

Nov Ship Kulusoff

Took out anchor and shifted by the wind S.E. by S fairwell to the Sandwich islands for 23 months

Strong breezes the ship steering V.E. by V. Latter part of the ship on the wind under double reef topsails jib and mainsail Capt sick Mrs Pierce and child seasick Third mate sick the Pigs and goats seasick

Monday Nov 29

Commences with strong breezes from the S.E. the ship by the wind to the S.E. by E. At 3 o'clock moderate S.E. nearly calm

Changable winds. Latter part Watch emp in ships duty Calm Cooks bearing East

Tuesday Nov 30

Light airs from the Westward. The ship under no steering way

Much the same until 3 o'clock when the masts set in very strong breeze in sail down to close reef topsails and foresail parted the top of the mainmast and split it to the double reef

Went down the old mainmast and bent the new one continues to blow strong

Wednesday Dec 1 1852

Strong breezes from the S.E. by E the ship by the wind to the S.E. under double reef mainmast close reef fore & mizen Bent a new mainsail and set the jib

Strong breezes. Latter part The same Emp in breaking out for flour

Thursday Dec 2

Strong breezes from the S.E. by E the ship by the wind on the foreward tack with single reef topsails and mainmast

Much the same. Latter part A forelock the heaving of mainmast and sail

Friday Dec 3

Strong breezes from the S.E. by E the ship by the wind under double reef topsails jib and mainsail to the S.E. Watch Emp in mending the mainmast sail finished it and bent it

Much the same. Latter part Nothing new rough weather
