so ends under all sail Lat 38.02 N
Long 34.46 W

Wednesday Aug 29th light breezes
from W. N. W. heading S. W. one
sail in sight Lat " "

Thursday Aug 30th fine breezes
from W. N. W. heading S. W. by the
wind spoke the Ship Steady Wilder
of New Bedford 20 days out
Lat 35.58 N Long 35.49

Friday Aug 31st fine breeze from
N. N. W. heading W. Spoke the
Schooner Thrivee Lat 36.17 N
Long 36.29 W

Saturday Sept 1st fine breeze
from E. S. E. Gaining with the
Steady Wilder Thrivee & Bark
Messenger of Salem latter part steering
S. S. W. the three whales in sight
at 11 A.M. saw three large
Sperm whales at 12 lured the boats
Lat 36.53 North
Long 37.09 West

Remarks On Board Sunday Sept 2nd 1864
fine weather wind E. S. E. boats down
after whales at 2 P.M. the S. Boat
struck at 4 took the whale aboard
& commenced cutting at dark
lashed down at daylight began
cutting latter fine Employed in
cutting a number of sails in sight



Monday Sept 3rd first part
fine breezes from E. S. E. employed
in cutting at 11 P.M. finished
middle strong breeze latter strong
winds from S. E. at 8 A.M. commenced
boiling so ends Lat 37.30 North
Long 37.40 West

Tuesday Sept 4th first & middle
part strong winds from S. E. heading
S. W. under short sail boiling latter
fresh gales cooled down the works
Lat 37.21 N Long 37.48 W

Wednesday Sept 5th strong gales from
S. E. close reefed the main topsail
middle part blowing on took in the
No. 1 sail. at 10 P.M. blowing a
Hurricane hit S. Boat lost 5 casks
from off deck 13 bbls of oil gangway
board & rail &c at 2 A.M. calm
at 3 the ^{hurricane} came out N. N. E. blowing
a hurricane barometer down to 28 Deg
latter more moderate Lat 37.00 N
Long 37.55 W
