Thursday July 1

First part
Calm the carbide boat struck
a whale he run under the ice and
he had to cut come aboard and had
to tow the ship to get clear of the ice
Emp in boiling

Spoke the Barque Canton Packet
and the ship Porachute 2 a whale
and the ship Europa 3 whales all of
New Bedford

Lat 62.45
Long 178.24
Put off the boats for whales without
success the fog come in thick we
could not find our ship and we went
aboard of the Porachute and soon
found our ship come aboard and com-
menced stowing down oil finished
boiling

Light airs and calms Emp in stowing
down Spoke the Barque Alice Tharier
and several others too numerous to mention

At 7 p. finished stowing stowed down
92 bbl thick fog
