This day begins with fine weather wind
S.S.W. Steering N by W at night took in sail
and lifted to the wind heading West until
the same latter Steering N by E. Lat 11.55
Long 5.12

Monday April 26th first part fine
from S.S.W. Steering from N by E to N.E. at
night took in sail and lifted by the wind
latter all sail set Steering N.E. Lat 11.55
Long 4.50 East

Tuesday April 27th all these 24 hours
breezes from S.S.W. heading E.S.E. and down
the fore sail and reefed it Lat 11.32
Long 2.26 East

Wednesday April 28th all these 24 hours
Steering breezes from S.S.W. Steering on diff
tacks by the wind so ends Lat 11.49 South
Long 4.10 East

Thursday April 29th all these 24 hours
Steering breezes from South Steering on different
tacks by the wind under easy sail Lat 12.02
Long 4.00 East

Friday April 30th all this day fine breeze
from South Steering to the E.S.E. by the wind
Lat 11.53 Long 7.28 E

Saturday May 1st all these 24 hours
fine breezes from South Steering on different
tacks by the wind so ends Lat 11.03
Long 5.39 E

Remarks On Board Bark Hecla Wednesday June 16th 1838
all these 24 hours light breezes from S.S.W. to S.E. &
heading to the Eastward by the wind saw
one sail Lat 8.17 South Long 12.23 East

Thursday June 17th first part light breeze from
South and smothery Steering to the E.S.E. made
on different tacks by the wind lying aback
latter light air the land in sight and one
sail so ends this day Lat 8.12 South Long 13.00 E

Friday June 18th fine pleasant weather & light
breezes from S.S.W. Steering down the coast at 5 P.M.
Spoke the Bark Anna & Mary of Salem made
on diff tacks by the wind latter running down
the Coast land 10 miles dis Lat 6.54 South
Long 12.26 East

Saturday June 19th first part light breeze
from South Steering down the coast with all
sail made aback short sail by the wind
heading W.P.W. latter running down along the
land to the North saw two man of war &
four whalers at anchor Spoke the Bark
Corizon of Greenport Capt Case no obs

Sunday June 20th this day fine weather saw
the Bark Helen Augusta Capt worth at 4 P.M.
came to anchor in 10 fathoms of water 13
miles from land so ends at anchor

Monday June 21st all these 24 hours
fine pleasant weather at anchor so ends

Tuesday June 22nd all this day fine
pleasant weather at anchor so ends this
day
