All these 24 hours fine breezes
from N.W. heading N. N. E. under
short sail at 10 A.M. finished
hoisting one sail in sight Lat 41.30
Long 36.10 W

Thursday Aug 16th this day fine
breezes from S. S. E. steering on
different tacks by the wind employed
in stowing down oil Lat 41.20 N
Long 36.00 W

Friday Aug 17th fine pleasant
weather wind S. S. E. heading to the
Eastward spoke the Bark Atlantic
of New Bedford - Cap. Thersman
3 months out 100 Tons so ends stowing
down oil

Saturday Aug 18th fine breezes from
South heading E. stowing down
spoke the Bark Sealhorn of New
Bedford Cap. Mosers 2 months out
100 Tons latter wind S. W. heading
S. S. E. saw a large Sp. whale at
11 A.M. lured the boats

Sunday Aug 19th first part fine
breezes from S. W. boats down after the
whale at 1 P.M. the boats came
onboard saw nothing more of the
whale middle of latter on diff.
tacks three sail in sight
Lat 41.34 North
Long 34.18 West

Remarks On Board Monday Aug 20th 1860
Strong winds from N. S. W. heading on
different tacks under short sail
spoke the schooner Thrive of
Boston Cap. Small Lat 41.23 North
Long 34.11 West

Tuesday Aug 21st Strong breezes
from S. W. ship heading on different
tacks by the wind under short sail
so ends this day Lat 41.20 North
Long 34.29 West

Wednesday Aug 22nd Strong breezes
from N. N. E. and good weather
steering on different tacks by the
wind two sail in sight Lat 41.24 N
Long 34.47 W

Thursday Aug 23rd fine breezes from
S. E. ship heading E. N. E. under all
sail so ends Lat 41.48 North
Long 33.46 West

Friday Aug 24th fine breezes from
S. S. E. heading to the Eastward
by the wind several sail in
sight so ends Lat 41.08 N
Long 32.07 W

Saturday Aug 25th fine breezes from
W. ship on different tacks saw
a number of sails Lat 40.28 N
Long 32.27 W

Sunday Aug 26th fine breeze from E
steering N. N. W. under all sail
Lat 40.24 N Long 34.18 W
