

Remarks on Board the Bark

Friday December 11th 1854

Came in with fresh gale from the S.W. middle part the same latter part strong breeze from the Westward

Lat 42.06 N

Saturday 12th

Commenced with strong wind from the S.W. a bad sea from the S.W. ship's course S.W. by N. middle part fresh breezes latter part gale from the Westward

Lat 43.06 N
Long 53.00 W

Sunday 13th

Commenced with fresh gale from the S.W. ship heading S.W. under storm sails middle part more moderate latter part strong breezes from the S.W. and rugged ship's course S.W. by N.

Monday 14th

Commenced with moderate wind from the Westward ship heading S.W. by N. saw finbacks and many birds saw hump middle part the same latter part light wind from the S.W. ship heading S.W. by E

Tuesday 15th

Came in with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant ship heading S.W. by E saw finbacks middle part calm latter part light breezes from the S.W. and pleasant one back in sight

Lactitia Culward Board

Wednesday December 16th 1854

Commenced with strong breezes from the S.W. ship's course S.W. by N. at 8 P.M. lost two boats for humpbacks struck one and cut from him middle part gale from the Westward latter part more moderate

Lat 45.25 N
Long 59.10 W

Thursday 17th

Commenced with light winds from the S.W. and smoky ship heading S.W. by N. two whalers in sight steering S.W. saw finbacks middle part strong breezes latter part light

Lat 49.14 N
Long 59.56 W

Friday 18th

Commenced with light winds from the Westward and cloudy smoky weather ship heading S.W. by N. two sails in sight at 7 P.M. wind shifted in a squall to the S.W. soon rain took in sail middle and latter part moderate ship heading S.W. one sail lost in sight to the S.E. thus ended

Long 60.34 W

Saturday 19th

Commenced with strong breezes from the Northward ship's course S.W. by N. on sail in sight to the S.W. middle part squally latter strong breezes ship's course S.W. rounded and got ground in seventy five fathoms fine sand with black spots saw a grate many finbacks
