

Remarks On Board Thursday Sept 6th 1860

This day begins with heavy gales from
S. N. E. Ship lying to under the foot
of the main spencer heading
E. middle moderating at 1 P.M.
Got double reefed topsails and
started the works so ends bailing
a heavy swell in Lat 36° 31' North
Long 33° 30' West

Friday Sept 7th Strong winds
from N. N. E. employed in bailing
at 4 P.M. finished bailing middle
A latter wind E. N. E. heading S. E.
Sent down the main topsail
and repaired it Lat 36° 32' N
Long 33° 30' West

Saturday Sept 8th Strong breezes from
E. N. E. heading S. E. under short
sail so ends Lat 33° 32' North
Long 34° 12' West

Sunday Sept 9th light air from
S. E. heading E. N. E. employed in
stowing down oil one sail
in sight Lat 36° 46' N
Long 37° 15' W

Monday Sept 10th light breezes
from S. E. heading E. N. E. put
the other boat out Lat "

Tuesday Sept 11th fine breezes
from S. heading E. S. E. by the
wind employed in taring &
rotting down rigging Lat 37° 18'
Long 36° 45'

Remarks On Board Wednesday Sept 12th 1860

Fine weather & fine breezes from
S. P. W. heading S. E. employed in
taring & rotting down Lat 36° 42' North
Long 36° 08' West

Thursday Sept 13th first part
fine breezes from S. W. heading
E. S. E. by the wind middle of
latter light breezes from N. N. W.
heading W. employed in taring
and rotting down Lat 36° 12' N
Long 36° 55' West

Friday Sept 14th This day begins
with fine weather & light breezes from
N. N. W. heading W. under all sail at
night double reefed the topsails middle
wind N. N. E. heading N. W. latter
wind E. heading N. N. E. by the wind
employed in taring & rotting down
rigging so ends Lat 37° 17' North
Long 37° 00' West

Saturday Sept 15th all these 24
hours fine breezes from S. E. heading
N. E. employed in fitting rigging
four sail in sight Lat 37° 17' N
Long 37° 34' W

Sunday Sept 16th fine pleasant
weather & light air from S. E.
Shining & by W. a number of sails
in sight Lat 37° 30' North
Long 37° 45' West
