

Remarks on Board the bark Lactitia

Friday July 24th 1857

Commences with moderate breezes from ESE and squally employed at boiling middle and latter part light winds and calms employed at boiling thus ends

Lat 28° 58' N

Saturday July 25th

Commences with light airs and calms employed boiling finishes at 7 P.M. set the watch boats cross middle and latter part light wind from the Eastward

Lat 28° 54' N

Long 49° 44' W

Sunday July 26th

Commences with light winds from the East and pleasant middle and latter part weather the same

Lat 29° 12' N

Long 49° 20' W

Monday July 27th

Commences with light winds and pleasant middle and latter part strong breezes from Eastward

Lat 29° 44' N

Long 49° 27' W

Tuesday July 28th

Coms in with moderate breezes from the Eastward and pleasant middle and latter weather the same saw a bark steering WSW

Lat 30° 01' N

Long 48° 52' W

Wednesday 29th

Coms in with light winds from the Eastward middle and latter part the same

Lat 28° 41' N

Long 48° 06' W

Cruising in the North Atlantic Ocean

Thursday July 30th 1857

Coms in with strong breezes from the Eastward and smoky weather middle and latter part the same thus ends

Lat 27° 34' N

Long 47° 52' W

Friday July 31st

Commences with strong breezes and smoky weather middle and latter part light winds

Lat 28° 51' N

Long 48° 58' W

Saturday August 1st

Coms in with fine breezes from the Eastward and smoky weather middle and latter part pleasant

Lat 29° 02' N

Long 48° 21' W

Sunday August 2nd

Commences with fine breeze from the ESE and pleasant middle and latter part the same

Lat 29° 09' N

Long 48° 35' W

Monday August 3rd

Commences with light winds and pleasant sun-grampaces middle and latter part weather the same at 7 A.M. speak the

sch. G. H. Townsend of Brock Haven fifteen days from New York bound to Pointe à la Poudre

at 8 A.M. was a sperm whale to the windward at 11 A.M. heard two boats in pursuit
