Remarks on board commenced with moderate breeze from the S & fine weather middle & latter part fresh breeze from the S employed in stowing tobacco so ends this day

Saturday June 14th 1860
Remarks on board commenced with a fresh breeze from the S & fine weather middle & latter part fresh breeze & heavy squalls rain & sharp lightning latter part storming up the ocean dark so ends this day

Sunday June 15th 1860
Remarks on board commenced with a moderate gale & heavy squalls with rain from the S middle & latter part strong breezes & clear weather saw & spoke a merchant bark in real would work employed in setting up rigging so ends this day

Remarks on board commenced with a strong breeze from the S & fine weather middle part moderate gale continues with heavy squalls & rain. More ship to the S & latter part weather the same More ship to the S & ends this day

Remarks on board commenced with a moderate gale & heavy squalls & rain middle part the same latter part strong breeze & clear weather made all sail split the old mizen top sail sent it down & bent a new one so ends this day

Monday July 1st June 18th 1860
Remarks on board commenced with a fine breeze from the S & fine weather middle part wind from the S & clear weather fresh breeze wind hauled to the S & ends this day

Remarks on board commenced with a strong breeze from S & fine weather middle part light airs & rain latter part employed in setting up rigging wind varied from S to S & ends this day
