

Remarks on Board the Bark Sachin

Monday June 15th 1857

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. and squally weather ships course S.E. under double reef topsails and fore sail saw several shoals of Porpoises and some birds middle and latter part moderate and pleasant set all sail employed at breaking out for cutting penants and blocks ships course S.E. by E

Long by Cr 63.02 W

Tuesday June 16th

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. and pleasant weather ships course S.E. by E all sail not employed at getting fitting penants and blocks aloft fitting boats middle and latter part weather the same match employed at fitting the rigging the ends

Long by Cr 61.35 W

Wednesday 17th

Commences with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant ships course S.E. by E work employed at fitting the rigging middle part the same latter light breezes from the S.W. and East and deciding weather employed at running down the maintop gallant mast and fitting it

Lat by H 36.53 N
Long by H 60.34 W

Thursday 18th

Commences with moderate winds from the S.W. and rainy ships course by the wind heading S by E sent up the main top gallant mast middle part strong breezes from the S.W. ships under double reef topsails heading S.E. by E latter part moderate main all sail thus ends

Lat by Ob 31.34 N
Long by Cr 58.48 W

Cut Around

Friday 19th 1857

Commences with fine wind from the Eastward and pleasant ships course by the wind heading S.E. and shortly employed fitting rigging and getting ready for taking oil middle and latter part weather the same ship heading S by E saw three sails thus ends

Lat by Ob 33.44 N
Long by Cr 57.46 W

Saturday 20th

Commences with fine breezes from the Eastward and pleasant ship heading S.E. employed at fitting the rigging saw several sails one shoal of blackfish and two boats had no success middle part the same latter part strong breezes ship heading S.E. thus ends

Lat by Ob 31.50 N
Long by Cr 55.56 W

Sunday 21st

Commences with strong breezes from the Eastward and pleasant ships course by the wind heading S.E. saw one pinback one ship heading S.W. at sundown shortened sail middle part the same latter part pleasant under all sail heading S.E. by E

Lat by Ob 30.04 N
Long by Cr 54.34 W

Monday 22nd

Commences with strong winds from the East and pleasant ship heading S.E. at sundown shortened sail and tack ship heading S.E. middle and latter part moderate breezes thus ends

Lat by Ob 29.55 N
Long by Cr 54.10 W
