Remarks on board Commodore With fine breeze from the N & fine weather middle & latter part. Wind from the N & fine weather saw nothing more so ends this day

Friday July 23 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With fine breeze from the N & fine weather middle & latter part. Wind from the N & fine weather nothing in sight so ends this day

Saturday July 24 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With fine breeze from the N & fine weather middle part the same latter part light air & calms saw nothing so ends this day

Sunday July 25 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With a light breeze from the N & fine weather middle part the wind more to the N & fine weather & rain. Looked in the top gallant sails set the main again & by 10 o'clock latter part strong breeze & rain. Wind from the E back in the light sails. Gauledie reefed the top sails back in the main sail so ends this day

Monday July 27 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With fine breeze from the E same rain squalls ship under Gauledie reef top sails hading to the N middle part the same latter part headrated down to fine weather set back top sails main top gallant sail by 10 o'clock saw ship to the S & so ends this day

Tuesday July 28 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With moderate breeze from E & fine weather middle & latter part light air & calms from various parts of the line par a sail in sight saw black fish to leeward got one to the leeward boat so ends this day

Wednesday July 31 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With light breeze from the N & fine weather middle & latter part fine breeze & fine weather saw black fish again to leeward got none ship under full sail so ends

Thursday Aug 1 1861

Remarks on board Commodore With strong breeze from the N & fine weather all sail out steering to the N & middle & latter part light breeze from the N & fine weather to the N & fine weather in sight saw whales heard for them got none going north to the S came on board so ends this day
