

Monday December 1st 1856

This day a heavy swell from the South put
huges from N.E. starting by 11 AM at 6 PM over
the 2nd. Lat 33.12
Long 49.04
took in boat put to repair

Tuesday Dec 2nd

This day a gale from N.W. &
being the Eastward with heavy swell
from N.E. & Eastward. The men rigging
sails clear up on 2 PM. 8 AM. The
hatches & secure affairs had to be checked
No other. Lat 33.40
Long 48.25
Wednesday Dec 3rd

This day begins with a heavy gale
from N. first put round to be later. The
heavy sea running clear. The gale
clear up on 5 PM. Lat 34.05
Long 48.00

Thursday Dec 4th

This day pleasant some swell on
wind from West. At 11 AM the N.W. swell
grew for 1/2, & was laid it right about the 11 AM
put out to repair, but the old hand on
sprung Boat. Lat 33.00
Long 48.06

Friday Dec 5th

This day on opposite tide & saw no
sail light fair weather sprained on 7 PM
put out the Boat. Lat 32.35
Long 47.32

Saturday Dec 6th

This day pleasant
at noon light breeze from N.W. & stood the
few small sail at sunset was spoken by
Brig. Danvers. Nothing seen beyond as only
what stood on light breeze. Lat 32.08
Long 48.00
