 This day begins with strong breezes from
 N.E. heading E. middle & latter
 wind N.W. turning on different
 tacks Lat 23.25 Long 86.05 West

Friday Dec 9th all these 24 hours
 thick & rainy weather wind N.W.
 heading N.E. under short sail
 No obs

Saturday Dec 10th this day thick &
 rainy wind N.W. heading N.E.
 under short sail No obs

Sunday Dec 11th this day begins with
 thick weather & strong winds from
 N.W. heading N.E. middle
 moderating latter part wind N.W.
 made sail & cleared S.P. W.
 Lat 23.18 Long 85.03 West

Monday Dec 12th strong winds
 from N.W. turning on different
 tacks under easy sail Lat 23.10 S
 Long 85.12 W

Tuesday Dec 13th this day light
 breezes from South turning N.W.
 blowing down oil one sail in
 sight

Wednesday Dec 14th this day begins
 with light airs from S.E. turning
 N.W. employed in stowing down at
 4 P.M. finished at 6 P.M. Capt Triff
 came aboard to end gaming with
 the Globe Lat 23.16 Long 85.16 W

Remarks On Board Thursday Dec 15th 1839
 All these 24 hours calm the Globe in
 sight sent down the fore sail &
 repaired it Lat 23.32 S Long 86.38 W

Friday Dec 16th fine pleasant
 weather wind S. heading S.W. in
 co. with the Globe I got 8 bbls of meat
 from the Globe Lat 23.18 South
 Long 87.08 West

Saturday Dec 17th all these 24 hours
 calm the Globe in sight
 Lat " Long " W

Sunday Dec 18th this day begins
 with squally weather wind N.E.
 heading E. middle & latter on
 diff. tacks two sail in sight

Monday Dec 19th first part
 rainy wind N.E. heading E. S.E.
 middle & latter on diff. tacks
 saw one sail

Tuesday Dec 20th all these 24
 hours thick and rainy heading
 N.E. so ends Lat 23.49 South
 Long 85.52 West

Wednesday Dec 21st thick weather
 wind N.E. heading on different
 tacks at 6 P.M. made the Bark
 Skillicut of New Bedford Capt
 Faber 7 months out 6.5 bbls
 Lat 23.18 S Long 86.27 W
