

Remarks on Board the Bark *Leahua*

Tuesday June 23rd 1857

Commences with light breezes from the East and pleasant ship heading S by E one sail right to the windward middle part took to the Southward two hours latter part heading S by E thus ends

Lat by Ob 30.59 S

Long by Cr 53.24 W

Wednesday 24th

Commences with light winds from the S by E and pleasant ship heading S by E saw nothing this day middle and latter part light breezes from the Southward ship heading S by E employed at setting up the rigging

Lat by Ob 31.35

Long by Cr 52.42 W

Thursday 25th

Commences with light breezes from the S by E and pleasant ship course S by E middle and latter part the same thus ends

Lat by Ob 31.12 S

Long by Cr 50.50 W

Friday 26th

Commences with light winds from the S by E and pleasant ship heading S by E middle and latter part the same thus ends

Lat by Ob 30.02

Long by Cr 49.10 W

Saturday 27th

Commences with light winds from the South and pleasant ship heading S by E three whalers in sight one ship bark and a hermofidite brig middle part heading S by E latter part strong breezes ship W by S saw one sail

Lat by Ob 29.41 S

Long by Cr 48.50 W

Cruising in the North Atlantic Ocean

Sunday June 28th 1857

Commences with strong winds from the S by E and rugged ship heading S by E at sundown shortened sail middle part the same latter part strong breezes ship heading W by S under double reefed topsails and courses ran one sail to the windward thus ends

Lat by Ob 29.17 S

Long by Cr 48.07 W

Monday 29th

Commences with strong breezes from the S by E and rugged ship heading W by S middle and latter part squally and rainy ship heading S by E thus ends

Lat by Ob 29.01 S

Long by Cr 48.13 W

Tuesday 30th

Commences with strong breezes from the S by E and rugged ship heading W by S middle and latter part squally thus ends

Lat by Ob 29.20 S

Long by Cr 48.50 W

Wednesday July 1st

Commences with strong breezes and squally ship heading S by E one sail in sight at 6 P.M. wore ship to the Westward middle and latter part strong breezes from the S by E with squalls of rain saw a school of blackfish. lost the boats had no success thus ends

Lat by Ob 29.20 S

Long by Cr 48.48 W

Thursday 2nd

Commences with light breezes from the S by E and ran rain middle part the same latter part calm thus ends

Lat by Ob 28.48 S

Long by Cr 48.33 W
