Sunday April 15th all these 24
hours fine breezes from S.E. at
4 P.M. the Capt went on shore
the Bark Wm Cummings of
Dartmouth went in to anchor

Monday April 16th fine breezes
from S.E. at 7 A.M. spoke the Globe
and got the man so ends -
lying off and on

Tuesday April 17th this day begins
with fine breezes from S.E. at
4 P.M. the Capt came onboard &
kept the ship off N.W. middle
& later steering N.W. under
all sail
