuesday Apr 3<sup>rd</sup> 1860

Remarks on board commenced with a light breeze from the N.W. lying off 4 or 5 leagues by middle part fine weather latter part what an shore again for more potatoes it steamed bay 2 men went on shore the boats the 2 time for one of them so ends this day
