Remarks on board Commodore's ship. At 10 AM I saw a ship heading to the NW. I took in all sail but close reefed main top sail.

4 Storme sailer Mitchell & Luffenstort April 9 Weather
the same latter part more moderate 1st Double reef
top sailer & lamented lay lying at this time lamented
blowing an quite fresh a fair look in the gill & in the top
sail so under this day Part by observation
Suez by the moon 22

Tuesday Aug^r 13 1861

Remarkably we heard cannon fire with a fresh breeze from the NW heading to the S. Mindelle & rather fast fresh breeze & clear weather ship under short sail saw a sail showing to the E. Sailed the end of the day.

Remarks on board tomorrow with a fresh breeze from the N.W. heading to the Westward under short sail middle part light breeze & much sea lower N.W. latter part fine breeze & fine weather made off sail to Ende this day
