Blowing very hard

Latter part
The ship under double reef main
topsail close reef fore & mizen and
foresail

Wednesday Sep 29

First part
The gale continues from the same
quarter the ship heading N^WE by E
1/2 East

Middle part
More moderate at 12 o'clock kept the
ship off for the whales

The ship running through the whales
